



Dear Friends of St. John's-

#### We ARE the Church. WE are the Church. We are THE CHURCH!

From a sermon I preached during June, you might remember me saying:

During the days of 'Stay at Home', 'Stay Sheltered', and 'Stay Safe', I have been grieving the loss of our ability to meet together at church, for times of worship and experiences of fellowship. I have NOT been grieving that the Church has been shut down... because it hasn't been! The church building- this beautiful facility – might be temporarily quiet and mostly empty, but the Church Body (you and me and every partner in the Gospel) can be alive and well and full of finding ways to carry out our primary purpose of sharing God's love through showing our compassion.

The world has been changed over the last few months, with:

- a global pandemic making our bodies sick,
- a heightened awareness of social injustice making our consciences ashamed,
- isolation rules making our relationships fragile,
- riots/job loss/a bear market making our wallets thin, and
- political and civil divisiveness making our stomachs queasy.

Add to that all of the 'regular' ways that sin and the evil one work their way into our lives and work their woes into our hearts, and we can see how the world's changes have made quite an impact.

The Church HAS NOT changed over the last few months (nor over the last 20 centuries). For the Church is:

- the Body of believers on earth,
- created in God's image,
- saved by Christ's life, death and resurrection,
- empowered by the Spirit of God within us,
- washed clean in a baptismal bath, and
- walking along the Way of the Lord.

We are not perfect, but we ARE called and claimed by God, to be God's hands and feet and voices. And THAT can have an impact on the world, because WE ARE THE CHURCH! And God has promised to be faithful to us, as we try to be faithful to Him.

Jesus promised to return to earth, in His full glory, and finish His work of completely redeeming all humanity and all creation. Until then, it is our privilege to do what we can to prepare this place for His arrival. And as we do that, please –

Be safe. Be kind. Be filled with God's peace. Be overflowing with God's love! Pastor Steve

### Council Letter

At the church council meeting on June 11th, council members discussed the re-opening of the church for in-person worship. The decision has been made to continue with worship online through June. Worship online has been working well, and we hope that everyone has had the opportunity to view it.

Under the Executive Orders of Governor Tim Walz, the church must establish, implement, and post a Covid19 Preparedness Plan in order to re-open. We cannot have in-person worship without an infection prevention plan or without precautions and guidelines in place. The church council and the Worship committee have reviewed much guidance from the CDC (Centers for Disease Control), MDH (Minnesota Department of Health), and the ELCA Synod itself. We are also discussing what precautions and guidelines other local churches are putting into place.

Some of the <u>many</u> precautions that have been suggested by the above organizations for our consideration are...

- Churches must communicate with members, that anyone experiencing symptoms of illness stay home. No exceptions.
- If a family member or person living in your home is feeling unwell, all family members and occupants of the house should stay home.
- No singing in unison and no speaking in unison during the service (Singing and speaking in unison further propels the moisture in breath--which is how Covid19 is spread. It has been identified as one of the riskiest behaviors for transmission. A cloth mask is unlikely to protect you or your neighbor during congregational singing.) (Creative music worship will be implemented.) (Small groups or single performers may still provide music if safely distanced from the congregation and from others in the group.)
- Signs will be posted reminding members to maintain 6-foot distance between one another.
- One family per pew with occupied pews at least 6 feet apart.
- Maximum church capacity should be kept @ 50% (or 200 people). (If more than 200 people wanted to attend, we would never discourage it--we would have to consider having 2 services.)
- Only one entrance to the building will be used, and one separate exit.
- All people in the building (over the age of 2) will wear masks to protect others.
- A specific and thorough cleaning plan will be in place.
- No coffee hour after church in the chapel lounge.
- At risk church members should be reminded to stay home (and the congregation should reach out to them in other, safe ways.)

- Having a service registration list (guestbook) for contact tracing purposes.
- Hand sanitizer, tissues, & garbage's will be easily available.
- Whether or not Sunday School can happen safely will be discussed.
- If we are to have communion, a safe way to proceed will need to be implemented.
- Hymnals may have to be removed temporarily.
- Pew cushions may have to be removed temporarily.
- If there is evidence of Covid19 spreading in our faith community, stopping in-person worship is advised.

Our safety guidelines and rules will be shared with the Loaves and Fishes Food Shelf.

We will be working on this list and other needed items in June for potential in-person worship in July. Please contact church council members if you have suggestions or want to be involved in getting ready for in-person worship.

Thank you for your understanding of our cautious approach. We are looking forward to your feedback.

We are planning for a social gathering (6 ft. apart) in early July.

#### **WORSHIP GATHERING UPDATE**

On May 23rd, Gov. Walz eased some of the restrictions that have kept us from gathering in person for regular weekly worship. That is good news, but the freedom to gather does not take away the risk in doing so. The leadership and staff at St. John's will be meeting, thinking and planning for the next, safe steps to take, and any decisions will take some time to implement, along with making any necessary changes to the building.

The Endowment committee would like everyone to know that we are now accepting applications for scholarships. There are two main requirements:
