



In this season, I turned to Isaiah 40:28-31.



This passage has always intrigued me as Isaiah seems to be introducing God to the people once more. He asks rhetorical, but also surprising questions – "Have you not heard?" Isaiah has great news! Isaiah wants us to receive the promises that God is over all things. God created all things.



God does not sleep or get tired. When our strength fails, God remains faithful. Actually, God is most powerful and revealed in our weaknesses. It is there we truly declare with Paul in Galatians 2 – "It is no longer I who love, but it is Christ who lives in me."

Property gives update on elevator project, funding

As of today the elevator fund has approximately \$150. This is after an initial check of \$28,725 was written to begin the project.

The project is being done by Neoteric Elevator Concepts out of Charleston. The accepted bid of \$57,450 is to install a new hybrid hydraulic vertical platform lift replacing the elevator just off the main sanctuary.

October Murturing Faith Ideas

SCRIPTURE

October 1: Today is World Communion Sunday. The Indonesian word for bread is *roti*. In Spanish, we speak of *pan*. In Hebrew, *lehem*. Offer a prayer today to Jesus Christ, who spoke of himself through the image of bread, while also speaking of our unity with others.

October 8: Exodus 20:1-17 gives us the commands God gave to God's people in the wilderness. This was the way of life and gratitude to which the people of God were/are called: loving God and loving neighbors. Which of these are easy for you to follow? Which are more difficult?

October 15: In Philippians 4:1-9, the author encourages readers to "Rejoice in the Lord always," and, rather than worrying, to turn concerns and thanks over to God in prayer. What makes you rejoice these days? What makes you worry these days? Pray, telling God about all of these.

October 22: In Matthew 22:15-22, Jesus is questions about paying taxes to the emperor, and he tells those asking him to give to the emperor that things that are the emperor's and to God the things that are God's. Most, if not all, of what we have is a gift from God. What are some of the things that belong to God? Pray and give thanks for them.

October 29: Read Matthew 22:34-46. Jesus is questioned by a lawyer, one who knew the law, as to what the greatest commandment was. Jesus responded with not just one, but two: Love the Lord your God with all your being, and love you neighbor as yourself. Discuss with a friend or family members ways to show your love for God and love for your neighbor.
