
### FROM THE PASTOR

# Love, Listen, Learn, and Lead.

I've added these words to our Sunday morning opening litany because I think they are very important for our lives together during my interim ministry. My first sermon attempted to introduce you to these action



We gather in Christ and share God's **love**. Love is the essence of Christianity. Jesus gives us the new commandment that we love one another. Paul writes to the Corinthians that love is patient and love is kind. When we base everything that we do and say on the Godly love that we know as *agape* we open ourselves up to being servants to each other.

To **listen** is not simply to stop talking, but to be engaged in what the speaker has to say. Listen carefully, feel that person's joys and sorrows, join into their moment, be present with them in your listening.

As I said in my sermon, I always chuckle to myself when I ask my grandkids, "So, what did you **learn** at school today?" and they respond with, "Nothing." If they took some time to think about it, they would be able to verbalize what is was that they knew at the end of the day that they didn't know at the beginning of the day. The same applies to our time in worship. As we love and listen so we will learn what it is that God has planned for us and what we can do to further the Kingdom of God on this earth.

And lastly, we are called to **lead.** Martin Luther was a firm believer in the priesthood of all believers. We are led by the Holy Spirit and we, in turn, lead others to a knowledge of the Good News of Jesus Christ. Leadership is the responsibility of the pastor, the council members, the committees, and all of us who claim to be disciples of Christ.

**Love, listen, learn, and lead.** Hopefully we can keep these words fresh and new in our lives and in our worship as we walk the journey together to bring Gloria Dei into a new era with a new pastor.

# Who We Are: Gloria Dei's History-by Mary Greer

This is the second installment in a series about Gloria Dei's interesting and colorful history.

On January 21, 1953 at the first annual congregational meeting, the small Gloria Dei congregation voted to purchase a lot at 130 S. Lone Oak Drive. At one time this was the location of a depot where Spanish tree moss was collected and shipped north to the Fisher Body Corporation in Detroit to make "horse hair" stuffing for automobile seats.

The congregation decided to build as soon as possible. Just 18 months later on December 12, 1954 the new church building was dedicated by the Reverend Thorston Gustafson, D.D., President of the New York Conference of the Augustana Lutheran Church.

The cornerstone was laid by the Reverend Arne Andell, President of the Florida District of the Augustana Lutheran Church. A copper box containing the history of the congregation, a hymnal, newspaper reports, and the charter membership list was placed in the cornerstone.

By the end of 1954, the Parish Record listed 88 members and 59 enrolled in the Sunday School. This was an increase of 83% in adults and almost 400% in children in just two years. The Baby Boomers had arrived!

Following worship on the 23rd, Pastor Jim will be demonstrating the preparation of ashes in the Gathering Space.



**†** Lives in the area with the people

**†** The people & the ministry are priorities

**†** 6-day work week (40-60hrs)

**†** Generally younger with lots of energy

Quick responses to hospitalizations, etc.

Builds relationship in community (with leaders, pastors, potential members) No time for community efforts

**†** Strengthens relationships in the church

**†** Part of most committees & ministries

**†** Assists in planning for the future

### Critical:

Leads to STRENGTHENED CHURCH with lots of possibilities

Lives elsewhere, commutes in

Time away from the church is priority

3-4-day work week

Likely retired, limited energy

May not be able to respond at all

Regularly spends time in member homes Little time for member visits, irregular

Works mostly with council, few others

Generally limited to council and worship

Mostly maintains status quo

### Critical:

Leads eventually to CLOSURE with no possibilities

- **†** Building Relationships = Building Congregations
- **†** The more time a Pastor spends at this, the more the church will grow.
- † That's why churches that have full-time Pastors are more likely to grow than those having part-time Pastors
