Circle Center Adult Day Services is our mission focus for June. The center provides adult day services. St. John's is one of the founding churches. Did you know Chris Hagan represents us on their board? I know she will be happy to talk to you about this wonderful program. They are raising funds for scholarships. A

day at Circle Center is \$75; So in addition to your loose coins on June 3, the Mission & Outreach Committee is asking that you consider donating a little extra. If you wish to write a check, please make it out to St. John's and in the memo write Circle Center. Please take a minute to read about Circle Center and their wonderful programs.

Mission:

To provide comprehensive and individualized quality care for older adults during the day, enabling them to live at home and providing assurance and respite for family caregivers.

Vision:

A community where all older adults and their families have the support and resources to live together with purpose and dignity.

Brief description of current organizational programs/services offered

Circle Center Adult Day Services provides licensed daycare for community-living, high risk, nursing home eligible older adults, and respite, education and support for their family care-givers. Center services are designed to support continued community living, maintain or improve functional abilities, develop coping skills and improve the quality of individual and family life.

Program and services include:

- On-site, all-day skilled nursing care, including showers, personal care and medication management.
- Wellness programs including balance and strength training, a steps monitored walking program in a dedicated space led by professional staff (a model for others serving the frail elderly).
- Recreational and music therapy.
- Dietician approved nutrition services (breakfast, lunch and 2 snacks).
- Social work services including support groups for participants and family caregivers and individual counseling.
- ◆ Transportation and rehabilitation coordination to meet individual needs, respite for caregivers.
- Pioneering use of Montessori-based care for advanced dementia; documented to improve engagement and reduce problem behaviors in participants who otherwise are unable to attend to tasks, are restless and anxious, wander, ruminate and otherwise require constant support and supervision.
- An innovative multi-sensory room, to meet the needs of the most impaired who are withdrawn or agitated.
- Use of electronic health records to increase compliance with regulatory requirements.
- Preparation of the next generation of professionals for future eldercare roles with student internships in nursing, occupational therapy, social work, psychology, and therapeutic recreation, from seven Virginia and out-of-state universities.
- Needs-Based Scholarship Program for those who cannot afford all or part of their care.





Summer Parties



are dates that would work well for you or if you have any questions. Once we get the hosts and dates set then we will post a sign-up sheet so that hosts will have an idea on turnout.


