Lutheran Saint(s) of the month

Saint of the Month: St John Christian Frederick Heyer

John Christian Frederick Heyer (July 10, 1793 - November 7, 1873) was the first <u>missionary</u> sent abroad by <u>Lutherans</u> in the <u>United States</u>. He founded the Guntur Mission in <u>Andhra Pradesh</u>, <u>India</u>. "Father Heyer" is commemorated as a missionary in the <u>Calendar of Saints</u> of the <u>Lutheran</u> <u>Church</u> on November 7.

Among of his many accomplishments...

- In 1829, he used his private funds, along with twenty two other stockholders (all Lutheran clergymen), to purchase the former Adams County Academy and form the Gettysburg Gymnasium, which would become <u>Gettysburg College</u> in 1832, at which time Heyer and his associates, through their private subscriptions, became the Patrons of Pennsylvania College at Gettysburg.^[5] Heyer was also elected to the first Board of Trustees, and was an occasional instructor at the Gymnasium.
- He was the first pastor of the First Evangelical Lutheran Church in <u>Pittsburgh</u>, established in 1837, which was the earliest Englishspeaking Lutheran congregation west of the <u>Allegheny Mountains</u>. He organized The First German Evangelical-Lutheran Congregation of Pittsburgh, a German-speaking congregation, one week later, on January 22, 1837. This parish was the mother of a great deal of Pittsburgh Lutheranism.

In his 80s(!) he famously told a gathering of the Ministerium that if no other people would volunteer to go to India, then he would. He did! Founding a great tradition of Lutheran churches in southern India. I have a good pastor friend in New York whose great grandfather was baptized by Fr Heyer in India. Recently my friend's daughter was ordained to the Holy Ministry as well. What a grand tradition. It all harkens back to congregations in this country that many of us know. What rich connections which span the globe.

To this day, the churches founded by Fr Heyer in India are strong and well. JOINING HANDS IN FOOD MINISTRY

On this beautiful early fall morning of October 13th over 40 dedicated volunteers from Gloria Dei Lutheran Church, First Presbyterian Church of Leesburg, and from around our local community gathered to distribute 12,136 pounds of nutritious food to 719 individuals from 203 local families. We were truly fortunate that the previously forecasted rain and high winds disappeared, and instead the sun broke through the clouds that dispersed in front of a mild breeze. Our smiling volunteers cheerfully filled grocery bags with pistachios, hazelnuts, beef stew, canned fruit and vegetables, fresh peaches, raspberries, caramel apples, rice, mac & cheese, milk, cereal, lentils, peanut butter, jelly, canned soups and chicken & dumplings. Vehicles were loaded with bag after bag of free groceries as they drove through Gloria Dei's parking lot approximately every 50 seconds. This morning, the Lake County Health Department was on hand to administer free Flu and Covid vaccines for those wishing to receive them. Joining Hands in Food Ministry (JHIFM) is a certified 501(c)(3) public charity and an authorized partner agency of Second Harvest Food Bank of Central Floria, and Farm Share.

Council Corner for November By Bill Birdsall

The Gloria Dei Council met in September as did the Executive Committee in October. At council we discussed the upcoming Healthcare Dinner, date not set yet, office dedication, the Web Page, a proposal by JHIFM to construct a new ramp into their shed, and the formation of a position for financial secretary.

It has been a while since I have written this article for the Glorian. In February I resigned my position as president to assume the position as treasurer after Linda Hide resigned from council and as treasurer. At that time Pastor Barnett took the president's position and decided that each council member would take a turn at writing the article. This month is my turn.

For me this has been a busy year for the council as we have been working on ways to bolster the size of our congregation as well as increasing participation of the members. We are encouraging new ideas for group activities as well as continue those activities that work well such as the pancake breakfast, potluck dinners, yard sales and the car show as well as faith related activities.

The council's vision of the relocation of the administration offices has been completed with minimal cost to the congregation and minimal effect on our budget. We thank those members who bore most of the costs of the project as well as the time and labor of a few volunteers.

The council has been closely monitoring the budget and particularly income and expenditures. We have been able to keep a lid on insurance increases and cut telephone costs as an example. But the reality is that we started the year knowing that our pledges do not meet our needs and therefore we are slowly spending more money than we take in. The church building does not maintain itself and there are doors to replace, rain gutters to replace, rotten wood trim and the need to paint. The financial committee will be meeting soon to discuss how we will meet these needs. None of this work can be done by volunteers.

In closing we feel confident that with the council commitments and guidance from the financial committee we will find solutions to meet these needs in the future. Peace

What does Year Round Stewardship program look like?

In 2024 Gloria Dei church will move into year round stewardship. Traditionally you may have heard the word Stewardship used in the Fall to explain the annual program of making and collecting pledges of money to be used in support of the church. That may have been the only time you thought about stewardship and the need for stewardship.

There are many examples of good stewardship in the stories of the bible. Stewardship and generosity are mentioned over 2,000 times in the bible. We are called to Steward all of what we have been given. In a year round program you will hear words like generosity, gratitude, accountability and responsibility. Most importantly you will hear stories. An important part of being good stewards is the telling of stories. That is how we learn, grow and express our faith through the telling of these stories.

Each month of the year will put a spot light on different types of stewardship and how we can be good stewards. The plan is to have a once-a-month temple talk. Don't worry only about three minutes long! There will be an article each month in the Glorion. There may be video's or music at some point in year. Please consider telling a story that you may know which contains stewardship words and actions. You can do this by speaking at temple talk or writing an article for Glorion.

LIVE FOR THE LORD - Follow

Love one another - Set example - show others how to live

As a developing disciple of Jesus Christ and a member of the Gloria Dei Faith Community, we continually, actively, and intentionally live our lives for the Lord by loving one another and by setting the example for others in the world of how to live in that love through the following commitments.

PRAY

We pray intentionally, daily setting aside a time and space.

We pray continually, aware of our deep need for the promise of God's continuing presence with us. We offer prayers of:

ADORATION, CONFESSION, THANKSGIVING, SUPPLICATION

WORSHIP

We worship God regularly in love.

We worship God individually and communally, joyfully participating with others in singing, praying, touching, listening, sharing, and communing at the Lord's Table.

BUILD RELATIONSHIPS

We intentionally welcome others and continually build relationships by: spending time together, listening without judgment, understanding without agreement; and always forgiving one another.

STUDY

We intentionally and continually read Scripture for faithful understanding through sharing with others by thinking, discussing, believing, and applying Jesus' teachings to our daily lives.

CONTRIBUTE /SERVE

We serve our Lord continually, intentionally, regularly, actively – seeking the passion God instills in each of us towards the least by contributing our time (volunteering, helping, serving), our talents (gifts and skills), and our treasure (our financial possessions.)

Healthy responses to disagreements and conflicts

As disciples of Jesus, we embrace the following:

Five keys to healthy response to disagreements are: (based on Matthew 18:15-17)

1. We speak to each other, not about each other behind their backs.

2. If someone complains to you about another person, we ask them to speak to the person first and tell them it is so important that you will follow up in a week to see how the conversation went.

3. We don't respond to anonymous comments or letters.

4. We don't carry other people's mail. Ask, "What would you like me to do with your comment? You can come to council/meeting yourself or I can bring your comment with your name attached."

5. We explain each other's actions in the best possible light. We check with the person quoted or referred to for accuracy before we repeat the comment. (Luther's explanation to 8th Commandment)

Disagreements happen in any organization, including churches. Using healthy responses can stop the disagreement from spreading and engulfing the whole organization.

Thank you for practicing healthy responses and encouraging others to do the same.
