The legendary cellist Pablo Casals was asked why he continued to practice at age 90. "Because, I think I'm making progress," he replied.

We think of "progress" as something we can see, things that are readily apparent. Some of us remember the advent of television. We remember the old black and white tube sets; and also, how happy we were to finally acquire our first color unit. Then a few years back there was the arrival of "flat screen" units. We think, "well that's progress!" We can think of such progress because it is seen.

With Advent this year, many in our community are entering more than 60, 70, 80, 90, even 100 times through the Church year cycle! Think of all the amazing work that God has done with us over those years! How do we think about that "progress?" We often fail to realize that progress because it is largely unseen. Our Christian faith life consists of repetition and seasons. This process of making us holy, or sanctifying us, is something that we are to be active participants in. But it is largely God's work alone. (Please recall Luther's explanation to the 3<sup>rd</sup> article of the Creed in the Small Catechism!)

"Do not be ashamed, then, of the testimony about our Lord or of me his prisoner, but join with me in suffering for the gospel, relying on the power of God, who saved us and called us with a holy calling, not according to our works but according to his own purpose and grace. This grace was given to us in Christ Jesus before the ages began, but it has now been revealed through the appearing of our Savior Christ Jesus, who abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel."

2 Timothy 1.8-10

The work that God does interiorly rarely is seen, but it's there. As we look for the Advent of our Lord once again this December, do so by giving thanks for the "progress" that's already been made.

The Social Ministries Committee met October 26 and approved a \$500 donation from the 2022 budget to each of the following organizations:

A \$1,000 donation to Salvation Army Food and Christmas Angels and a \$410 donation to Haven House were approved. This completes the budgeted Social Ministry Funds of \$8,000 for 2022.

Elizabeth has agreed to be the Social Ministries liaison to Leesburg Elementary School. She and Gayle will work together to cover both the elementary school and the middle school.

The Salvation Army has requested our participation in the Angel Tree Project. We agreed to take 60 individual "Angels" and asked that they be split between children and seniors. The donations for the Angel Tree Project are due back to the church or to Salvation Army by December 8<sup>th</sup>.

# Council Corner for December 2022 By William Birdsall, Council president

Gloria Dei Council has continued to meet monthly as has the Executive Committee. The Council's work is ongoing and the improvements we implemented are moving along on schedule. The work in Pastors new office/Vestry is complete except for the upgraded lighting. Pastor expects to move into this new space in early December. All the costs associated with that project were donated by two of our members. The work will then be focused on converting his old office into a storage room which is sorely needed. First Impression Task force is collecting Crosses for the Cross wall through the end of November, donate a cross and be part of this new project.

I am pleased to announce that the third stained glass window has been installed in Pastor's new office which completes that project. The work took 1 year and 2 weeks to complete. Congratulations are due Kathleen Birdsall for all her hard work.

The council has been working hard on the 2023 Operating Budget and it appears that with some cuts and adjustments there will be little increase. Many of our costs have increased due to inflation, energy costs, insurance increases, vendor cost increases and employee's salaries. However, with loss of membership and few new members our weekly offerings are showing a concerning decrease which is causing us to tap our reserves to meet expenses. Reserves are not meant to be used for day to day operating expenses but are for unexpected repairs, maintenance and building improvements.

The fall car show was again a success as we able to raise \$775.00 for JHIFM and \$90.00 for the Evangelism committee. The Bingo was a big hit until the Bingo computer program stopped operating. I want to thank all the volunteers who participated and helped make the show a success. The Spring Car Show will be in early March 2023.

The Fall Yard Sale will be held on December 3<sup>rd</sup> from 9am until 2pm in the parking lot. Please come out and participate and remember to bring a table to set up on.

Work on the new directory is under way and pictures of our members are scheduled to be taken in January, so stay tuned. Also remember that the Salvation Army Angel Tree in now in the Narthex and that your gifts must be in the church by December  $7^{\rm th}$ .

# Minutes of the Gloria Dei Congregation Council

Wednesday, 9 November 2022, 10:00 am

We opened with a Eucharistic service by Pastor Barnett.

