

# **REACHING UP: WORSHIP IN MARCH**

**March 3** – **Spiritual Gifts** Ever wondered what your spiritual gifts were? Ever thought to yourself," I want to do something for Jesus but I don't know what I can do," or "I want to be more involved at church but I don't know what I can offer?" If this sounds at all familiar, you will want to be in worship on Sunday, March 3. Answers to your questions just might be answered...

March 6 – Ash Wednesday – 6:30 p.m. -7:15 p.m. We will gather in the fellowship Hall for worship and the beginning of the Lenten season.

### The Theme for Lent this year is "Busy-Making Room for an Unhurried God."

The season of Lent has often been a time when we think about "giving something up"—a holdover from its penitential flavor in the medieval church. But what if we thought less about "giving up" and more about "making room?" In this Lent series, we will find out what it really costs to be so busy. Let us reconnect to an unhurried God.

#### Here is a summary of what each Sunday of Lent in March will be about:

**March 10 – The Right Tempo** Jesus never promised that the yoke would literally be "easy". This is a mistranslation. In this context of yoking oxen, the translation means "well fitting". As we begin our "Busy" series, we discover that each of us has a tempo that fits well, that energizes us. What tempo gives you life and energy? Matthew 11:28-30

**March 17 – Preparing a Table** The twenty-third Psalm is a great comfort to us as we imagine the green pastures and still waters. It also recalls the dark valleys and calls us into the not-so-easy practice of sitting down at the table with our enemies. An unhurried God is present with us in the good times and in the difficult times and invites us to be radically present to each other in the same way. Have we been too busy to be really present to one another? Psalm 23

**March 24 – Tuning In** In Luke 10:38-42 we read of two sisters, Martha and Mary. Martha was busy. Mary chose to be still, to tune in to Jesus. The lesson here is not that it is bad to work, but that we also need times of connection to God. Tuning in to the holy may mean just taking time to notice things that are beckoning to dwell with us a while. What contemplative practices can feed and nourish our active lives?

**March 31 – Living Light** No one, at the end of their life, would say, "I should have spent more time at the office." And yet many of us live with the tyranny of measuring-up that keeps us weighed down. Lightening the load of expectations and "shoulds" is one way to lighten up as well as to literally lighten the clutter that crowds out our serenity. How do we create space to flourish in the ways God intends?

#### A WORD FROM OUR BOARD CHAIR

Let me begin by saying a "great big thank you" to R.Wayne Calhoun, Wendy Wilson and Hayden Cran for what I am sure was a fantastic Annual Planning Event (APE) last month. I trust that those who attended came away with a fire burning in your souls to bring more people to Christ, to lead them to know Christ and what the importance he will have in their lives. We do not intend to use all these funds but we feel it is irresponsible as people of faith to simply "sit" on all of it for a rainy day.

What do you think would be the most pleasing in the eyes of The Lord? Would he be happy knowing we are earning money or would he rather we be using some of that money to bring others to Christ? Remember the slogan a few years ago, what would Jesus do?

2019 is the year for Unity Christian Church to be both BOLD and INTENTIONAL!

#### Don't Put Out the Fire

There's a lot going on at Radford University--so many ways to be involved; to be fulfilled; to find community. That's a good thing. Even within the narrower category of Religious & Spiritual Life Organizations at RU, there are so many to choose from. all with unique and potentially valuable traditions/practices/stories. We could be forgiven for feeling overwhelmed, and put out, by the sheer number of choices. Perhaps we can relate to the folks who've simply opted out. Perhaps we can relate to them because we ARE them. But, even for many of us who've opted out of religion altogether, there often remains some nagging, unanswered questions, some unfinished business, some healing that's needed, some sense of loss mixed up with all the other stuff.

For those of us who've inherited the various Christianities of our parents and grandparents, and who've found these traditions/worldviews to be profoundly wanting; we are not alone. Within the Protestant Christianities (roughly all those Christian traditions outside of the Roman Catholic Church and the various Eastern Orthodox traditions) alone, there's far too much trauma/irrelevance/objectionable behavior to ignore; from mistreatment and exclusion of LGBTQ+ people, to antiintellectualism, to abuse of power, to the propagation of unjust systems of racism and sexism, to lazy, reductive theologies.

Considering all this, we're a movement of folks at Radford who're challenging prevailing narratives about what it means to be a Protestant Christian. We believe our inherited traditions are both important and not the whole picture. We believe there's ALWAYS a better way to be/practice church, and we're looking to explore and enact those better ways. We believe the unqualified inclusion and affirmation of the FULL humanity, agency, and potential leadership of LGBTQ+ people is not only right and good, but CENTRAL TO WHAT IT MEANS TO BE A CHRISTIAN. We believe in not only rejecting the strange concept of reading the Bible "literally," but that, if we're actually taking this ancient collection of writings seriously, we'll read the Bible LITERATE-LY. We believe in asking real questions, expressing real doubts, and challenging status quos, because we firmly believe that if there is a God, and if this is, in fact. God's world, that same God holds us all, and keeps us all, and loves us all.

If this sounds interesting / intriguing to you, you're welcome to join us Sunday evenings, from 7-9pm, at 903 Tyler Avenue, Radford. We'll have dinner at 7pm (free and home-cooked!), sing a few songs, listen to someone give their thoughts on a topic, and then engage in a group discussion around the same topic.
