One day, though, Sam befriended Ben the bear. Ben was big and strong. The two became good friends.


When Ben found out about Sam's nighttime fears, Ben offered to sleep outside Sam's tree.

YOU can be an evangelist!

Dear Friend of St. John's-

Evangelism is defined as: the spreading of the Christian gospel by public preaching or personal witness. And YOU have the opportunity to do that this month. Let me explain...

Every few years, a congregation chooses to produce a new picture directory, and St John's will be taking photographs to create a new directory on September 21-23. Many members will want to participate by calling to set up a time, but unfortunately, many will not – and the latter group is who this message is for.

I have heard many reasons (or excuses) for someone choosing not to make an appointment for a portrait sitting – too busy, don't like to have your picture taken, it seems like we just did that, don't want high pressure to buy expensive photos, don't want to.... There are probably other reasons, too, but did I hit one of yours?

Instead of worrying about the reasons NOT to have your picture taken, let me provide you a very good reason TO do it. **It is a very easy way to be an evangelist!** It won't require you to do any public preaching (I will continue to take care of that), but it will allow you to be a public witness for the Gospel. Your picture in the new directory will make it more complete, and the more complete the directory is, the better a tool for ministry it will become.

A Church directory serves members (and pastors) well for many purposes (recalling names, finding addresses, looking for ministry partners, and much more. More importantly, a Church directory serves as a tool for inviting new members to join the congregation and as a resource for helping new members feel more welcome. And most importantly, a full directory helps us to live out and live in the blessing declared by the Psalmist:

How very good and pleasant it is when kindred live together in unity! (Ps.133:1)

Details for how you can set up an appointment for your portrait can be found elsewhere in The Story, on the church website or FaceBook page, on posters at church, or by calling the church office. And if you absolutely cannot have your picture taken, please consider submitting one you already have. Just so you know, the directory will not be complete without you and this is your chance to be an evangelist!





Secretary's Report: Motion to approve June minutes by Rita Caron, 2nd by Josh Isebrand - Motion Approved

Use of building: Next Sunday, there has been a building use request for a meeting for host families of foreign exchange students.

Committee reports & Council representation:

Parish Ed/Youth Committee: Vacation bible school has had approximately 25-30 students each time. Themes is water (Noah's Ark, Jonah and the Big Fish, Jesus walking on water). Parish Ed is looking for more teachers for the upcoming year, 2023-2024, those interested can connect with Parish Ed members. Rally Sunday will be September 10th for Sunday School. Youth group went to the Boundary Waters, July 20-23rd. Kids had a great time with great weather. Next year is the big youth gathering down in New Orleans. Plan to have a few fundraisers throughout the year for the trip. Kids are already excited about it.

Mutual Ministry Committee: No meeting

Endowment Committee: Scholarship applications are being processed. are Council needs to approve their Endowment Fund committee's request distribution. Motion to approve distribution of \$13,500 from endowment fund, Rita Caron, Gary Denn second. Motion carried.

Worship Committee: August 20th we will have a recognition of quilters for being Sertoma Service to Mankind recipients for 2023. Steve Breiter will be asked to speak on August 27 as Pastor Steve will be gone. They talked about needing 2 more people to join the technology team and perhaps including compensation for their work.

Church Life Committee: New directory in September. Last time we updated was about 4 years ago.

Stewardship Committee: No meeting.

Trustees Committee: Caryl was asking about wanting new water keys, mentioned to use vice grips to turn the water on the outside for the flowers outside the church, trustees will follow up with Caryl. Another TV needs to be removed from the Chair Room. Big heavy tables downstairs to be removed. Requested by Caryl - council will evaluate the amount of tables and remove extra as needed, potentially to be sold to member of the church. The extra piano (from the back of the basement) was given a new home. Several carpet squares need to be replaced due to stains. \$250 would be the cost to replace the squares from a professional. Aaron will work to get those done. Gary will reach out again regarding the leak in the Narthex.

Deacons: Everything has been running smoothly. Things will be a little tight this coming Sunday with communion and additional Council duties. Supplies are still good for the year.

WELCA Committee: On September 23rd they are bringing in The Apron Lady for a luncheon and a program. The cost will be \$15 a person for the lunch. Apron Lady is a comedian and painter. Sign up sheet will be available for the salad luncheon.

Pastor's report: Starting to gear up for confirmation. Picture director will be coming out. Songs on the Lawn will be going on next Thursday the 10th. Our church singers will be singing first.

Treasurers Report: Updates on financials, where the expenses are in comparison to donations/offerings. Piano moving was over the estimating price to \$602, but there was a donation to the memorial fund to offset the moving expense. Motioned to approve the June and July financials. Motion by Cathy Plum and Royce Woitas seconded. Motion carried.

Narthex - Gary and Aaron are working to get in touch with contact for potential repairs.

What a mess, Julia thought as she walked into the kitchen and saw all the dishes. Then she remembered the special computerized glasses her dad had given her and told her to wear.

"They'll help you see life differently," he'd told her.

