FROM THE PASTOR

Grace and peace be yours from God our Father and our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen

March, 2020, began our adventure with COVID-19. The stay-at-home orders issued by the governor prompted our church to rethink our ways of worshipping and reaching out to each other. Video recording and posting services on our website and Facebook pages replaced our congregational gatherings on Sunday (and Wednesdays during Lent).



Visits to hospitals and nursing homes were strictly prohibited. Facemasks Phone calls, texts, and emails replaced face-to-face physical contact, a vital part of our church family's normal interaction with each other. In keeping with our ELCA Lutheran tradition of celebrating communion only when gathered together physically we suspended the sacrament of Holy Communion until such a time as we can gather together again.

It has been a tragic time, the virus taking its toll in loss of human life. As I write this on April 21, 2020, there have been more than 2.4 million cases of COVID-19 around the world with more than 168,000 deaths. In the US, there have been more than 766,000 reported cases with over 40,000 deaths. In Florida there have been nearly 27,000 cases reported with nearly 800 deaths. No one in our Gloria Dei family has contracted the virus but most know someone close who has fallen ill from it.

Since mid-March, we have been recording our services on video. This has been wellreceived and our members who have internet have been pleased with both the quality of the video and the presentation. They are especially pleased that we record in the sanctuary because it makes it feel like they are actually attending worship. Many thanks to my wonderful team: Irv & Sue Johnson, Paul Motto, Mary Greer, Byron & Crystal Kirkpatrick, Arlene Kelly, Pat Bressler and Mary Beth Morris.

Even in the midst of the storm that has been caused by COVID-19 we know that our Lord is there to bring us peace and calm the storms that rage in our lives and in our world. We are Easter people. We have walked with Christ to the upper room, to the judgment hall, to the cross, and now we join Him in the resurrection.

May 6, 2020 marks my one-year anniversary as the interim pastor at Gloria Dei. It has been an eventful year and I look forward with great joy to continuing my service to this wonderful congregation as we discern God's will for the future of our church.

May God richly bless you as together we weather this storm. I keep you all in my prayers constantly.

JHIFM (JOINING HANDS IN FOOD MINISTRY)

JHIFM is facing many challenges in April 2020 as we experience a heavier than normal turnout of individuals and families in need due to the effects of COVID-19 (Coronavirus) related unemployment and small business closings. Additionally, we are experiencing a shortage of free TEFAP (The Emergency Food Assistance Program run by the USDA) food at Second Harvest Food Bank in Orlando since so many local food banks are competing for limited TEFAP product. Both of these issues have resulted in JHIFM having to purchase more food to feed more people. Another complication is caused because we are being required to limit the number of distribution day volunteers due to social distancing guidelines.

At our April 10th food distribution JHIFM volunteers distributed 11,620 pounds of food to 568 individuals from 165 local needy families. That is nearly a 45% increase over our March 13th food distribution and portends an even larger client turnout in May as more individuals face continued job and income losses.

That is enough bad news. Now for the good news. JHIFM has been accumulating both TEFAP and purchased food for the past several months and has an adequate supply of food to handle the anticipated larger client turnouts. We also have been carefully managing our finances and have adequate cash reserves to purchase more food. JHIFM would like to thank all the individuals who have so generously contributed money and food items during the past month. We especially wish to thank Pastor Jim Young for applying for the ELCA Matching Daily Bread Grant which has resulted in a \$2,500 donation to our food ministry. Also, our gratitude goes to our grant writer, Jon Tetting, who was chiefly responsible for our success in obtaining a \$10,000 grant this year from the Lake County Department of Health & Human Services as well as a recent \$1,000 grant from the Lady Lake SAM's Club. Additionally, JHIFM volunteers continue to apply for and receive smaller grants from Thrivent Financial, Chevron Corporation and Snap On Tools Corporation.

On April 21st we received a delivery of 600 emergency food boxes from Lake County Support and Emergency Response (LASER), and we are in the process of applying for more emergency food boxes from FEMA (the Federal Emergency Management Agency) through the ELCA. And finally we must not forget Mary Greer and our wonderful seamstresses who sewed so many beautiful face masks to protect our volunteers at our monthly food distributions. We are truly blessed to be able to help so many people during this difficult time. Ritch Cassem

<u>The 70's</u>

The physical church continued to change to accommodate the growth of the congregation. Among the most notable changes was the addition of a gabled roof, a narthex, additional pews and the first organ.

Gloria Dei's outreach ministry was increased to include World Hunger Appeal, Lutheran World Relief, sponsorship of several children in other countries, and the benevolence work of the Mary-Martha and Dorcas circles.

Gloria Dei reflected the change in the surrounding community with the recent influx of "snowbirds" into the area. These seasonal worshipers wanted to fully participate in Gloria Dei's rich spiritual life and Gloria Dei welcomed them with enthusiasm.

A Welcome Desk was implemented in the narthex where visitors were greeted by an usher and asked to sign the guest book.

In 1977, Gloria Dei celebrated its 25th anniversary.
