One of the latest trends among pastors is podcasting. Some of you have even brought this up to me. However, given how difficult it is for me to be creative with my monthly Glorion article, I'm not anxious to try it. I must say however, that I listen to a few podcasts. Some of these tend to be political in nature. I don't share my political perspectives much. That's deliberate. But let it suffice to say that the political podcasts that I listen to are both on the left and the right. One of the reasons I so dislike politics is that it's all absolutized opinion. And if you know anything about history, politics flips and flops so much as to be pretty undependable. In one decade, the Democrats/Republicans favor certain things, then in another decade or two they have long sense forgotten that but the point has been adopted by their Republican/Democrat opponents (and vice versa as well!).

I listen to a variety of Christian podcasts though. The one that represents the best of our ELCA tradition is one called Queen of the Sciences Podcast. It's a dialogue between two ELCA pastor/theologians, a father daughter duet, Pr Sarah Hinlicky Wilson and Pr Paul Hinlicky. She is the associate pastor at our parish serving Tokyo, Japan. (She's there with her husband, who is a lay historian teaching at the Lutheran seminary there). He's a retired professor at our ELCA Roanoke College in Virginia. Sometimes they will host guests as well. While the episodes can be highly theological at times, there are others which are more accessible to a general audience. Give it a try. Just Google it and then scroll through the episodes until you see a title that might interest you. I've used some of it in my Monday night Zoom classes.

One of the reasons I like Queen of the Sciences Podcast is that even with the two hosts the listener gets a sense that theology is in itself a conversation. That's very important for us to remember. All too often theological opinions become doctrinaire (pun intended). Theologians, particularly us Lutheran ones, feel like the "Here I Stand" is the only place that the truth can exist. Jesus is the Way, the Truth and the Life (John 14.6). The Holy Spirit leads us

into all Truth. (John 16.13). Beyond that, we're at best like the disciples in the New Testament: conversing, questioning, and disagreeing. It's through that conversation that the Holy Spirit is at work leading us to and revealing Jesus' Truth. Our life as Christians is much better when we respect each other, understand that our opinions are just that, and together search for the Truth that God reveals to us as his Body.

PS: Thanks so much for the many great cards and gifts that I received on the occasion of my recent 60th birthday. What a blessing you all are! I'm so looking forward to my luncheon this coming Thursday. I'm so blessed to have all of you in my life.

2024 First Impressions Task Force Report Meeting Thursday, February 8, 2024, at 10 AM

In Attendance: Kathleen Birdsall, Linda Steege, Pat Bressler, Crystal Kirkpatrick & Arlene Kelly

We opened our meeting with a word of prayer by Arlene.

1. Our goal, to gather quotes on the various needed repairs, upgrades and/or maintenance needs of our church building has been completed. We will now prepare a proposal of our findings and present the information to the financial committee and the council. The council will make the determination as to when and how First Impressions third project will be implemented.

As a reminder below are a list of the areas that need attention do to safety issues, wear & tear from age, and aesthetics.

- Rot Portico ceiling, columns on front & side of building.
- Rust Metal doors on sides & back of building, and handrails.
- Upgrade roof gutters (commercial as code requires)
- Electrical in Nave Ballasts are burning out, need to be replaced. The sanctuary above altar, light bulbs burned out & tile pieces ready to fall needs to be addressed.
- Painting the outside of the building and the walls in nave and sanctuary.
- Upgrade flooring in the sanctuary (area around the altar & choir)
- 2. We talked about the concrete slab in the parking lot side of the church and would like the council to consider having it removed as it serves no real function.
- 3. We discussed a tabernacle to house the communion elements. We will continue research on this item to find an appropriate fit for the sanctuary.

Next meeting tentatively set for April 11th at 10am. Closed with the Lord's Prayer.

LIVE FOR THE LORD - Follow

Love one another - Set example – show others how to live

As a developing disciple of Jesus Christ and a member of the Gloria Dei Faith Community, we continually, actively, and intentionally live our lives for the Lord by loving one another and by setting the example for others in the world of how to live in that love through the following commitments.

We intentionally and continually read Scripture for faithful understanding through sharing with others by thinking, discussing, believing, and applying Jesus' teachings to our daily lives.

CONTRIBUTE /SERVE

We serve our Lord continually, intentionally, regularly, actively – seeking the passion God instills in each of us towards the least by contributing our time (volunteering, helping, serving), our talents (gifts and skills), and our treasure (our financial possessions.)

Healthy responses to disagreements and conflicts

As disciples of Jesus, we embrace the following:

Five keys to healthy response to disagreements are: (based on Matthew 18:15-17)

- 1. We speak to each other, not about each other behind their backs.
- 2. If someone complains to you about another person, we ask them to speak to the person first and tell them it is so important that you will follow up in a week to see how the conversation went.
 - 3. We don't respond to anonymous comments or letters.
- 4. We don't carry other people's mail. Ask, "What would you like me to do with your comment? You can come to council/meeting yourself or I can bring your comment with your name attached."
- 5. We explain each other's actions in the best possible light. We check with the person quoted or referred to for accuracy before we repeat the comment. (Luther's explanation to 8th Commandment)

Disagreements happen in any organization, including churches. Using healthy responses can stop the disagreement from spreading and engulfing the whole organization.

Thank you for practicing healthy responses and encouraging others to do the same.
