Luther said the church is a "mouth house." By this he was alluding to the ministry of the Word, i.e., preaching, reading scripture and singing in worship. Beyond that though, our life as a parish church, a communion, a family of friends requires communication. From the time of services, to people in need of prayer, to even when the WELCA Circles meet, it all requires communication. We even have a Communication/Technology Group at Gloria Dei. One of the cardinal principles of communication is: direct is best. You don't want to have too many detours from the initiation of a message to its reception. In other words, if you've scheduled a choir rehearsal, it's most efficient and best to get that message straight to the choir members, rather than going up the Quilters meeting and telling them, "There's a special Choir rehearsal on Thursday morning. Pass that along, won't you?"

Before any of our programmatic communication, in the Christian Congregation (that would most certainly be our dear Gloria Dei), interpersonal communication is essential. One of the basic forms of communication is conversation. Conversation is necessary. It gives us an ability to relate to others, share with others, and for ourselves to be known by others. It can be a source of pure joy; however, it's not morally neutral, our conversations can also be bad. James 3.10 warns us, "From the same mouth come blessing and cursing." What then is the difference, how are we to discern between blessing and cursing, sharing and gossip? The first things to ask yourself, "am I communicating or gossiping? Am I blessing or cursing? Is what I'm thinking about good or bad, freeing or restraining, does it come from anger or love?" Where's the emotional energy for it?

Secondarily, it's always good to remember the principle of "direct is best." Occasionally we republish a sheet adopted and reaffirmed by the Council that's based around Matthew 18. Verse 15 tells us: "If another member of the church sins against you, go and point out the fault when the two of you are alone. If the member listens to you, you have regained that one."

And finally, God's Commandments provide an excellent guide for us. Luther explains the 8th Commandment this way: "You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. *What does this mean?* We are to fear and love God, so that we do not tell lies about our neighbors, betray or slander them, or destroy their reputations. Instead we are to come to their defense, speak well of them, and interpret everything they do in the best possible light." I like the old translation where it says to "put the best construction on our neighbors' words and actions." Go to the good and away from the bad.

I want conversation and communication to flourish. It is the gift of God and the means by which our congregational family is connected and strengthened. Let us join in fervent prayer that God might be glorified in our speech!

Saints of the month: Sr Elisabeth Fedde & Sr Emma Francis

These two are special to me for two reasons: one, they're US Lutheran saints, and two, they both ministered in Metropolitan New York.

Sr Elisabeth Fedde was born in Vest-Agder, Norway in 1850. She trained as a deaconess at the Mother House in Christiana (now known as Oslo). Fedde spent much of her early ministerial career Norway's newest and northernmost <u>diocese</u> of Tromsø. She worked there for awhile until challenged by her brother-in-law to set up a ministry in New York City for Norwegian seaman. In the course her time there not only did she minister selflessly to the Scandinavian immigrants, she also established a Deaconess House and a nine-bed hospital which eventually became Lutheran Medical Center. For a while, Pr William Passavant of Pittsburgh tried to recruit her to come there and work in his hospital. She later moved to Minneapolis, establishing a Mother House and opening another hospital. Her work also led to the opening of Lutheran Medical in Chicago.

Eventually, exhausted by her thirteen years working in America, Sister Elisabeth returned to Norway in November 1895. She died on 25 February 1921.

Sr Emma Francis was the first black deaconess to serve in North America and the first deaconess from the West Indies. She did a similar ministry to Fedde's, but amongst the Caribbean immigrants in Manhattan. Her work involved the establishment of one of Black Lutheranism's historic churches, Transfiguration, Harlem.

Council Corner for February 2023 By William Birdsall, Council president

The Gloria Dei Council met in January as did the Executive committee. The Council was successful in negotiating a new agreement with Comcast to provide internet phone service at a lower cost than our present carrier affording considerable yearly savings. This was approved at the council meeting. With these savings and some other minor changes, the Council approved the 2023 Mission spending Plan in the amount of \$287,085.01. However, the plan also includes an increase in insurance costs of \$10,118.00. At this time this is an estimated increase, and many factors could cause that to change.

