Message from the Pastar

Beloved of Christ,

This year is passing quickly. It seems as though we just celebrated Easter, and now we are in Fall and literally a few weeks away from Advent. November contains two special days for the community of faith. Obviously, we celebrate Thanksgiving. Hopefully, this is a time to remember and give thanks to God who has watched over us

so faithfully during the last year (and not just a time to gorge ourselves and prepare to join the Black Friday shopping).

The other one is lesser known and remembered, but important – All Saint's Day. Let us share these words from 2 Timothy 1:2-7 (NRSV):

"To Timothy, my beloved child: Grace, mercy, and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord. I am grateful to God—whom I worship with a clear conscience, as my ancestors did—when I remember you constantly in my prayers night and day. Recalling your tears, I long to see you so that I may be filled with joy. I am reminded of your sincere faith, a faith that lived first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice and now, I am sure, lives in you. For this reason I remind you to rekindle the gift of God that is within you through the laying on of my hands; for God did



not give us a spirit of cowardice, but rather a spirit of power and of love and of selfdiscipline."

These are great words, but I love the fact that Paul first begins by tracing Timothy's lineage. Timothy received what had been given to his mother by his

grandmother. This faith shared and passed down through generations. Timothy was raised and nurtured and grew in the faith. This is true for most of us in this church, though not all.

My aunt sent me books this week that my grandfather had received from his grandparents. He was a minister, my father is a Minister of Music and my mother is a church musician. Then there is me. Someone who was raised in the faith. Yet, I still had to make it mine. I cannot just live my parent's and grandparent's faith.

Then, I recall the larger community of faith – the church that helped raise me in the faith. I can still name many of my teachers. I give more thanks for them now because I realize more of what I was like as a child. I recall friends throughout my schooling who helped shape and form me. Movember Murturing Faith Ideas

SCRIPTURE

November 5: In Matthew 23:1-12, Jesus criticizes the Pharisees for laying heavy burdens on others and then not lifting a finger to help. He says they do this by accusing others of doing things that they are guilty of themselves. Can you think of a time when you might have inadvertently laid a heavy burden on another? Have you lifted a finger to help?

November 12: In Joshua 24:1-3a, 14-25, the people recommit themselves to God by reminding themselves of all the ways God has taken care of them. In times of doubt and distress, we can learn from their example. We can remember that God will be with us now and in future for the simple reason that God has always been with us in the past.

November 19: In the challenging parable of the talents, (Matthew 25:14-30) Jesus teaches us how important it is that we use what we've been given for the glory of God. Take an opportunity this week to use one of the talents you've been given to show love and honor to God.

November 26: Ezekiel 34:11-16, 20-24, describes God's ultimate promise of seeking out the lost and scattered sheep, so that all can be brought together under the care of the one Good Shepherd. How can we help God in this project? As disciples, we should take it upon ourselves to seek out the lost and scattered of the flock, to welcome them, and to show them that they have a home with us.
