Dear All,

Though Lent this year does not begin till March 6<sup>th</sup> when we celebrate Ash Wednesday, my thoughts have been on planning for our worship through Lent. This year we are doing a series for Lent called BUSY: RECOCONNECTING WITH AN UNHURRIED GOD. I thought this series that invites us to think of Lent as a time to let go of hurry and worry to make room for God, a time to declutter our lives to simplify and focus on what is truly important to us.

We will be focusing our time together in worship on the fact that though we live in a clock-ticking world that runs at a break neck pace where each of us accomplish overwhelming tasks, Jesus calls us to more than unbridled consumption and production. Rather the scripture calls us to honor our lives and our bodies as gifts to be nurtured.

I invite you to start thinking about a prayer chair to make your sacred space at home for your time with God this Lent. On Ash Wednesday we will spend a little time making our prayer boxes to have a place to let go of our hurry and worry by giving it over to God. During Lent you will be given packet to take home and use in your personal worship.

As we continue our journey through Epiphany looking at all the ways God calls us to be more fully who we have been made to be, we will be focusing on committing ourselves to God. On March 3<sup>rd</sup> The Rev Charlie Summers will be here to preach and lead Communion while I am off being trained by the conference to be a social justice facilitator. We will continue in February with our call in Bible study at 2pm on Tuesdays. Please look in the newsletter for the scriptures for each week.

Dear Partners in Christ:

It calls for the better angels among and within us to always resist impulses to hate, to condemn, to vilify, or to castigate. In such a time as this, the United Church of Christ's call to fulfill the prayer of Jesus, that they may all be one, stands as an urgent mandate to disciples who envision a just world for all.

#### CARITAS IS OUR FEBRUARY MISSION OF THE MONTH.

We will be serving as the intake center for the CARITAS women's group beginning Saturday, March 9 continuing nightly through April 20. First English and the Church of the Good

Shepherd will be taking Monday and Tuesday nights. We need members of St. John's to serve as hosts for Wednesday through Sunday nights. There should be at least two people signed up for each day. Feel free to sign up on a day that is already taken but touch base with those people to coordinate refreshments.

We will be serving approximately 40 women each night and want to greet them with an Extravagant Welcome. As they won't have supper until somewhere between 7:00 and 8:00 p.m. and lunch was many hours earlier, we would like to serve a "substantial snack" – something sweet (cookies, brownies, cupcakes, etc.), something savory/salty (chips with salsa or cheese and crackers), and something healthy (fruit, veggies, etc.).

There will be a list with the sign up sheets of nonperishable items that we will need. All donations can be placed in the kitchen with a note indicating it is for CARITAS.

# Council News information from us to you

From The Council President:

With the holidays over and the renovation for the church nearly under contract, the time has come to open our vision for 2019 and beyond.

There are 125 members on the church roster but we know most Sundays, 35 folks including the choir is a big crowd. Our pledging units are down, even as some of those pledging increased their support. For St. John's to continue this must change. Certainly this is not new information for any of us. Now let me say something that might be a different thought for us, Membership in our community here at St. John's is **EVERYONE'S RESPONSIBILITY**.

We are all a part of this community and each of us has a part to play. For example, when was the last time you asked a friend or neighbor to visit a worship service? It may be a bit outside your comfort zone but what's the worst that could happen? The person says no? Can you live with that? Of course you can. And don't stop with the first 'No'. We love St. John's and want others to share the loving, accepting and progressive community we share, right?

Talk about the missions we support. When was the last time a friend told you their church was supporting companion service dogs and welcomed them in worship; or about the homeless high school kids in Richmond and how your church community supported them; or how your church displays a 'Rainbow' flag and that all are welcome?

I'm not talking about 'evangelism ' (although that word means Good News). I'm talking about being proud of belonging to a progressive Christian community and wanting to share that. Maybe you've overheard a group that needs a place to meet temporarily, did you think of our facility.

I agree we need a plan to increase traffic here and hopefully the Council and Pastor can continue to seek ways we can make better use of our facilities as we renovate. BUT it's not just the council's job to do that. It is all of our responsibility to talk to neighbors and invite folks to visit.

We have a dedicated group of hard working members who devote their time and talents to St. John's every time something is on the calendar and we are fortunate to have them. We need everyone pulling together to continue to move forward and keep our church community vibrant. As we've heard in Pastor Linda's sermons, the church is the body of Christ, and each one of us is a vital part of Christ's body.

We all have gifts given to us by GOD. What is your gift? We need your gifts, we need your energy. We need you!

