FROM THE PASTOR

November, 2020

In addition to the Zoom meetings that I attend to take care of Gloria Dei business and fellowship, I attend 3 or more Zoom video conferences every month with my fellow interim pastors around the synod. These are highly informative and helpful meetings during which we have an opportunity to pray and to share ideas and concerns that are unique to our transitional ministry. I hear all different kinds of stories that



reflect the myriad congregational dynamics and situations that occur in parish life.

Just before I wrote this, I attended one of those virtual interim pastor meetings hosted by Deacon Connie Schmucker, Assistant to the Bishop for Leadership. I heard uplifting reports that two or three other congregations are interviewing candidates and the joyous news that one church recently called a new pastor who will start at the end of November. Conversely, I heard the sad news that two of my colleagues had decided that their ministry at their present site was coming to an end because they felt that, due to conflict and tension amongst the members, their ministry was no longer effective. I also heard talk of congregations that are no longer able to support their ministry financially and are faced with the prospect of merging with another congregation or closing altogether.

So, when it was my turn on the "Hollywood Squares" (those of you who join our Sunday Virtual Coffee Hour know the drill) you can imagine how elated I was to share all of the good news that is ours at Gloria Dei. I praised the call committee for their diligence and attention to detail in developing the Ministry Site Profile and the report on the 7 Reflections on Ministry that was recently submitted to the Office of the Bishop for approval. I let my colleagues know that I have the absolute best Worship Team in the synod, that our weekly worship service is outstanding and that our first attempt at Drive-in communion was extremely successful due to their efforts.

Yes, there is a lot happening at Gloria Dei. And the work keeps getting done, worship keeps happening both virtually and now also in the parking lot, all because the members of our church family care about each other. We are staying connected because we take the time to reach out.

Phone calls are being made by countless members to offer a word of support and love. Hearing someone's voice on the other end of the phone brings comfort, peace, and wholeness. You never know when that 5-minute phone call will make all the difference in someone's day or in someone's life. During the pandemic I think this is the best way that we can keep our family connected.

Emails and Zoom meetings keep our brothers and sisters in touch and continue the work of the Kingdom. If you haven't joined us on Sunday morning at 11 for virtual coffee because you don't know how to work Zoom, please call me and I'll guide you through the steps to get connected.

We are about to embark on a new and exciting chapter in our ministry together which will lead us to calling a new shepherd for our wonderful congregation. It will get tough at times. At other times there will be such joy that we will not be able to contain it. When the new pastor is called I will praise God that I have been given the opportunity to lead such a great congregation but sad that I will have to say "good-bye."

And through it all, the Lord God will be there in the midst of it, touching our souls with heavenly peace, filling our hearts with goodness, healing our ills through the power of the Holy Spirit, and giving us strength to persevere through the pandemic.

Who We Are: Gloria Dei's History-by Mary Greer

Last month's article was about the symbolism of birds in the stained-glass windows throughout the church. This month we'll talk about the process of creating and installing the windows.

Several years prior to the dedication of the church in 1984 a committee of church members was formed to commission the creation of stained-glass windows. They visited White Stained Glass, Inc. in Sarasota, FL. This is a family-run business that originally started in Canton, OH in 1966 and moved to Sarasota in the late '70s. I interviewed Ron Estep, the owner of White for this article.

The church members and the White company met numerous times to discuss themes and color schemes. The church members would give their ideas and the White company artists would create renderings which would go through numerous revisions.

Eventually, everything was in place and production began. The first windows were those in the body of the church, which were installed in 1984. Each large window cost approximately \$2,000. In today's dollars that is \$5,000. The setting sun clerestory window in the loft was \$2,800 or \$7,100 in today's dollars.

The nave stained-glass windows of Saints Peter and Paul, two angels, and the symbols for the four writers of the gospels were not installed until 1994 at a cost of \$7,800 or \$20,000 in today's dollars. There is no record of where the money came from for the windows, but it was probably through individual donations, fund raisers, and capital campaigns.

This is the last installment of Gloria Dei history. I hope you have enjoyed learning more about your church. Thank you for your many positive comments about these articles.

Council Corner for September 2020 By William Birdsall, council president

The work never stops for the Church Council. There is always something for us to consider, debate and make decisions on. Our most current issues are the 2021 budget and how our call for a new pastor, as well as needed repairs to our church, is challenging our council. It appears that our Call committee efforts over these last 5 months have impressed our Synod representatives and they are anxious to move things forward faster than we anticipated. Therefore, we must fashion our 2021 budget to include our new Pastor's salary, benefits, moving expenses and other costs. We expect to have the 2021 budget ready for the congregation's review and comment by late November. The vote on the budget will take place at the Annual Congregational meeting in January, 2021.

I am happy to report that the new HVAC system has been installed in the downstairs offices with little disturbance and is working as expected. Currently all seven HVAC systems in the building are working well.

Arlene Kelly, Council Vice President, who headed up the church deep cleaning project reports that all the cleaning of high surfaces, carpets and pew cushions has been successfully completed. This completes all of the cleaning items for the "Safeguard the Sanctuary from COVID-19" project.

The Council is seeking a new Maintenance Supervisor to assume the position that I currently hold. I assumed this position late last year but have found that I cannot do both jobs. Since we have hired Bob Keim to maintain the grounds including the lawn and landscaping, the Maintenance Supervisor will focus mainly on the interior and exterior of the church building. If you or someone you know is interested in assuming this position please let me, any council member, or Mary Beth know.

As we move forward during and after the pandemic the council knows that evangelism will be paramount to growing and maintaining our congregation. We need additional new members for this committee as the pandemic has challenged our traditional thinking and we need to do things differently than we have in the past. If you are interested in participating in this new challenge please let me, any council member or Mary Beth know.

Lastly, there will be a vacancy on the Council at the end of this year as Rollie Heimbach's term is ending. If you are interested in serving Gloria Dei in this position, please contact me or any council member.

In closing you should know that the Executive Committee and the Church Council will continue to meet monthly to attend to the business of our church. God Bless you and please stay safe and healthy. - **Bill**

We feel that, as in those early times, the Holy Spirit has guided our committee through the MSP and will continue to speak to us through the rest of the call process. Every meeting of the Call Committee begins with prayer for the guidance of the Holy Spirit in the work that is being done.

Thank you for your continued prayers for our Call Committee work and for our new pastor. We are very excited to be this far in the process and look forward to our next steps.
