# Message from the Pastor

#### **Beloved of Christ,**

Several years ago, I read an article discussing church signs and the things we put on them. The guy writing the article concluded by stating what he wanted on his church sign:

This isn't our house. It's [God's]. The pews, principles and even the words we speak

belong to [God]. We're imperfect. We'll stick our feet in our mouths and sometimes we'll fumble around as children of God are meant to. But no matter what you look like, where you're from, or whether you have a PhD or dreams of a GED, we will love you. In fact, we already do. He finished by saying: "Now

that's a church sign worth aspiring for.
Come to think of it, I want that one in my front yard, too." That stuck with me and challenged me in ministry. That is the kind of follower of Christ I want to be.

With that in my mind, I turned to Ephesians 5. Paul writes what became the basis for Luther and the Reformation in that chapter:

But God, who is rich in mercy, out of the great love with which he loved us even when we were dead through our trespasses.

In my mind and theology, this sums up the Christian message: mercy and love making us truly alive in Christ. Grace that brings us eternal life. What else can we say? What else needs to be said? My favorite part of this passage is that none of this speaks of an angry and vengeful God. Instead, we get the revelation of a God who loves greater than we can ever imagine. If nothing else I have said or done in my ministry here matters, my prayer is that this promise will remain fixed in your hearts. God, out of great love, has made a way for us to live as we truly were created to live.

By this point, many of you know that I have informed the session that God has called us to a new adventure. Jennifer will begin a new position at Williams College this Fall. My last Sunday in the pulpit here at First Presbyterian Church will be July 20, 2025. This is not shared easily or without tears (Continues on page 3)

# June Murturing Faith Ideas

#### **SCRIPTURE**

#### June 1: Seventh Sunday of Easter

Read Acts 16:16-34

When Paul and Silas were in jail, they prayed and sang hymns to God; they knew that God was with them, even in that difficult time and place. When you are going through difficult times, do you pray and sing? Do you remember that God is with you?

#### **June 8: Day of Pentecost**

Read Acts 2:1-16

On the Day of Pentecost, we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on Jesus' waiting disciples. Where do you see the presence of the Holy Spirit poured on in your life? in your church? in your community? these days? Share with someone and ask them where they see the Spirit.

#### June 15: Trinity Sunday

Read Psalm 8

On a clear night, the moon and stars shine brightly in the night sky; sometimes, we, like the psalmist, feel small in comparison. Yet, we have been given a special place in creation as God has created us a little lower than God to take care of God's creation.

#### June 22: Second Sunday after Pentecost

Read Luke 8:26-39

Jesus was met with a man filled with demons; the man called out to Jesus as soon as he saw Jesus. Jesus commanded the demons to come out of him, and Jesus sent them into a herd of pigs, which then ran into the lake and drowned. Rather than awe and wonder at the man being made well, the people reacted with fear. When you become aware of the miracles of Jesus, how do you respond? with fear or with praise?

#### June 29: Third Sunday after Pentecost

Read Galatians 3:22-25

The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. These aren't many fruit among many; we don't get to pick and choose which we want to do most. Led by the Spirit, our lives are to reflect all of