As was discussed in the last Glorian article, the insurer is dropping wind and hail damage coverage and at this time we have no idea if we will be able to find that coverage or what the costs might be. We are waiting for Church Mutual our present carrier to respond regarding our insurance issues. We will also look for other alternatives.

Work is starting in the Quilters room to transform it into our administrative office. 90 percent of the Quilters supplies have been relocated into the new storeroom on the lower level and work has begun on demolition of the existing cabinetry. After the blessing of the Quilts on February 5th the remainder of the supplies will be relocated, and demolition completed. New flooring will be installed, the walls painted, new cabinetry installed along with electrical and telephone modifications. This phase of the project is anticipated to be completed by mid March. Work will then begin on the lower-level activities room.

Work is under way promoting the Saints and Sinner spring car show to be held on March 4th here at the church. This show is organized and run by the Evangelism committee, but there are several opportunities for church committees to raise money including the Pancake breakfast, Bingo and quilt raffle(quilters). JHIFM usually provides the hotdog lunch which has become a well known among the car enthusiasts. Let's do the same with our pancake breakfast!

Pastor and I will continue to attend the monthly Chamber of Commerce breakfast meetings to continue our efforts to make the community more aware of who Gloria Dei is and what we do. God Bless

Minutes of the Gloria Dei Congregation Council Thursday, 12 January 2023, 10:00 am

We opened with a Eucharistic service by Pastor Barnett.

- 1. **Call to Order** The meeting was called to order at 10:45 am by President, Bill Birdsall.
- 2. **Roll Call:** <u>Present</u>: Pastor Edward Barnett, Bill Birdsall, Craig Carlson, Linda Hide, Arlene Kelly, Crystal Kirkpatrick, Linda Riikonen (excused), Linda Steege, Loraine VanHaecke (excused), Diane Wasser
- 3. **Promise** The Covenant Promise was recited by the Council.
- 4. **Adoption of Agenda** The agenda was reviewed and revised to add item 9F Acrylic Box. Motion to accept the revised agenda by Craig, second by Crystal. **Motion carried.**
- 5. **Approval of Minutes of Previous Meeting** Minutes of the 15 December 2022 meeting were reviewed. Motion to accept the minutes by Arlene, second by Linda Steege. **Motion carried**.
- 6. **Correspondence** memo from Kathleen Birdsall regarding First Impressions Task Force; letter from Church Mutual regarding notice in change of policy terms; quote from Comcast regarding computer/phone service.
- 7. **Pastor's Report** Pastor Barnett distributed his report prior to the meeting.

- Letter of Call—Pastor handed out a copy of his Letter of Call. It was suggested that Pastor's report contain a list of things he accomplished during the month, i.e., number of hospital/homebound visits, sermons prepared, meetings attended, etc. Pastor Barnett indicated this is not something he has done in the past. After a lengthy discussion among Council members and Pastor, Pastor decided to address any issues during the one-on-one meetings with individual Council persons.

8. Unfinished Business –

- A. Update on Pastor's Office, electrical work and storeroom -
 - Bill reported the Pastor's new office has been completed. He also reported that Pastor's old office has been set up as a storage room. Bill has begun moving the quilters' supplies to the storage room; so far, he has moved 19 tubs.
 - Linda Hide reported she has received donations for shelving units.
- B. Final Review of 2023 Budget -
 - Linda reviewed the budget.
 - Linda indicated that the property insurance premium will probably double from 2022. Bill has been investigating alternatives to replace our current carrier, if necessary.
 - Linda reported that we will realize a \$4,800 annual savings by switching to Comcast for computer/phone service.

Motion to accept the 2023 budget by Bill, second by Crystal. **Motion** carried.

