Special Congregation Meeting (via Zoom) March 14, 2021 Several recent developments have prompted our council to call a special congregational meeting for March 14, 2021 at 11:00AM. Here are the topics to be considered:

- 1. An anonymous donation of \$26,000.00 was given to Gloria Dei with the restriction that it be used for audio/video equipment. This amount fully covers all of the equipment that was originally proposed including video projection equipment. Following a discussion on this issue a vote will be held. A majority affirmative vote will authorize the purchase and installation of this equipment.
- 2. The call committee is in conversation with a prospective pastoral candidate. This candidate brings much experience and advanced education requiring higher compensation than was originally budgeted. Should the call committee wish to proceed with the call of this individual the congregation will be asked to approve the increase.

Please plan to attend this very important meeting on Sunday, March 14, 2021 at 11:00AM.

SOCIAL MINISTRIES

The Social Ministries Committee met on February 2nd after drive-in communion service, which worked out really well.

We heard from Charlotte about the Oak Park Middle school, which she advised they needed notebooks & markers. She will place a box in Mary Beth's office for your donations.

Joe reported that the Leesburg Elementary was doing well since he spoke with Leesburg Food bank to advise them to be sure to give the school food every week for approximately 60 homeless kids.

Pat Bressler advised she will bring over to Salvation Army things that are in the boxes in the church. We moved to send Salvation Army \$500. for their continuing effort to feed Leesburg. Council Corner for March 2021 By William Birdsall, council president

The Church Council has continued to conduct our monthly Executive Committee meeting as well as our Council meetings as usual and continues to deal with the business at hand in a timely manner. However, we are currently short one Council member, as no one has volunteered to fill the vacant seat available on the Council. We find that disturbing since we cannot believe no one wants to serve our Gloria Dei as part of the Church Council leadership team. If you are interested in filling that position, please contact Council President Bill Birdsall.

We have been informed by the Call Committee that there are no candidates within our Synod that meet our requirements. However, they found a candidate which will meet our needs from out of state. We are told that this is an experienced pastor with years of experience and higher education, which will result in a higher compensation package than we originally planned for. Therefore, it is now even more important that we all increase our giving as we need to be able to support a new pastor this year and in the future.

Recently Gloria Dei received an anonymous donation in the amount of \$26,000.00 specifically for the purchase and installation of video recording, sound and projection equipment in the sanctuary of the church and fellowship hall. This will allow our worship team to record our services more efficiently and produce a higher quality product. This will also allow Gloria Dei to grow our mission to bring live streamed services into the homes of those who cannot attend live services when we go back to in-person church services.

Our new Maintenance Supervisor is working out well and has made some repairs around the building as well as arranging for and supervising licensed contractors to make other repairs. In general, our outside grounds look well maintained and should be colorful this spring.

Lastly, there may be some light at the end of the Pandemic tunnel. The number of new cases seems to be stabilizing and it appears that our government is getting a handle on the vaccine distribution. We will be carefully following the number of new cases in our county as well as the number of people vaccinated to determine if a safe trend emerges that would allow us to open again sometime in the future for in-person service. Of course, this will also depend on our ability to assure our congregation that the Gloria Dei sanctuary as well as the components of the service are as safe as we can possibly make them.
