Message from the Pastor

Beloved of Christ,

In 1910, the
Presbyterian Church
composed a statement
that has been since
included in our Book of
Order. This is called "The 6
Great Ends of the Church."
Ends, in this statement, is
more about goals and
aspirations instead of
finality. End, in this sense,
is more concerned with

purpose. These were written to give a clear picture of who we are and what it means to be the church. Since that time, the Book of Order has been revised at least six different times, there have been three mergers among Presbyterian denominations, and yet this statement remains largely unchanged. I read them, and they seem so distant or lofty, but each statement is meant to inspire, to challenge, to lead, and to shape us in our lives together.

The great ends of the church are:
the proclamation of the gospel
for the salvation of humankind;
the shelter, nurture, and spiritual
fellowship of the children of God;
the maintenance of divine
worship;

the preservation of the truth; the promotion of social righteousness;



and the exhibition of the Kingdom of Heaven to the world.

These are a list of distant goals to achieve, as if we could on our own. They are more of a mission and vision statement concerning what it means to be the

church right now. Where we are lacking in these, is not meant to be a condemnation, but an invitation for growth. Where a church fails to live and exhibit these, the church becomes just another social or civic organization.

They also speak directly to our life of faith, just because we support organizations that work towards these ends doesn't mean we are doing them ourselves. To study the Great Ends is to measure our life together as a congregation. All six matter. We cannot choose certain ones that we are good at or feel comfortable doing and letting others do the rest. They are all interconnected and rely on each other and define each other.

Over the next several months, we will examine each of these ends individually and see how they rely on and build on each other.



SCRIPTURE

August 4: Tenth Sunday after Pentecost/Proper 13: Read John 6:24-35

Then Jesus declared, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty." In saying, "I am the Bread of Life," Jesus is claiming to not only be divine, but also the only one who can truly satisfy our soul! What are some things besides Christ we hope will satisfy us?

August 11: Eleventh Sunday after Pentecost/Proper 14: Read John 6:35, 41-51

How do the crowds misunderstand the meaning and purpose of Jesus' words? In what ways do people misunderstand Jesus today? If you were to help someone see Jesus clearly, what would you say or do or not say or do?

August 18: Twelfth Sunday after Pentecost/Proper 15: Read Ephesians 5:15-20

Paul warns the Ephesians to have wise lives and understand the will of God. He reminds all of us to give thanks to God at all times for everything. Make a list of what you are thankful for and how you give God thanks always.

August 25: Thirteenth Sunday after Pentecost/Proper 16: Read Ephesians 6:10-20

Paul reminds us to be strong in the Lord and put on the whole armor of God, to withstand the wiles of the devil. As you read this passage, ask yourself how you live out Paul's instructions.




4. Please take time to introduce yourselves to her. We look forward to having a new coordinator for our expanding programs.
