
Pastor's Message

SOCIAL MINISTRIES

The Social Ministries Committee met April 13 and reviewed the current status of various projects.

- 1. The Oak Park Middle School project for low income and homeless children is being handled very well by their new staff. She is using money very wisely to purchase as much as possible by visiting thrift stores for new merchandise for the children. Gayle Bloom and Elizabeth Sanguedolce will begin to team lead this committee with Charlotte Christensen's assistance. Charlotte will deliver the next donation April 15.
- 2. Joe LaHood has delivered 47 quilts to Leesburg Elementary. They have distributed the quilts provided by our congregation, letting each child select their own in a private meeting. The school sent a thank you note, which will be printed in The Glorion.
- 3. No items have been donated for Salvation Army this month. Pat Bressler continues to lead this liaison.
- 4. Linda Steege reported that all of the remaining coffee from the Lutheran World Relief coffee project has been purchased. Thank you, coffee drinkers! Joining Hands purchased the remainder after the congregation sale after communion services last month. Linda suggested we end the coffee project, as we haven't had very many sales this year, due to Covid and not meeting for church services. The committee voted to end the project and to notify the congregation with a note in the Glorion that those interested in purchasing Lutheran World Relief coffee could do so through the Lutheran World Relief website. The balance in the coffee project fund is \$525.58. The committee voted to send the entire balance to "Mission Partner 100" ELCA program specifying that the money will go to St. John's Lutheran Church in Jacksonville. Pastor Jim Young explained the specific needs at St. John's, an inner city church founded in 1877. He will handle this donation.
- 5. Pastor Jim thanked the committee for providing Luther Springs camperships for three children. James Menchaca's children, Quiana and Julian, will attend the July 18-25's Middle School camp, "Ropes and Zips". One of their cousins from Georgia will also attend. James is funding a fourth child, another cousin from Georgia, who will go to the Elementary School camp, "Discoverer's". The Social Ministries Committee is very pleased that all 4 cousins can attend together.

The next meeting of the Social Ministries Committee is May 18 after the drive-in communion service.

Council Corner for April 2021 By William Birdsall, Council president

Wow! Has this been an exciting month or what? So much has happened in the last 30 days that it is hard to believe that a year of hard work has finally come to an end. Our special Congregational meeting on April 25th was absolutely wonderful and very inspiring. The Holy Spirit was there, and I think we all felt it especially when the clouds left and the sun shone down upon us. We certainly sent our message when the votes were tallied and 71 of 73 members present voted yes to extend our call to the Reverend Edward Barnett. Please, if you see a member of the Call Committee take the time to thank them for all their hard work.

I have spoken with Rev. Barnett and he is planning to conduct his first church service in person on June 13th. I know we all cannot wait for that to happen. He told me his last service in his present church will be May 30th. Then he will have the movers come and move him down here to Florida and into his new home in Tavares. We all know that takes time, so be patient.

The Church council has been tending to church business matters as usual. However, the report from the roof inspection revealed many areas of the roof that need attention this year. In particular, the steeple is leaking and causing water damage over the front entrance which needs immediate attention. Also, we will be adding some lights to shine on the front entrance of the church at night as we have had several alarms at the front door during the evening hours usually between midnight and 5:00am. We hope that will deter that problem. We are also putting in new LED bulbs in the light fixtures around the perimeter of the building and burn them during the night to further deter the homeless from sleeping in the bushes and darker areas.

The Church Council is still short one member, so if you are interested in serving on the Council, please see any council member. It would be nice to start with a full council when Pastor Barnett joins us. There will be so much to do now we could really use the help.

When we did the Meet and Greet for Pastor Barnett, Councilmember Jan Rudolph polled our members as they came in and found that everyone had received a Covid 19 vaccination. With that information and all the precautions, we have taken, the Church council will be having a meeting next week to discuss reopening the church for the various committees, Bible studies and meetings.

Lastly, the Church Council thanks Pastor Jim for steering our ship through these very unusual times and for providing the glue that held us all together. Without his guidance, pastoral leadership, and technical knowledge we would have been lost in the storm. He showed us a new way to worship our Lord and to meet our church family weekly. It is not just magic but his relationship with God that made it all happen. From the Council, a heartfelt Thank you! -Bill
