I recently completed my first full year as your pastor. It's never what one expects, but it's been a delightful one in many ways. I find myself still in the process of getting to know everyone through one-on-one meetings for coffee. I suspect that this will continue through the rest of the calendar year. As I've said before, I find these meetings very enriching.

I have found Gloria Dei to be a place of many experiences and backgrounds. I have discovered people's openness to each other. I've experienced everyone's love and care for me personally. Just now as I'm writing this, I received a call from Bess King who went on and on about how Gloria Dei so surrounded her with love and care during her recent hospitalization and recovery. Testimonies like hers are why Gloria Dei is a special place. These are the strengths of Gloria Dei. They're what's made it a strong congregation for decades, AND, as far as I'm concerned, these super strengths are and will continue into the future.

When any new pastorate begins, there's a bit of unease throughout the congregation because that relationship is so central to everything. That's why pastors try not to change much during that first year. Believe me, there are many things that I might have wanted to change in the last 12 months which I didn't because I wanted as much stability as possible. Congregational life has also been affected by the many updates and much needed improvements on our physical space that have begun and are continuing. Also, because we're SO tired of Covid we inevitably ignore its conscious and unconscious impact of instability and change. So given all of this, that last year has been amazingly steady.

Part of the reason I was called here was because I'm a pastor that's given to stability. It's something I value in my ministry. I'm not trying to rediscover the Christian Church's proverbial wheel. I want to be part of a venerable 2000-year tradition of the Gospel. That being said, at the same time that the church is eternal and its message unchanging, it is simultaneously evolving and growing. In fact, if it doesn't grow and change it dies. All of this is due to God's action on the church. In John 15 Jesus says, 'I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine-grower. <sup>2</sup> He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit." We are a living vine that God is making more fruitful while at the same time he trims back parts that are less fruitful.

As we move now into the future, the Council and I are very busy dreaming about what Gloria Dei could become. We're looking for the guidance and creativity of the Holy Spirit. I invite you to join us in this prayer. Pray for me. Pray for the Council. Pray that we all might be responsive to the urgings of the Spirit. May those good gifts of God continue here strongly. May those new gifts which God wants to bestow, may we be open to them and receive them with joy.

# **School Supplies Needed for Leesburg Kids**

Do you ever feel that you can't make a difference in the scheme of things? Here's your chance to make a difference to "that one", if you remember the starfish story...

It's time to collect school supplies for Leesburg Elementary and Oak Park Middle School. Our liaisons at each school have provided lists of supplies for each school. Social Ministries Committee will have a drop site for each school in the Fellowship Hall during July. As you are shopping, stop and pick up items to donate. If you don't have time to shop, consider ordering on Amazon, Target or Walmart and having the supplies delivered to the church. It only takes a few minutes and a few dollars to make a huge difference in the lives of these little ones.

Leesburg Elementary is also collecting clothing and shoes for the homeless kids. Remember that first day of school, with your newly-sharpened pencils and your new outfit? Imagine that you have no shoes or underwear. This is a big need for these kids. Backpacks are needed as well and are fun to shop for.

Here's the list for Oak Park Middle School: spiral notebooks, pencils, index cards, ear buds.

For Leesburg Elementary: Anything Crayola (Crayons, colored pencils, erasable markers), small box of tissues, #2 pencils (no other size for these little hands), composition notebooks, spiral notebooks WIDE RULE ONLY, gallon and quart size bags, pink erasers, EXPO brand dry erase markers (no other brand), WIDE RULE paper, back packs of any kind for boys and girls, folders with prongs and pockets (must have prongs inside), scissors.

For the homeless kids: clothing (sizes 6-18 boys or girls), shoes (kids size 11 -adult size  $9 \frac{1}{2}$ ), socks, underwear. The biggest need is shoes.

Leesburg Elementary adds: "We can use whatever we can get. Thank you so much."

Social Ministries Committee is dedicated to helping our Leesburg school kids. We appreciate every item you can donate to make "Back to School" easier and more fun.

# 2022 First Impressions Task Force Report Meeting Wednesday, June 08, 2022, at 1 PM

In Attendance: Kathleen Birdsall, Pat Bressler, Arlene Kelly, Crystal Kirkpatrick and Linda Steege, Pastor Barnett & Elizabeth Sanguedolce were out of town.

- 1. Arlene delivered a word of prayer for team guidance
- 2. Council has given the First Impressions Task Force the go-ahead and approval of the following work to be done in the Gathering Hall. The items below are the bare basics that will be completed by September.
  - Replacement and installation of more efficient and improved lighting and fans
  - Painting ceiling and walls in main room, hall, vestry, and restrooms
  - Carpet will be replacement with carpet tiles
- 3. We still haven't found a carpenter to repurpose the extra pews that sit in this space. As that was not part of the approval from council at this time, we still have time to find someone.
- 4. We have a doner who will contribute the labor, material and equipment for a small media center which will take the place of sign-up sheets and brochures that are now tacked on the walls. This was on the wish list and will be put into motion when all the basic needs list is completed.
- 5. The sacristy cabinet is now moved and has a new countertop doing double duty as a buffet table. The painting crew will put a new coat of paint and new hardware and we will have accomplished a first step in the makeover.
- 6. Arlene brought up the idea of a cross wall where a members can participate and be a part of this project. We will discuss this idea in the future to clearly define the guidelines for this visual in the gathering hall.
- 7. The task force will be still looking at options on accessories to complete the project upgrade.

