Message from the Pastar

#### **Beloved of Christ,**

2 Timothy 3:16-17 declares that "All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, so that everyone who belongs to God may be proficient, equipped for every good work."

We continue to examine the PC (USA) cross

and what it tells us about what we believe. We come to an important portion, and one that became central to the Reformation: the proclamation of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Martin Luther and others believed that the proclamation should be central to the worship of God. The scriptures are not just for personal study or private piety. They shape our communal life together by the Word of God inspired by the Spirit of God.



If you look at this design, notice that the top is shaped like an open book resting on a pulpit. The Word of God born among us is revealed in the Word of God written and proclaimed in the Word of God spoken. John Calvin held the proclamation of the Word in highest

regard, not for the pastor's sake, but for the upbuilding of the Church and as the



disciples int proclaimers of God. The flames also recall Christ's own baptism when the Spirit descended onto Jesus. That very same Spirit still speaks and still guides and still challenges us to

go forth with faith. It is the Spirit that guides and leads the one speaking the words of

God. The sermon should never be the will or

intention of a person or a specific ideology or political persuasion. The preacher or teacher should only speak what is given by God.This will no doubt challenge and upset us at times. There are times I wrestle with the scriptures and become quite uncomfortable. I believe that is the Spirit of God at work transforming us. If we are never uncomfortable or challenged, we are not growing in our faith nor are we open

primary way to enact social change according to the grounding of God. The flames on each side of our cross remind us of the fire that descended on the first apostles in Acts 2. The Spirit enlivened and changed these first disciples into proclaimers of the word

Christmas Eve was glorious with the WV Brass Quintet being a part of the service and the Cambridge Handbells added so much to worship throughout the month by ringing arrangements of "O Come, O Come Emmanuel, "Ding Dong Merrily on High" with "Ukrainian Bel Carol" and "Lo! How a Rose E'er Blooming". Kudos to both choirs for all their hard work rehearsing and preparing all of this music.
