Did you know that every day you pray about politics? Or at least you should. You might not think you do, but if you pray the Lord's Prayer every day (and the assumption of the Catechism is that you would: in the morning, with meals, in the evening, etc.) you are praying about politics. The Second Petition says, "Thy kingdom come." A kingdom is a political realm. Jesus does say that it is not "of" this world, but that doesn't make it any less political. A "kingdom" is by definition political. We're to desire and pray for God's will in ALL of life, in all of the world. In our situation, as citizens of these United States, that means, that we take our faith into the ballot booth this coming month.

As a newcomer to Florida, I find voting to be intimidating. I haven't been here long. I don't know the politicians. I haven't gotten a feel for how things go here. Consequently, when I look at the ballot, I honestly feel intimidated. Unless you're a person that votes merely by party affiliation – and I assume that some of us do that – for some offices it can end up being "Eeny, Meeny, Miny, Moe." Even when I research some candidates and their positions, there's always some people I vote for just on the luck of the draw.

Does anyone actually pray in the voting booth? It certainly wouldn't hurt. I think I'm going to try to pray the Second Petition this time. "Thy Kingdom Come." I'll probably throw in a few "Lord, have mercies" for good measure.

Luther teaches us that "God's kingdom comes on its own without our prayer, but we ask in this prayer that it may also come to us." I might add, I hope not heretically, that in the prayer we would ask that God's kingdom might come through us as well. May God in his providence bless us as we continue to pray and vote for godly government.

Council Corner for November 2022 By William Birdsall, Council president

Gloria Dei Council has continued to meet monthly as has the Executive Committee. The Council's work is ongoing and the improvements we implemented are obvious, especially in the gathering hall. The work will continue in Pastor's and Mary Beth's new offices through the end of the year as well as the new activities room for the Quilters downstairs.

I am pleased to report that the third stained glass window for Pastor's new office is near completion and should be installed before Thanksgiving. It was a surprise that Great Lakes Carpets & Tile donated the material and labor for the floor in Pastor's new office. A new area rug has been purchased for Pastor's office as well as bookcases and a used desk to compliment the new room. New LED lighting will be installed to replace the old lighting to complete his office.

Work will then begin to repurpose Pastor's old office into much needed storage space for the church which will help keep the clutter from accumulating around the building as well as provide temporary storage for the Quilters while their present room is reconfigured for Mary Beth's office.

The council is working on the 2023 Operating Budget with an eye on making cuts where necessary to avoid an increase in the next year. Since the church is not receiving the levels of giving that were anticipated, cuts and reductions will be necessary in 2023.

The congregation retreat was a very well-prepared program and the twenty-seven people who attended indicated that they were pleased with the presentation. It was a learning experience for all the attendees. The council looks forward to doing more retreats in the future as we deal with our drops in membership, giving and participation.

If you have not noticed, a recycling bin has been placed near the kitchen serving area so please dispose of your plastics and paper in the bin. Please no paper plates or coffee cups.

The Fall Car Show will be held on November 5th at Gloria Dei Church to help benefit JHIFM and our Evangelism. Please sign up in the Fellowship Hall as we still need volunteers.

We will be working on a new directory for 2023 as many members have either left the church or passed as well as new members have joined which are not listed in the present directory. This work will be done in house by volunteers and staff. Please let Mary Beth know if you would like to help.

Lastly, we will be holding another Gloria Dei Yard Sale in the parking lot on December 3rd, so start to gather up those unwanted items and participate in this fun activity.

Minutes of the Gloria Dei Congregation Council

Tuesday, 4 October 2022, 2:00 pm

We opened with a Eucharistic service by Pastor Barnett.