She pulled them out of her pocket and put them on. The words "opportunity to serve" flashed across the screen. Were these dishes really an opportunity for her to serve her family?

Julia blinked back the tears. Her friend's words stung. Julia felt anger at the injustice rising in her heart. She pulled out her glasses. "Opportunity to love" flashed across the screen. Could her friend's insensitivity and lies actually be an opportunity for her to grow in love?

For the third time that day, Julia rolled the bandage around her ankle. This sprained ankle had totally ruined all of her plans. She had a tennis practice and a game Saturday—or at least she did before this. The game meant so much to her, but now she wouldn't be able to go.

Julia moped around the house for a day before she remembered her glasses. When she put them on and looked at her ankle, the words "opportunity to trust" flashed across the screen. Could even this ankle be an opportunity

Little by little, Julia's glasses changed how she saw the world and how she lived. She discovered that the very things she often complained about were really opportunities in disguise.

"For this light momentary affliction is preparing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison, as we look not to the things that are seen but to the things that are unseen. For the things that are seen are transient, but the things that are unseen are eternal." 2 Corinthians 4:17-18 (ESV)

The Gift of the Spirit - The Gift of Hope!

word of life

"Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words." Romans 8:26 (NRSV)

Read Romans 8:22-27

How would you describe the Holy Spirit?

How have you experienced the presence of the Holy Spirit in your life?

The lesson for today is a part of a longer treatise by Paul on the gift of the Spirit and the hope of believers of Christ. The verses assigned on this birthday of the Church begin with an image of childbirth: "We know that the whole creation has been groaning in labor pains until now." (vs. 22) The brokenness and suffering of the world includes all creation. For Paul, the struggle is universal; all of creation is in travail.

Is it comforting or troubling to think that struggle involves all creation?

But there is, as in childbirth, an anticipation of a new life to come – a life where pain and struggle will cease. The promised new life provides the faithful with a wonderful gift – the gift of hope. (vs. 24) For Paul, hope is seen in the context of struggle. It is not a pie-in-the-sky, one-day-by-and-by illusion. The groans and the pain still are present in the life of a follower of Christ. Hope is grounded in the painful realities of the world, yet hope is what sustains the follower in the midst of this reality. Paul encourages the church in Rome to wait with patience in anticipation of something greater yet to come.

How do we experience hope in our lives? Are there times when it is hard to have hope? How does this passage address such times?

Paul also points to another gift given to the faithful – the gift of the Spirit. The Holy Spirit aids in times of weakness (vs.26) and intercedes in prayer when there are no words.

Today's reading from Romans is bracketed by two verses that are often read in times of struggle and pain. The section begins with a statement of hope: "I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory about to be revealed to us." (Romans 8:18 NRSV) And the section continues with words of confident faith: "We know that all things work together for good for those who love God." (Romans 8:28 NRSV) THANKS BE TO GOD!

Describe circumstances in which these verses would be particularly meaningful.

Are hope, waiting, and patience related? How so?

word among us

We as Christians live in an "in-between" time. Jesus, the Savior of the world, has already come and proclaimed the in breaking of the kingdom, yet we await the promised coming of God's reign in all its fullness. We still face suffering and pain in the world, but we have hope for what is yet to come.

It is a "pregnant" moment, and Paul uses the imagery of the labor of childbirth to describe the life of a Christian. There is anticipation of a hoped-for life to come. That future hope of new life impacts the present reality. It changes the way life is viewed and lived. Relationships are changed, and priorities are re-ordered.

- 1. Do you find the imagery of childbirth meaningful? Why or why not?
- 2. How does life change when new life is expected?

But a great deal of pain and strain is endured before the birth occurs. Paul views the whole creation "groaning in labor pains" while awaiting the hoped-for, promised new life. He urges the church in Rome to hang on with patience to the hope of what is yet to come. The new life will be birthed, but labor pains are experienced first. Paul reminds the believers in every day and time that we are not alone in our labor pains. The Holy Spirit – like a faithful mid-wife – is with us through the delivery, comforts us, gives courage to face the struggle, and provides the gift of hope. The Spirit even intercedes on our behalf when the labor seems too much to bear and there are no words.

Proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed

We know about labor pains — literally and figuratively. We know the struggle of life and death, of hope for future life and the need for patience in the meantime. But hear the good news we can proclaim to a world aching for new life: We do not face the struggle alone. The Holy Spirit guides our every step and gives voice to our needs. The Spirit reminds us that there is One who endured the pain and suffering of the world, One who overcame death and suffering, One who ushered in new, resurrected life.

Our lives are forever changed because of this One. We are empowered to face the labor before us, for we have the hope of a new creation through the One – Jesus Christ.

- 5. Name someone who lives with suffering yet manifests hope in Christ.
- 6. What opportunities do you have to proclaim the good news of God's Spirit working in your life?

Prayer

Be with us, O God, in our times of struggle. Send your Holy Spirit to remind us that You are with us even then; through Christ our Lord. Amen