- Call to Order The meeting was called to order at 10:35 am by Pastor Barnett.
- II. **Roll Call:** <u>Present</u>: Pastor Edward Barnett, Bill Birdsall, Craig Carlson, Linda Hide, Arlene Kelly (excused), Crystal Kirkpatrick, Linda Riikonen (excused), Linda Steege, Loraine VanHaecke, Diane Wasser, Dianne Marcotte (disciple guest)
- III. **Promise** The Covenant Promise was recited by the Council.
- IV. **Adoption of Agenda** The agenda was reviewed. Motion to accept the agenda by Bill, second by Loraine. **Motion carried.**
- V. **Approval of Minutes of Previous Meeting** Minutes of the 4 October 2022 meeting were reviewed. Motion to accept the minutes by Linda Steege, second by Bill. **Motion carried**.
- VI. **Correspondence** Nothing to report.
- VII. Pastor's Report Pastor Barnett distributed his report prior to the meeting.
  - Pastor reported the following service times for Advent, Christmas and Epiphany:
    - Advent Vespers Wednesdays at 4:00 pm, beginning 30
       November 2022
    - Christmas Eve 5:00 pm
    - o Christmas Day 9:30 am
    - o Epiphany Friday, 6 January 2023 at 11:00 am, followed by a pot luck.
  - Christmas decorating/hanging of the greens (tree, pews, poinsettia tree) will be on Sunday, 18 December 2022, after church.
  - Pastor suggested having a holiday party for staff, council members and spouses. Bill will check with Kathleen about hosting it at their home.

- The congregation retreat was discussed. Bill reported that there was a good response, although we need to advertise better next time. Pastor suggested we have another retreat in one (1) year.
- Pastor will look into a telephone calling system for members who
  do not use internet.
- Pastor suggested a system for carpooling homebound members.
   Mary Beth will create a list of members needing a ride to church.

## VIII. Unfinished Business -

- A. Update on First Impressions Task Force
  - Bill reported a wall has been built near the kitchen.
  - A TV will be installed on the big wall.
  - Work is being done on the cross wall.
  - Electrical work is being completed.
  - Bill ordered bookcases to match desk in Pastor's office.
  - Bill reported that the cabinets originally planned for the quilters' room will be too expensive; an alternative of adjustable shelving is being considered. Bill is working with the quilters on finding plastic containers for the shelves.
  - Linda Hide said she doesn't need office space. Since she is only at church a short time, she will work in Mary Beth's office.
  - Pastor's old office will be used as church storage.
  - Bill is working with JHIFM to have a meeting to address concerns with Gloria Dei Council and JHIFM. Bob Glockler (First Presbyterian) will give Bill possible dates for a meeting.
- B. Covid Update Bill reported that there are new variants of the virus and that a new booster is available.
- C. Disaster Preparedness Discussion Dianne Marcotte handed out information on active shooter response. Bill, Pastor, and Dianne will work on a direct mailing to the congregation regarding the active shooter response. Dianne will compose a cover letter to the congregation. Mary Beth will mail information to the congregation. Dianne will look into FEMA active shooter training.

- D. Congregation Retreat Discussed under Pastor's Report. Another retreat will be held in one (1) year.
- E. Chamber of Commerce Pastor and Bill will attend meetings.
- F. New Directory This will be done in-house. Linda Steege and Bev Healy will coordinate.
- G. Evangelism Bill reported the show went very well. There were 27 cars and \$775 was raised for JHIFM. The spring show will be on 4 February 2023. The next yard sale will be held on 3 December 2022.
- H. Council Candidates We are still looking for four (4) new candidates. We may have to change the meeting times to accommodate new people.

## IX. New Business -

- A. 2023 Budget Linda discussed several items in the budget. Linda suggested that numerous items will need to be reduced or eliminated.
  - 19-Property insurance renewal is in April 2023. Linda expects these rates to increase.
  - 22-We cannot afford a webmaster. This position will have to be eliminated. (-\$9,000)
  - 29-Utilities have increased.
  - 35-Sexton's salary has increased. (+\$780.00)
  - 42-Music budget has increased. (+\$500.00)
  - 46-We cannot afford Security. This position will have to be eliminated. (-\$5,760.00)
  - 47-Social Ministry funds will have to be decreased. This should not be an operating budget item. These items should be sponsored by fund-raisers. (-\$6,000)
  - 48-Lutheran Services Florida Will have to be eliminated. (-\$600.00)
  - 49-Synod Benevolence donation Will be decreased. (-\$3,600.00)

Linda reported this is her first draft. Council will approve the budget in December. The budget will then be presented to the congregation in January for approval.