- I. Call to Order NOTE: This meeting was rescheduled from 29 September due to Hurricane Ian. The meeting was called to order at 2:27 pm by President Bill Birdsall.
- II. **Roll Call:** <u>Present</u>: Pastor Edward Barnett, Bill Birdsall, Craig Carlson, Linda Hide, Arlene Kelly, Crystal Kirkpatrick, Linda Riikonen (excused), Linda Steege, Loraine VanHaecke, Diane Wasser
- III. **Promise** The Covenant Promise was recited by the Council.
- IV. **Adoption of Agenda** The agenda was reviewed. Motion to accept the agenda by Craig, second by Loraine. **Motion carried.**
- V. **Approval of Minutes of Previous Meeting** Minutes of the 25 August 2022 meeting were reviewed. Motion to accept the minutes by Arlene, second by Crystal. **Motion carried**.
- VI. **Correspondence** Linda Hide reported that our custodian, Tina is requesting a \$15/week increase in salary.
- VII. Pastor's Report Pastor Barnett distributed his report prior to the meeting.
 - Pastor reported that Consecration Sunday will be rescheduled to 19 February 2023. This is necessary to promote good stewardship formation in the congregation. We must push forward with stewardship when we have budgetary issues.
 - Pastor is requesting council members to target members to volunteer for a ministry/activity.

VIII. Unfinished Business –

A. Update on First Impressions Task Force and Funding for Next Phase – Kathleen emailed the report prior to this meeting. Bill reported that the fellowship hall is complete. Bill will invite the board members of JHIFM to a special council meeting to discuss future renovations. Bill requested we allocate \$2,500 to complete the vestry/pastor's study. Motion to allocate \$2,500 for vestry/pastor's study by Loraine, second by Linda Steege.

Motion carried.

- B. Covid Update Bill reported that Covid cases have decreased to a 13% positivity rate.
- C. Financial Advisor Bill reported this is still on the table.
- D. Web Master Pastor and Bill will schedule a meeting with the candidate.
- E. Evangelism Pastor reported that the committee is working on continuing resolutions and prayer concerns.
- F. Disaster Preparedness Bill Reported that Dianne Marcotte is continuing work on the plan.
- G. Congregation Retreat The retreat will be held on Saturday, 15 October at Gloria Dei. Pastor Eberhardt will facilitate; coffee and donuts for breakfast; Publix sandwiches for lunch. Crystal will contact Janet Braun to arrange for food for the retreat. Mary Beth will send email notice to members asking for responses for attendance.
- H. Chamber of Commerce Pastor and Bill will attend a meeting.
- I. New Directory Mary Beth will look into self-publishing a new directory.
- J. Roof Update McHale has completed the roof repairs.

IX. New Business -

- A. Portico Increases for 2023 Linda Hide reported that there are small increases to the pension accounts for 2023. She requested the council approve the gold plan for Pastor and Mary Beth. Motion to approve gold plan by Bill, second by Crystal. **Motion carried.**
- B. Recycling Crystal reported that she and Byron purchased new recycling cans. They will be responsible for taking the cans to the recycling center.
- C. Election of Council Members and Officer Positions Bill reported he will remain on council, but no longer serve as president as of next year. Craig reported he will remain on council if we are unable to recruit someone to fill his position. Linda Steege, Bill, Linda Hide, Arlene, and Craig are up for reelection in 2023; Crystal and Loraine are up for re-election in 2024; Linda Riikonen and Diane are up for re-election in 2025.

D. Mutual Ministry – Executive Committee reviews were completed.

- A. Pastor Pastor Barnett reported on numerous items throughout the meeting as noted in the minutes, as well as distributing his report prior to the meeting.

- D. Treasurer Linda Hide emailed the financials prior to the meeting. She reported that giving and attendance are increasing.
 - Linda suggested a salary increase of \$15/week for custodian, Tina. Tina has had no increase for four (4) years. Motion to increase Tina's salary by \$15/week by Bill, second by Craig. **Motion carried.**
 - Bill suggested a salary increase for Bob Keim for lawn mowing and building maintenance. Bob is currently receiving \$40/week for lawn mowing and \$200/month for building maintenance and charges only for the weeks he works. Motion to increase Bob's salary to \$50/week for lawn mowing and \$225/month for building maintenance by Craig, second by Loraine. **Motion carried.**

The first impressions task force would like your help with a project for our updated fellowship hall.

