Church Council met for the monthly meeting on Monday, August 13, 2018.

Finance Report – Jeff will present the report to the Finance Committee. Jeff moved \$10,000 to the Vanco account to cover recent bills and expenses. He's still working with SunTrust to set up an investment account and hopes to have it completed this week. The committee has received most of the committee budget proposals. It was suggested we create a realistic budget based on actual pledges.

Trustees' Report — work on the parking lot began last week with tree removal. Although there is no fencing and no formal notification, members should suspend using the lot. Staff can use spaces by parlor door and they have three spots at St. James if needed. The Trustees are working on securing additional information from Dunlap Engineering and KBS in order to issue an RFP for the HVAC replacement, as well as obtaining additional information from architects and lawyers to assist with the renovations. The ad hoc Parking Lot group will meet Thursday, August 16.

Anniversary - Gina Dalton will contact past ministers about joining us and participating in the service. We are behind in planning. We will have a Reunion/Happy Hour Friday night with beer, wine, and traditional snacks (guacamole, hummus, veggie platter, pretzels, etc.) as well as a selection of Indian appetizers that Vijaya has offered to make. Saturday will be the traditional GermanFest, and Sunday will be a special worship service with cake after church. Music and Worship should plan the service. Plans for a silent auction have been tabled and the Fellowship has decided not to have a Bazaar.

Missions - Marcie and some committee members are visiting organizations who are receiving money as our monthly mission. We will have a booth at PrideFest and need volunteers. Ted Lewis from Side by Side will speak for a mission moment in September.

Congregational Life and Care is not meeting in August. They had great seats for the baseball game. Jeff Jacobs' supper on August 12 was well attended. The last summer supper is Saturday, August 25 at the Bighinatti's house.

Council recommends leaving worship time at 10:00 until after anniversary, having Sunday school begin after the anniversary weekend. Council will revisit start time based on feedback from the Music and Worship Committee.

Discussed guest ministers, who meets and greets guests minister. When Linda announces she will be away, Linda will send an email to guest minister, copying the M&W chair and council president. M&W chair will designate a greeter and notify Linda and council president with contact information.

Facilities - See report. Cleanup days are scheduled to prepare for the Anniversary weekend.

175th Anniversary Celebration



What is it? The CROP Hunger Walk is a family friendly 3.4 mile walk that links the Richmond

community together in solidarity with our neighbors all around the world who have to walk long distances daily for food and water. Funds raised from the walk provide food and other resources for families in Richmond and around the world.

Who walks? Residents in Richmond and the surrounding areas, including religious communities,

businesses, schools, non-profit agencies, organizations or any person who wants to

contribute their time and/or money to help support those in need.

When? Sunday, September 16th at 2:00pm. Registration for walkers begins at 1:00pm.

During the rally time we will have displays from the local agencies benefitting from our walk, and we will also be assembling hygiene kits for distribution through Church

World Service.

Where? The walk this year will begin and end at Ginter Park United Methodist Church,

1010 W. Laburnum Avenue, Richmond, VA 23227.

How? Walk participants begin by inviting their friends, businesses, organizations and

employers to support them with contributions prior to the walk.

Who benefits? Church World Service (www.cwsglobal.org), established in 1946, distributes 75% of

the money from the CROP Hunger Walk to global hunger education, disaster relief and self-help projects in more than 30 countries around the world. The remaining 25% of funds support hunger-fighting agencies in Richmond. Benefiting agencies in

Richmond this year are: CARITAS, Senior Connections and Shalom Farms.

3. When exiting the deck reinsert the entry ticket into the machine so it can calculate time spent and the associated fee.




4. Scan your QR Code on the scanner just left of the machine.

A Note From Our Missionary, Jeanette Salley: Jeanette Salley is a Missionary with Global Missions assigned to Nicaragua and a member of our Parish

Hola St. John's! All is well with me. It has been pretty calm here in Managua but protesting and violence continues in communities outside of Managua. Many students have been arrested, many have been kidnapped, tortured and murdered.

The only children going to school are the elementary age students. Just about every month, the government says the colleges will be open but the students do not attend because they know the classroom is the perfect place for the military and police to arrest them for no reason and their parents would never see them again. Families, that can afford to, have moved their sons out the country. Those with limited funds have taken their sons to the East coast to stay with other family members. The political, social and psychological suffering that goes on here is horrendous! Keep Nicaragua and me in your prayers.



DISTURBING THE PEACE follows former enemy combatants - Israeli soldiers from elite units and Palestinian fighters, many of whom served years in prison - who have joined together to challenge the status quo and say "enough." The film reveals their transformational journeys from soldiers committed to armed battle to nonviolent peace activists, leading to the creation of Combatants for Peace. While based in the Middle East, *Disturbing the Peace* evokes universal themes relevant to us all and inspires us to become active participants in the creation of our world.

This exhibit from the Promised Land Museum provides an historical context of Palestine from the period before, during, and after the pivotal year of 1948. The exhibit was developed to help understand the root of the Israeli/Palestinian conflict, and dispel myths that stand in the way of peace and justice in the region. With the Israeli Declaration of Independence and war in 1948, an estimated 700,000 Palestinians fled or were expelled from their homes, and were denied the right to return to the hundreds of neighborhoods, towns and villages that were taken over or destroyed.


