Message from the Pastor

Beloved of Christ,

John 14:15-16 reads: "If you love me, you will keep my commandments. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate, to be with you forever. This is the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him, because he abides with you, and he will be in you."

As we continue to examine the PC (USA) cross, we come to a very difficult symbol-the Trinity. Jesus speaks to this in the passage cited above. The basic understanding of the Trinity is that God is one revealed in three persons. We do not worship three gods but instead a single God that exists in three persons. A traditional rendering looks like this:



Confused yet? Don't worry. You are not alone. Theologians have been trying to



our cross, but it is vitally important. Notice

the triangle shape that recalls the ancient description of the Trinity.

What does this mean and why is this important? This is the very way God that has chosen to

be known and has self-revealed in the scriptures. We attribute certain aspects of the divine with certain persons of the Trinity, but each person is still fully God. Therefore, an action of one person of the Trinity is an action of God in God's entirety.

For example, we attribute creation to God the Father. God the Father holds all things together and watches over all things. We attribute the sending of the Son to God the Father. (Continues on page 3)

Salt Shakers returning; sign up!

It's been a long time, but we're starting Salt Shakers again and hope to make this the best year ever!!! Here's how it works. Salt Shakers is like a supper club, but you'll be with different people each

month. One person (or couple) serves as the host and provides a main dish. Three other people (or couples) are responsible for bringing a salad, vegetable, and a dessert. Property Updates

Property is still asking people to make donates towards the stained glass window repairs/restoration on the main parking lot side of the church.

We have paid \$23,481.75 to get the project started. So far, we have had over \$25,000 donated to the fund so the first payment was covered. We will get reimbursed 50 percent of our payment by the state grant award. The State approved an additional funding of \$6,963.50. Since this is a matching grant, this reflects 50 percent of our request of \$13,927.

Work on the office ceiling and new lighting is completed. Thanks Eric and ESolutions. Tate Communications has begun installing the new security and keyless entry systems around the church. The team is now getting bids to replace the elevator.

The team would like to especially thank Ken Miller for all the countless hours and work he has given to keep the church building and facilities in shape and working. Ken is stepping down from the team after serving many years.

SCRIPTURE

February 5: Matthew 5:13-20 says you are the light of the world and lights are not meant to be hidden. We must let our light shine so that others will see our good works. What can you do to shine your light and help make someone's day better?

February 12: In the text from 1 Corinthians 3:1-9, we are told that we are all God's servants working together. What are ways that you can work with God's servants? Gather a group of people and volunteer at a food pantry or visit a nursing home together or help someone with their chores.