We are looking to make a collage designed wall of crosses and crucifixes. We would like each family to donate one or more special cross or crucifix of their choice to be mounted on this wall.

The cross should be in good condition, as it will be on long term display.

The dimensions of the cross should be approximately 12" tall and 9" wide. It should be able to just about fit on a standard sheet of paper, however we are looking for various sizes and would consider larger crosses (or smaller) if they would fit into the overall artistic design. If we receive a very large number of crosses we may not be able to use them all and if that is the case, we would return any unused crosses to the donated family.

Please designate your cross with your family name and year you joined Gloria Dei on the back of the cross. Also, please make sure that there is a way to hang your cross, preferably on the back of it.

LIVE FOR THE LORD - Follow

Love one another - Set example – show others how to live

As a developing disciple of Jesus Christ and a member of the Gloria Dei Faith Community, we continually, actively, and intentionally live our lives for the Lord by loving one another and by setting the example for others in the world of how to live in that love through the following commitments.

Healthy responses to disagreements and conflicts

As disciples of Jesus, we embrace the following:

Five keys to healthy response to disagreements are: (based on Matthew 18:15-17)

- 1. We speak to each other, not about each other behind their backs.
- 2. If someone complains to you about another person, we ask them to speak to the person first and tell them it is so important that you will follow up in a week to see how the conversation went.
 - 3. We don't respond to anonymous comments or letters.
- 4. We don't carry other people's mail. Ask, "What would you like me to do with your comment? You can come to council/meeting yourself or I can bring your comment with your name attached."
- 5. We explain each other's actions in the best possible light. We check with the person quoted or referred to for accuracy before we repeat the comment. (Luther's explanation to 8^{th} Commandment)

Disagreements happen in any organization, including churches. Using healthy responses can stop the disagreement from spreading and engulfing the whole organization.

Thank you for practicing healthy responses and encouraging others to do the same.

Halloween is not a pre-Christian holiday, or a "day of the devil"

- 1. People claim that Halloween came from a pagan Irish festival of the dead called Samhain. But that claim did not appear until the mid-20th century, and there are no records of the celebration of Samhain until the 10th century, almost 600 years after the coming of Christianity to Ireland. Even then, Samhain was a seasonal festival, the end of the harvest and beginning of winter. There ARE records of Irish Christians celebrating All Saints Day in 843 AD, however.
- 2. Halloween is based on All Saint's Day, not the other way around. Everything you read about October 31 being the time when ancient Celts believed the spirits walk the earth and must be placated with food or they will play tricks, and the living must dress up in disguise to fool the evil spirits--none of it is true. There is no primary-source evidence for it, and plenty that shows that this was something made up in the 20th century. There were indeed ancient Celtic festivals of the dead/spirits but they were not near the day we know as Halloween.
- 3. It is also not true that the Church tried to take over this supposedly-popular ancient Irish holiday of Samhain and "Christianize" it, stealing it from the non-Christian Irish. Pope Gregory III moved Hallowmas (what we know as All Saints' Day) to November 1st in the *8th century*, when leaders in Rome did not care one bit what the backwater Irish were doing. Before that, All Saints had been celebrated in May, and had been celebrated since the 2nd century. Keeping in mind calendar changes (Julian to Gregorian) and the fact that Samhain was a lunar festival, not solar--there is no evidence to support the fixed date of October 31 as being anything other than the Eve of All Hallows, shortened to "Hallow E'en."
- 4. Halloween is great fun--one of my absolute favorite holidays!-- but the traditions and backstory we associate with it are both modern and Anglo-American, not the 20th century inventions of ancient pagan roots portrayed in the media and popular culture. Don't believe everything you watch on the "History" Channel: Halloween is a child of the Church.
- 5. Christians should absolutely be free to observe Halloween, and All Saints Day (November 1) and All Souls Day (November 2) as a time to give thanks for the saints, and for all our beloved dead, and to tweak the nose of Satan, too, knowing that no matter what beasties and creepy clowns and ghosts may be lurking in the dark night, Christ always has the final victory over the devil, and death has no power over us ever again!