- VII. Pastor's Report Pastor Barnett distributed his report prior to the meeting. Pastor Madson did some work for the congregation prior to Pastor Barnett's arrival regarding congregational conflict. This report will be republished.

#### VIII. Unfinished Business -

- A. Council Retreat Update Bill reported that the retreat was a great success. He proposes a similar one-day retreat for the entire congregation on a Saturday in October at church, to include a catered lunch.
- B. Space Allocation Study Bill read his letter to the quilters and will send it out.
- C. Bars on Pastor's Windows The contractor, Belew's Welding, is waiting on materials. The project is expected to be completed within the next few weeks.

- D. Roof Repair Bill reported that he and Craig met with ACRI Roofing. They inspected the roof and found the same problems that Eustis Roofing found. They declined to provide an estimate for the repairs as they are not metal roof contractors. Bill will contact other roofers for inspection and estimates.
- E. Covid Update Bill reported that cases and hospitalizations have been rising. The filters in the sanctuary are changed every six (6) months.
- F. Financial Advisor Pastor reported that Synod has referred us to Scott Pinkerton of FourThought Private Wealth. They have a division that works with non-profits, including a number of churches.
- G. Web Master We are still working on hiring a new web master.
- H. Evangelism Bill reported that this committee is meeting twice monthly. Since the Strategic Planning Committee's (led by Forest Berg) has been completed, Bill moved to have this work continued by the Evangelism Committee, second by Linda Steege. Motion carried. Arlene reported that she has given all her files from the Strategic Planning Committee to Nancy Vogel for the Evangelism Committee
- I. Disaster Preparedness Pastor has reached out to Rabbi Karen Allen from Congregation Beth Shalom in Leesburg regarding Active Shooter preparation. Dianne Marcotte reported that she is working on Disaster Preparedness (response for disasters, hurricanes, medical, fires, active shooter) for Gloria Dei. Dianne will give a temple talk to the congregation. Craig is also working with local law enforcement on active shooter response.
- J. First Impression Task Force Bill reported that the task force would like to begin the work on the electrical, painting, and carpeting. The total cost for these projects is approximately \$35,000. Linda Hide reported that there is over \$400,000 in the estate gifts accounts (discretionary spending) and it is not necessary to go to the congregation to request these funds. We still need to explain to the congregation where these funds are coming from. A motion to proceed with the task force's projects by Diane, second by Linda Riikonen. Motion carried. A letter will be sent to the task force informing them of this decision. The task force is also requested to prepare a status report for the congregation.

- K. Guest Cards Pastor will have these cards prepared and put in the pew racks. Crystal will work with Mary Beth on this.
- L. Synod Assembly Pastor reported that no one has volunteered to attend the assembly as voting members. Pastor will attend alone.

#### IX. New Business -

- A. Stewardship 12-Month Plan Arlene and Linda Riikonen will work with Gail Madson to hold monthly Temple Talks.
- B. Member Recognition Dick Healy made a proposal to honor Crystal and Byron Kirkpatrick for their many years of faithful service to Gloria Dei. Dick suggested a certificate of appreciation. After some discussion, it was decided to table this until our June meeting.
- C. Members Leaving Congregation There was some discussion regarding members leaving because the services are "too catholic". Members need to discuss this with Pastor Barnett.
- D. Discharge of Paityn Miller Linda Hide reported that she has composed a letter to Paityn. A motion to discharge Paityn by Crystal, second by Arlene. **Motion carried**. Linda will send the letter to Paityn.
- E. Robo Calls (Added after Agenda Approval) Bill proposed this to communicate to members who do not have e-mail.

- D. Treasurer Linda Hide emailed the financials prior to the meeting. She reported that expenditures are up slightly due to outreach, camperships, new copier and insurance premium increase. The investments in the stock market are unpredictable at this time. Giving is still slightly lower than normal.

Craig reported that he would like to clean out the closets in the narthex. He is also working on estimates for the leaking gutters. Craig reported that a new water main is being installed on Lone Oak Lane.

#### **Healthy Responses to Disagreements and Conflicts**

As disciples of Jesus, we embrace the following:

Five keys to healthy response to disagreements are: (based on Matthew 18:15-17)

- 1. We speak to each other, not about each other behind their backs.
- 2. If someone complains to you about another person, we ask them to speak to the person first and tell them it is so important that you follow up in a week to see how the conversation went.
- 3. We don't respond to anonymous comments or letters.
- 4. We don't carry other people's mail. Ask, "What would you like me to do with your comment? You can come to council/meeting yourself or I can bring your comment with your name attached."
- 5. We explain each other's actions in the best possible light. We check with the person quoted or referred to for accuracy before we repeat the comment. (Luther's explanation to 8<sup>th</sup> Commandment) Disagreements happen in any organization, including churches. Using healthy responses can stop the disagreement from spreading and engulfing the whole organization.

Thank you for practicing healthy responses and encouraging others to do the same.
