## **JHIFM (JOINING HANDS IN FOOD MINISTRY)**

Thank you JHIFM volunteers! Approximately 30 of you masked-up on this cloudy, humid July 12 Florida morning to feed 408 individuals from 126 families in need a total of 7,902 pounds of food.

Our client numbers were down slightly from last July because although we had 105 cars we refused requests from several drivers to pick up food for clients who were not physically present. Second Harvest Food Bank is requiring us to re-register clients beginning this month for TEFAP income eligibility and all clients must be physically present to register before we can allow others to pick up their food for them.

The re-registration procedure worked very well despite the fact that our registrars had to maintain social distancing guidelines. We will continue registration at next month's food distribution.

## **Who We Are: Gloria Dei's History-by Mary Greer**

This is the fifth installment in the series about Gloria Dei's interesting and colorful history.

### **2010 – 2014**

In 2013 Gloria Dei continued its outreach efforts by collaborating with First Presbyterian Church of Leesburg (our next-door neighbor) to form Joining Hands in Food Ministry (JHIFM) to feed the hungry in Leesburg. Volunteers from both churches join hands on the second Friday of every month at Gloria Dei Lutheran Church from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. to feed local families in need. Each family is given enough food to last a week.

Gloria Dei partners with The Salvation Army in several ongoing projects.

- The Christmas Angel Project provides gifts for children and seniors.
- The Community Hunger Project supplies several thousand pounds of food to the Salvation Army's emergency food supply.
- Souper Bowl in January provides cans of soup and bags of crackers for the hungry.
- Blankets and sweaters are provided to the Salvation Army for distribution to the homeless and those with inadequate heat during cold spells.

The youth of the Leesburg community are a continuing project for Gloria Dei. The Book Buddies after School Project encouraged members to share a snack with a child and share a story by reading one-on-one with a child. Children across the globe benefited from the Samaritan purse Christmas Shoe Box Project, which provides toys and clothes.

School supplies drives for Oak Park Middle School in Leesburg are a successful annual event every fall. The Priscilla Circle addresses other needs at the school as they arise. Gloria Dei contributes food to the Backpack after School Program, which provides weekend food supplies to children who participate in the school Free Lunch program.

Many of these outreach projects are carried out in conjunction with Thrivent Financial. Members apply for Action Team Projects and Thrivent donates \$250 for each project.

WELCA continues to provide assistance to victims of worldwide disasters in the form of beautiful handmade quilts. Over 300 quilts a year are donated to Lutheran World Relief as well as to several local charities.

Gloria Dei began its participation in the Lutheran World Relief Coffee Project that supports small-scale farmers and the environment. This coffee is used for church gatherings and is also available for purchase for use in the home. In 2013 a new sound system was purchased and installed, and several members were trained in its use.

In 2014 a call for a new pastor resulted in the selection of Pastor Marilyn Crosby, the first female pastor at Gloria Dei.

Next month: the final installment of the history of Gloria Dei.

## **Council Corner for August 2020**

Can you believe that we are still dealing with this Covid 19 pandemic and it is getting worse, especially when last month it looked like we might get things under control? Well a lot of people are not doing the right things and they are making it worse. But, we at Gloria Dei are holding our own and doing all the right things. Your church council has been meeting monthly to assess the statistics, the science, understand the mistakes that are being made and using our common sense to keep us safe in church.

We now require that anyone entering the church must wear a mask. We have installed plastic shields in front of Mary Beth's desk, Linda Hide's desk and pastor's desk to reduce transmission of vapor from person to person. We have installed arm pulls on all the bathroom doors. We have cleaned all 7 HVAC ventilation systems in the church and sanitized them. We have installed Merv 13 air filters throughout the 7 HVAC systems. We purchased hand sanitizer stations and placed them at the entrances. We still have more cleaning to do!

With all that is going on, we are still operating the business of the church, mainly utilizing Zoom conferencing for meetings and operating from home whenever possible. We are especially thankful for the Video Worship Team, who are all volunteers, who film and produce our weekly services. Pastor has also done a great job organizing and hosting our Sunday Zoom coffee hour ever week at eleven which is growing in numbers. If you have not yet joined with us, please do as it is a great time to catch up with church family.

