Just wanted to take a moment to thank the 45 dedicated volunteers who turned out early on July 8 to help distribute 9,252 pounds of nutritious food to 506 individuals from 146 needy families. Great job hunger heroes! And in case you haven't noticed how inflation and logistical disruptions have impacted our local economy let me point out that the number of individuals that we served today increased nearly 62% over July 2021. # Council Corner for September 2022 By William Birdsall, Council president

The Gloria Dei Church Council has continued to meet monthly during the summer as has the Executive Committee, however the Executive Committee did not meet in August because of various vacation conflicts. The Council's work has continued during the summer and certain things we implemented, have and are taking place around the Church.

As you may have noticed, the first of three new stained-glass windows has been installed in the Fellowship Hall. The second window is now 60 percent complete with completion and installation slated for the end of September. Electrical upgrades including new lighting and fans have been installed in the fellowship hall as well, which now provide much better lighting and air circulation. Also, the old and unused windows which looked into the storage closet have been filled in and are ready for painting. Our painting contractor is scheduled to start the painting on August 29th with completion in 10 days. Then the new carpet will be installed soon after that.

The church roof has been a concern over the last three years, not because of its age but the need for minor repairs and required maintenance. After more than two years searching for a qualified contractor and a reasonable price, the Council finally awarded a contract this week to have that work done.

I'm sure you have noticed the police presence over the last month at our Sunday services. The Council gave this issue a lot of thought and discussion and felt that with all the shootings going on it was best to provide our congregation the protection of a police officer on Sunday mornings.

There are many things in the works at Gloria Dei which will help keep your calendars full. One I can share with you will be the fall Car show on November 5th which this year will include Bingo, a Bake sale and a food drive all on the same day. JHIFM will be participating and benefiting from the proceeds as well as cooking those great hot dogs again. More information will be forthcoming on other activities and events so stay tuned.

  - Painting: Productive Painting LLC, is starting work August 29

When the time comes an announcement will be made and the guidelines will be in the bulletin inviting members of the congregation to participate in this project for the gathering space.
- 5. We will do research on trash receptacles that will fit in to the new décor of the area.

# Minutes of the Gloria Dei Congregation Council

Tuesday, 19 July 2022, 10:00 am

We opened with a Eucharistic service by Pastor Barnett.

- I. **Call to Order** The meeting was called to order at 10:45 am by President Bill Birdsall.
- II. **Roll Call:** <u>Present</u>: Pastor Edward Barnett, Bill Birdsall, Craig Carlson, Linda Hide, Arlene Kelly, Crystal Kirkpatrick (excused), Linda Riikonen, Linda Steege, Loraine VanHaecke (excused), Diane Wasser
- III. **Promise** The Covenant Promise was recited by the Council.
- IV. Adoption of Agenda The agenda was reviewed and revised to add Item D under New Business – Dates. Motion to accept the revised agenda by Arlene, second by Craig. Motion carried.
- V. **Approval of Minutes of Previous Meeting** Minutes of the 26 May 2022 meeting were reviewed and item VIII-O was revised to correct the date for the Congregation Retreat to 15 October. Motion to accept the minutes by Arlene, second by Craig. **Motion carried**.
- VI. **Correspondence** Nothing to report.
- VII. **Pastor's Report** Pastor Barnett distributed his report prior to the meeting.
  - Pastor will continue the one-on-one meetings.
  - Pastor will continue the town hall meetings in fall.
  - Pastor is looking for volunteers to lead the bible studies.
  - Mutual ministry review will work on staff reviews.
  - Pastor will contact Pastor Eberhardt to facilitate the congregation retreat in October.
  - How do we discern the will of God? A lengthy discussion was held on this subject. Some comments follow: People won't speak up because they think it's a waste of time; People don't like change; council does what they believe is best for Gloria Dei; There will always be a level of conflict; We need to have healthy conflict.

#### VIII. Unfinished Business –

- A. Space Allocation Study Bill reported that people have given positive responses on work completed.
- B. Roof Repair Bill reported that he is still waiting on a quote from McHale Roofing. Linda Steege will contact the roofer.
- C. Covid Update Since some members have voiced concern regarding Pastor drinking from same chalice as congregation, Pastor has begun drinking from the consecrated chalice and congregation will dip their wafer in the communal chalice.
- D. Financial Advisor Pastor will participate in zoom meetings to discuss options and will assemble a team.
- E. Web Master and Tech Support Bill has contact in Ocala he will interview. Linda Hide said the team that has been trained by Irv & Sue is ready to fill in when necessary.
- F. Evangelism Pastor reported that Pastor Vogel is reviewing job descriptions, continuing resolutions, and use of technology.
- G. Disaster Preparedness Pastor reported that he spoken to Rabbi Solomon from Mt. Dora. It's been reported that the homeless are using the benches in front of the church, and drug deals have also been witnessed. The police officer suggested the benches be removed. Crystal will have the benches removed.

#### Healthy responses to disagreements and conflicts

As disciples of Jesus, we embrace the following:

Five keys to healthy response to disagreements are: (based on Matthew 18:15-17)

- 1. We speak to each other, not about each other behind their backs.
- 2. If someone complains to you about another person, we ask them to speak to the person first and tell them it is so important that you will follow up in a week to see how the conversation went.
  - 3. We don't respond to anonymous comments or letters.
- 4. We don't carry other people's mail. Ask, "What would you like me to do with your comment? You can come to council/meeting yourself or I can bring your comment with your name attached."
- 5. We explain each other's actions in the best possible light. We check with the person quoted or referred to for accuracy before we repeat the comment. (Luther's explanation to  $8^{th}$  Commandment)

Disagreements happen in any organization, including churches. Using healthy responses can stop the disagreement from spreading and engulfing the whole organization.

Thank you for practicing healthy responses and encouraging others to do the same.