- B. Sound System Improvement for Choir and Organ It's been reported that the choir and organ cannot be heard on live-stream with the current system. Bill will talk to Irv and look into obtaining a new sound system.
- C. Columbarium Due to our current declining financial situation, Bill suggested a temporary hold on Columbarium sales and to consider all sales on a case-by-case basis. Linda reported that we have used \$75,000 from reserves for operating expenses this year. If this trend continues, Gloria Dei will have to close in three (3) years. Motion to put a temporary hold on Columbarium sales and consider sales on a case-by-case basis by Loraine, second by Craig. **Motion carried**.

"Lutheran" Saints: A Saint of the month profile from our Lutheran Calendar\* St. Lucy – 13 December – How did a Sicilian girl become a Swedish patron???

According to the traditional story, Lucy was born of rich and noble parents about the year 283 AD. Her father died when she was five years old, leaving Lucy and her mother without a protective guardian. Like many of the early martyrs, Lucy had consecrated her virginity to God, and she hoped to distribute her dowry to the poor. However, her mother, not knowing of Lucy's promise, and suffering from a bleeding disorder, feared for Lucy's future. She arranged Lucy's marriage to a young man of a wealthy pagan family.

Lucy's mother, Eutychia, was persuaded to make a pilgrimage to St. Agatha's Shrine in <u>Catania</u> in hopes of a cure. While there, St. Agatha came to Lucy in a dream and told her that because of her faith her mother would be cured and that Lucy would be the glory of Syracuse, as she was of Catania. With her mother cured, Lucy took the opportunity to persuade her mother to allow her to distribute a great part of her riches among the poor.

Eutychia suggested that the sums would make a good bequest, but Lucy countered, "...whatever you give away at death for the Lord's sake you give because you cannot take it with you. Give now to the true Savior, while you are healthy, whatever you intended to give away at your death."

News that the patrimony and jewels were being distributed came to Lucy's betrothed, who denounced her to Paschasius, the Governor of Syracuse. Paschasius ordered her to burn a sacrifice to the emperor's image. When she refused, Paschasius sentenced her to be defiled in a brothel.

The Christian tradition states that when the guards came to take her away, they could not move her even when they hitched her to a team of oxen. Bundles of wood were then heaped about her and set on fire, but would not burn. Finally, she met her death by the sword thrust into her throat.

Absent in the early narratives and traditions, at least until the fifteenth century, is the story of Lucia tortured by eye-gouging. According to later accounts, before she died she foretold the punishment of Paschasius and the speedy end of the persecution, adding that Diocletian would reign no more, and Maximian would meet his end. This so angered Paschasius that he ordered the guards to remove her eyes. Another version has Lucy taking her own eyes out in order to discourage a persistent suitor who admired them. When her body was prepared for burial in the family mausoleum it was discovered that her eyes had been miraculously restored. This is one of the reasons that Lucy is the patron saint of those with eye illnesses.

In medieval Europe, Lucy's Day was the shortest day of the year, and the day was celebrated, especially in Scandinavia, as the turning point from the long nights. Swedish communities, including many in America, still have special festivities on this day, "Lussida'n." You girls in the household, dressed in white and wearing a crown of lighted candles, awakens the family in the morning and offers them coffee and cakes from a tray.

  - 3. We don't respond to anonymous comments or letters.
- 4. We don't carry other people's mail. Ask, "What would you like me to do with your comment? You can come to council/meeting yourself or I can bring your comment with your name attached."
- 5. We explain each other's actions in the best possible light. We check with the person quoted or referred to for accuracy before we repeat the comment. (Luther's explanation to 8<sup>th</sup> Commandment)

Disagreements happen in any organization, including churches. Using healthy responses can stop the disagreement from spreading and engulfing the whole organization.

Thank you for practicing healthy responses and encouraging others to do the same.