- C. New Candidates for Council Pastor reported he is in discussions with Dianne Marcotte and John Braun.
- D. Annual Meeting and Final Agenda, Annual Report Pastor submitted a draft agenda for this meeting. Bill submitted his Annual Report.
- E. Medical Awareness Presentation with Potluck Advent Health has agreed to make a presentation. Pastor will contact person from Advent Health to schedule a date.
- F. Men's Breakfast Pastor reported there will be a men's breakfast on 6 February at 10:30 at Perkins.
- G. Meeting with JHIFM Arlene will talk to Bob Glockler regarding this meeting.

- H. New Directory Linda Steege reported this project is underway. Linda and Bev Healy have taken 26 photos thus far.
- I. Sound System It's been reported that the system is now working properly.
- J. Steeple Craig reported that the steeple has been cleaned.

9. New Business -

- A. Insurance Update A letter was received from Church Mutual regarding a change in policy terms. The new policy will contain an exclusion for wind and hail damage. Linda Hide is waiting to hear from Church Mutual regarding new rates. Bill is working with a broker on other rates. The renewal date is 15 April 2023.
- B. Replace Current Telephone Carrier (Centrylink) with Comcast Linda reported she has received a quote from Comcast for computer/phone service for \$3,600/year. Arlene will look into the cost of purchasing three (3) new phones.
- C. First Impressions Task Force The Council received a memo from Kathleen Birdsall requesting direction and funds for the next steps for this task force. Bill will ask the task force for their suggestions for next projects. Arlene reported the cross wall will be completed in March.
- D. Freezer Repairs Bill reported that the freezer has been repaired.
- E. Saints and Sinners Car Show Bill reported the car show will be held on Saturday, 4 March 2023, along with a pancake breakfast, bingo, quilt raffle, and bake sale. JHIFM will also sell hot dogs. Bill will do a temple talk about the car show.
- F. Organizational Flow Chart Pastor handed out a sample flow chart. Bill nominated Arlene to work on updating this for Gloria Dei.

Consecration Sunday Is Coming

Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, such congregations see financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes.

Our congregation's finance committee has selected the *Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program* as a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship education emphasis this year.

Consecration Sunday is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. Instead of treating people like members of a social club who should pay dues, we will treat people like followers of Jesus Christ who want to give unselfishly as an act of discipleship. *Consecration Sunday* encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?"

During morning worship on Consecration Sunday, we are asking our attendees and members to make their financial commitments to our church's missionary, benevolent, and educational ministries in this community and around the world.

Every attendee and member who completes an *Estimate of Giving Card* does so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday. We urge people to attend who feel strongly opposed to completing a card. The procedure is done in such a way that no one feels personal embarrassment if he or she chooses not to fill out a card.

We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. During morning worship our guest leader will conduct a brief period of instruction and inspiration, climaxed by members making their commitments as a confidential act of worship.

We will encourage participation in Consecration Sunday events through the Consecration Sunday team and governing board members. Since we will make no follow-up visits to ask people to complete their cards, we will make every effort to inform, inspire, and commit everyone to attend Consecration Sunday worship.

LIVE FOR THE LORD - Follow

Love one another - Set example - show others how to live

As a developing disciple of Jesus Christ and a member of the Gloria Dei Faith Community, we continually, actively, and intentionally live our lives for the Lord by loving one another and by setting the example for others in the world of how to live in that love through the following commitments.

Healthy responses to disagreements and conflicts

As disciples of Jesus, we embrace the following:

Five keys to healthy response to disagreements are: (based on Matthew 18:15-17)

1. We speak to each other, not about each other behind their backs.

2. If someone complains to you about another person, we ask them to speak to the person first and tell them it is so important that you will follow up in a week to see how the conversation went.

3. We don't respond to anonymous comments or letters.

4. We don't carry other people's mail. Ask, "What would you like me to do with your comment? You can come to council/meeting yourself or I can bring your comment with your name attached."

5. We explain each other's actions in the best possible light. We check with the person quoted or referred to for accuracy before we repeat the comment. (Luther's explanation to 8th Commandment)

Disagreements happen in any organization, including churches. Using healthy responses can stop the disagreement from spreading and engulfing the whole organization.

Thank you for practicing healthy responses and encouraging others to do the same.