Church Council President



Church Council met for their monthly meeting on Monday, January 14, 2019.

Finance – The Finance Committee will meet to review the report on January 15, 2019 and have previously met with Carol and Sanya to ensure proper accounting of money and contributions. Jeff moved \$5,000 to the SunTrust Vanco account and \$5,000 the Suntrust checking account from the Suntrust money market account in order to have adequate funds for expenses over the next few months. The current balance of the money market account is \$10,000 less (now \$50,000) than reflected on the 12/31/2018 financial report.

Stewardship/Budget – St. John's received 35 pledges for \$86,000, which is down from the 2019 budget of \$100,000.

Trustees – Council discussed whether we should proceed with renovations or sell the building. Heat/ AC in parlor has been replaced. Trustees are seeking a general contractor to manage the smaller projects. By mid - February, Council would like a quote and plans for repairing the ceiling on the third floor. Linda will determine what needs to moved out and a work day will be planned. Trustees are moving ahead with LLC, and are days away from signing contract for HVAC replacement.

#### **Committee Updates:**

- <u>Mission</u>: The remaining money from the Grant will be dispersed in the next two months. Marcie will prepare the 2019 application. St. John's Community Players donated \$1400 to St. John's from the Cabaret proceeds.
- <u>Worship and Music:</u> The service will be live-streamed on Facebook and recordings of the sermons are available upon request. The theme for the January 27 service is talents. The signup for altar flowers will be in the Parlor. The candles and holders for the sanctuary need to be repaired. The Welcome Teams desperately need members. The consensus is to have the service remain at 10:00.
- <u>Christian Education</u>: Kids are reviewing worship practices.
- <u>Congregational Life and Care</u>: The Congregational Life & Care Ministry reviewed the roster and sent letters to people who had not attended or given money in the last twelve months. Eight letters were sent, two people asked to remain on the roll, three people asked to be removed, and no response was received from three people. The membership directory has been updated. The freezer has been restocked with soup.

Council asked Pastor Linda to enhance her report to provide more detailed information.

#### Motions:

Minutes – November 12, 2018 Council Meeting Minutes and December 2, 2019 Congregational Meeting Minutes were approved as submitted.



We thank everyone who helped to "green" and "de-green" the church sanctuary before and after the Advent/Christmas season. Our beautiful sanctuary seems meant to be adorned with garlands and ribbons and lights. It seems a shame to only decorate her for 6 weeks out of the year. If anyone has any creative ideas for adorning her with festal finery at other times of the year... we would welcome your ideas and your willingness to "make it so."

We also wish to thank all those who took part in our Advent and Christmas worship services – candle-bearers, candle-lighters, readers, musicians and audio/visual technicians. We were inaugurating a new worship format during Advent/Christmas using worship resources from Worship Design Studio. We are grateful for your willingness to "go with the flow" and let us change things up a bit and do a new thing. We have invested in a year's subscription to Worship Design Studio and we will be using their materials again during Lent and at other times during the year. This resource explores different themes in the context of worship and connects current spiritual, communal or ethical concerns with scripture, music, art, prayer, meditation, movement, etc. It will help us integrate our new TV screen/projection system into worship, introduce us to new congregational and choir music and inspire us to connect to God in refreshing ways.

The congregational approval of the 2019 budget meant that you have given us permission to reach out to the community and invite local professional musicians and their protégés to share their talents to enhance our worship services. We may not have a full choir every Sunday, but we hope to have gifted singers and instrumentalists, both professionals and aspiring students, to enliven our worship experience.

As Linda announced in last month's Messenger, our services are now being lived streamed on Facebook each week. Hopefully, this will help those who are ill or unable to get to worship to stay connected to the community and know what is going on. Hopefully, it will also attract those who are seeking to become connected to a diverse and inclusive, yet traditionally grounded Christian community of faith. Having our services live-streamed raised a red flag for us as we realized that our heartfelt sharing of prayer concerns in worship could pose a problem with respect to rights of privacy. Therefore, we now ask that only a name be lifted up in prayer, but no details regarding the need for prayers. Details may be shared in private during Coffee Hour. As we expand our use of technology to reach the least and the lost, we also must expand our boundary awareness to shelter those whose privacy needs to be respected.

If you wish to donate altar flowers in memory or celebration of a loved one, the sign-up sheet has been moved from outside Pastor Linda's office to the Parlor next to the sign-up sheets for Liturgist and Hospitality Hosts. We hope that this will both encourage donations and reduce confusion. If you have any questions about floral donations, please contact Johanna Gilbert.