Our call committee has been meeting every week and is working very hard and prayerfully to prepare to call a new pastor. Look for their report in this issue of the Glorian.

Well life must go on, maybe not as usual, but if we can all stay safe and healthy we will do this together with a little help from our friends. Hope to see you soon!

## **2020 Call Committee News**

The Call Committee is meeting weekly and 15 minutes of our time is spent sharing devotions about the Holy Spirit (Book of Acts) coming to early Christians and guiding their decisions in church issues of the time. The committee is using the same guidelines to guide us through this tedious call process.

Thanks for your thoughts!

A survey was sent to all members to assess their choices for a new pastor. The survey was returned by 114 members, 60 % of the congregation. According to Survey Thermometer, “a survey response rate of 50% or higher should be considered excellent in most circumstances...Survey response rates in the 5% to 30% range are far more typical.” The Call Committee thanks you for your help in identifying the characteristics in a pastor that are most important to Gloria Dei.

We hear you loud and clear!

The committee has tabulated results and will use survey results in identifying the qualities and their ranking to use in searching for a new pastor. (See results list to find out what you and your fellow Gloria Dei members have chosen.)

### **Ministry Site Profile**

We have spent several weeks developing a Ministry Site Profile using Synod guidelines and we continue to work on it. This Profile is a picture of our community and our congregation for Synod to use in identifying pastors that might be a match for us. In addition, Synod requested five references from both in and out of the congregation to answer questions they might have about our congregation and our environment. Five people were asked and all accepted this request. It may be months yet before they are contacted and the Committee is so happy they have agreed to help.

## HOPE PROGRAM

I will be writing to a woman who is incarcerated at Lowell Correctional Institute (for women) in Ocala, FL. This is through Pastor Kris Schonewolf, the chaplain there, and is to support female inmates in their Christian faith. Writing is anonymous, using a pen name or first name only, and using the HOPE Program address as a return address. I have gone through their training and have written one letter so far.

If you or someone you know (female only) might be interested in participating in this ministry to incarcerated women, please contact me at 352-250-8056. It is a 6 month commitment, minimum, with about 2 letters a month planned. Pastor Kris gives a lot of help in writing your letters as well as assistance in answering questions that might be asked. I am excited to do this ministry, especially since it is something that can be done at home in my own time frame. Please pray for the success of this ministry. Thank you!

Our work has been done for a couple of months, but sadly to say very few people have been able to see the completed project. The whole committee worked very hard and would like to share these pictures with you.



## Be Prepared

In Matthew 22.4 we read, *“Tell those who have been invited: Look, I have prepared my dinner. . . everything is ready; come to the wedding banquet.”*

We at Gloria Dei want to be prepared when it's time to reopen our building and welcome all to the wedding banquet that we call weekly worship.

As with all things, being prepared costs money. We ask you to join us in the **Be Prepared** campaign to raise funds to cover the cost of keeping our family safe and healthy.

### Be prepared

- Purchase and install a sanctuary video system.

This will consist of two cameras mounted on the back wall, two video screens on either side of the chancel (altar area), and one screen in the rear of the sanctuary. This equipment will enable us to continue to put our service on the internet while continuing our DVD ministry.

It will also enable us to project the liturgy on the video screens. This enables us to remove hymnals and paper from the pews until the threat of spreading the virus has passed. Jime Eversole, a professional Audio/Visual technician, will guide us through the purchase and installation process.

Estimated cost of video system:

\$25,000.00

- Clean and sanitize all surfaces and areas and provide other safeguards.

This includes:

✠ Deep-cleaning carpets and pews in the sanctuary and the Gathering Space.

✠ Cleaning all ventilation ductwork.

✠ Purchasing hand sanitizer stations.

✠ Purchasing digital thermometers to take everyone's temperature before they enter the building.

✠ Putting up Plexiglas shields in offices and the Welcome Desk in the narthex.

Estimated cost of cleaning and sanitizing:

\$10,000.00

- Provide for moving expenses for the new pastor.  
As the call committee moves toward calling a new shepherd for Gloria Dei, they will be able to tell a prospective candidate that we are prepared to welcome him/her into our family by raising funds that are designated to help them move to the Leesburg area and get settled.  
Estimated moving funds for new pastor:  
\$15,000.00
