Message from the Pastar

#### **Beloved of Christ**,

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. We have had a

busy Christian year so far. We began in Advent with the anticipation of the coming Christ. Then we celebrated Christmas with God being born among us. Epiphany reminds us of the visit of the Magi and the light of Christ illuminating our world. Then we

remembered Jesus' baptism and the promises that it holds for us. Very quickly, we moved into Lent as we prepared our hearts once more to approach the cross and hear the story of our salvation. This culminated in Easter with the glorious news that Christ is risen! Finally, we arrived at Pentecost and celebrated the gift of the Holy Spirit moving in us and in this church and in this world.

Each of these are wonderful by themselves, but together, they reveal the larger picture of God's love and goodness poured out for us. Praise the Lord!

Now, we settle down for a while. There are no more major events in the church calendar for a while. The paraments will change to green and remain green until the end of November. We enter what is traditionally called "Ordinary Time" in the church. The word "ordinary" in this sense derives from the word "ordinal" meaning (according to



Merriam Webster) "of a specified order or rank in a series". Basically, Ordinary Time simply means "counted time".

We use the word "ordinary" in a different way today. Usually, I mean something akin to boring, normal, regular, hum drum. Yet, if I'm honest, that is how most of

my days feel, regardless of what the calendar says. I get up and do the same old things. Each week progresses in much the same way. There is a comfort in that, but also a tendency to become complacent. It all seems so...ordinary.

Into this space, we hear the words from Ecclesiastes 3:

"For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven...[God] has made everything suitable for its time: moreover he has put a sense of past and future into their minds, yet they cannot find out what God has done from the beginning to the end."

For everything there is a season? Really? Obviously, the big events in life have a space, but often I feel like I'm just waiting for the next big thing. But everything has its season? Going to the doctor and sitting in the waiting room? Taking Marley to another soccer practice? Doing the basic things to get through the day? (Continues on page 3)


Don't forget that Vocal Tapestry is giving a concert June 2 in the sanctuary.

Again I ask, everything?

Yet, there it is and that is the gift of this time in the church calendar. We don't live on the mountaintops all the time. Sure we need to go there sometimes to be refreshed, but we cannot stay. We come back down where there is frustration, hurt, heartache, grief, boredom, and the plain, ordinariness of life. The promise we receive though is that God meets us there. That God has a purpose for us there. In fact, each day is enough if we remember that it is a gift of God and we look for God's blessings and movements.

That's what we do in this time in the church. The first half of the year grounds us firmly in the salvation of God. The second half helps us see what it means to live as redeemed people of faith. We learn what it means to follow Jesus and to struggle, to rejoice and to weep, to plant and to reap, to tear down and to build up. Here, in the commonness and ordinary parts of life are where it sometimes feels difficult to be faithful, but God is faithful to us. Truly our lives are filled with grace, forgiveness, and love.

My encouragement for us is to find peace and to be grounded in the ordinary parts of life. I encourage all of us to find a simple daily routine to remind ourselves our who we are and whose we are even in the ordinary. Kathleen Long Bostrom offers a few ideas: "Use life's ordinary moments to pray. Pray at a stoplight for the other drivers around you. Pray while standing in a long line and getting impatient. Pray when sitting in a doctor's office and the staff is way behind schedule."

Friends, may we learn how to live in the ordinary knowing our extraordinary God is with us. To the glory of God, Rev. Evan Walker

#### SCRIPTURE

#### June 2: Read 1 Samuel 3:1-10

June is National Children's Awareness Month. Children are important to God and a blessing and gift to us. Hannah knew this and entrusted her son, Samuel, to God. Adults, consider the children in your life, talk with them about how God might be calling them to serve. Children, talk with an adult you trust about where you think God is calling you to serve the church.

#### June 9: Read Mark 3:20-35

Jesus' own family thought he had lost his senses. He left the security of a carpenter's business to become a wandering preacher. No one, they thought, could take on the Scribes and Pharisees and come out a winner! And he could care less about "What will people say?" Sometimes the voice of our neighbors is louder than the voice of God! What risks are you willing to take for the sake of building God's kingdom?

#### June 16: Read Mark 4:26-32

Jesus compares the growth of the Kingdom of God to that of a mustard seed. Just as the smallest of seeds grows into a great bush, we, too, can sow seeds that help God's kingdom to grow. Think of "seeds" you or your church family have planted that have produced amazing results in your church or community.

#### June 23: Read Mark 4:35-41

The disciples were afraid and worried when the storm threatened to overtake their boat on the lake. They asked Jesus, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" In response to their fears, Jesus calmed the storm. What are the storms in your life of worry, sorrow, fear? In the presence of Jesus, we can have peace even in the wildest storms.
