# Message from the Pastor

#### September has long been

considered a month of transition. Summer activities are over and fall activities begin. Labor Day has traditionally been the turning point for numerous things. Years ago, school, both public and higher education did not open until after Labor Day. That was the day for pools to close and football season to begin. Even today, especially in churches, activities do change and new things are attempted.

Of course, this year, First Church is in the midst of transition. It is an opportunity to reflect on what Scripture may say or suggest to us in times of change and transition. There are passages that focus on individuals and others that speak to the community. For us, both are important.

The prophet Isaiah addressed the people of Israel, but with an implication at least for individuals. Isaiah 40:31 states "But they who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles; they shall run and not be weary; they shall walk and not faint." Psalm 27: 14 advises, "Wait for the Lord; be strong, and let your heart take courage; wait for the Lord!"

The Book of Lamentations is not often read or mentioned in Bible study or in sermons, probably because it is what it claims to be. But verse 25 in chapter 3 offers a good and encouraging word: "The Lord is good to those who wait for him, to the soul who seeks him."

We at First Church are in a time of waiting. Hopefully our waiting is focused on God as well as the transition in Pastoral leadership and our ongoing ministries. This is not only an opportunity, but for the church it is an obligation. In this, as well as other times of significant transition, it is essential for people of faith to trust that God's leadership is present in whatever the change may be.

The challenge is to engage seriously in prayer and reflection and to "wait for the Lord." Having been blessed with strong and gifted ministry by Evan Walker, there is reason to hope and look forward with assurance that God will lead in bringing new leadership to our congregation and the local community.

Together as a congregation, a community of faith, we can wait with expectation and anticipation while we witness God's goodness to continue to bless and enable us to extend his grace and love within our congregation and to the larger community. # September Murturing Faith Ideas

#### **SCRIPTURE**

#### **September 7: Thirteenth Sunday after Pentecost**

Read Luke 14:25-33

What do you think Jesus means when he says one must hate their life to be his disciple? How does his call to carry our own cross inform this? Jesus gives examples of "counting the cost," showing that being his disciple involves a willingness to give up everything. Is there something in your life that you need to give up in order to follow Jesus more faithfully?

#### September 14: Fourteenth Sunday after Pentecost

Read Luke 15:1-10

The Pharisees and scribes were grumbling and saying, "This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them." Jesus told them a story about a lost sheep that was found. What have you lost that you later found? Give thanks to God for lost and found things and people.

#### **September 21: Fifteenth Sunday after Pentecost**

Read Luke 16:1-13

Jesus said that we cannot serve two masters, meaning we cannot be faithful to God and worship something else. Whom or what do you worship and make most important in your life, God or something or someone else? Find a way to show your faithfulness to God this week.

#### September 28: Sixteenth Sunday after Pentecost

Read Luke 16:19-31

Here we find the story of a rich man who was well-dressed and ate well, and the story of a poor man who was covered with sores and wished that he could eat the rich man's leftovers. Most of us have plenty to eat and nice clothes to wear, while others do not. Go through your closets and/or drawers and find some clothing and food that you will share with those in need. Take them where someone in need can get them.
