One thing that always fascinates me, is how the Passion of our Lord is so central to our Christian faith. That's the story of how our Lord came to Jerusalem, instituted the Lord's Supper, was betrayed, crucified, died and buried. While at the same time, ironically, it really only appears once a year during Holy Week. Otherwise, we don't really hear it in corporate worship. Even its aftermath, the resurrection and the Easter story gets a whole fifty days – seven entire Sundays, even eight if you include the Pentecost conclusion. The rest of the year is essentially the rest of the story that surrounds the Passion. But the Passion IS central. You can't have Easter without the Passion. You can't have anything else without the Passion. One entire Gospel, that of St. Mark, has been described as the Passion with a long introduction.

Why is that? I'm not sure. I've never heard or read anything about people conjecturing about it. It has, however, been a curiosity to me. Perhaps, it's because the Passion is SO horrific. The death of God! Talk about fear, revulsion and shock! Maybe we can only bear to hear it out once a year.

Regardless, it is appointed once a year and we NEED to hear and experience it once a year. No matter how bad we imagine things to be, no matter what we might be going through – illness, grief, tragedy – the Passion puts everything in perspective. The entirety of our lives, the rest of the Gospel story, even Easter itself has no central meaning without the mystery of what God did for us in the Passion.

Holy Week is gory. Holy Week is painful. We need that gore and pain though: to liberate us from the chains that bind us, to open to us the depth of God's love.

Now when the centurion and those with him, who were keeping watch over Jesus, saw the earthquake and what took place, they were terrified and said, 'Truly this man was God's Son!'

Matthew 27.54

A blessed Holy Week and joyful Easter to us all!

Saint of the Month St. Anselm of Canterbury - April 21

Anselm of Canterbury Born in Italy in 1033, Anselm is most closely associated with England, where he served as Archbishop of Canterbury for many years. A brilliant scholar and writer, Anselm used his political skills with the British kings on behalf of the established Christian church, affirming that it is the leadership of the church and not the state which has the responsibility of establishing structure and maintaining order among the clergy. Anselm is especially remembered for his classic book, Why God Became Man, which taught that the reason for the incarnation was that Jesus, the Son of God, would suffer and die in place of sinners.

more vulnerable to things that threaten their spiritual vitality. However, those who are intentionally reflective, prayerful, and attentively responsive are like cultivated vines... Our lives will produce an abundance of fruit for the glory of God." - from "Crafting a Rule of Life" by Stephen Macchia.

LIVE FOR THE LORD - Follow

Love one another - Set example – show others how to live

As a developing disciple of Jesus Christ and a member of the Gloria Dei Faith Community, we continually, actively, and intentionally live our lives for the Lord by loving one another and by setting the example for others in the world of how to live in that love through the following commitments.

PRAY

We pray intentionally, daily setting aside a time and space.

We pray continually, aware of our deep need for the promise of God's continuing presence with us. We offer prayers of:

ADORATION, CONFESSION, THANKSGIVING, SUPPLICATION

WORSHIP

We worship God regularly in love.

We worship God individually and communally, joyfully participating with others in singing, praying, touching, listening, sharing, and communing at the Lord's Table.

BUILD RELATIONSHIPS

We intentionally welcome others and continually build relationships by: spending time together, listening without judgment, understanding without agreement; and always forgiving one another.

STUDY

We intentionally and continually read Scripture for faithful understanding through sharing with others by thinking, discussing, believing, and applying Jesus' teachings to our daily lives.

CONTRIBUTE /SERVE

We serve our Lord continually, intentionally, regularly, actively – seeking the passion God instills in each of us towards the least by contributing our time (volunteering, helping, serving), our talents (gifts and skills), and our treasure (our financial possessions.)

Healthy responses to disagreements and conflicts

As disciples of Jesus, we embrace the following:

Five keys to healthy response to disagreements are: (based on Matthew 18:15-17)

- 1. We speak to each other, not about each other behind their backs.
- 2. If someone complains to you about another person, we ask them to speak to the person first and tell them it is so important that you will follow up in a week to see how the conversation went.
 - 3. We don't respond to anonymous comments or letters.
- 4. We don't carry other people's mail. Ask, "What would you like me to do with your comment? You can come to council/meeting yourself or I can bring your comment with your name attached."
- 5. We explain each other's actions in the best possible light. We check with the person quoted or referred to for accuracy before we repeat the comment. (Luther's explanation to 8^{th} Commandment)

Disagreements happen in any organization, including churches. Using healthy responses can stop the disagreement from spreading and engulfing the whole organization.

Thank you for practicing healthy responses and encouraging others to do the same.
