Summer almost always means vacations. Down here, it's a bit different. Many have retired here and if and when they leave during the summer it probably has a lot to do with avoiding the heat and/or hurricanes.

Regardless, when we do travel and we're gone over a Sunday, what is your practice? I will say, I'm always peaking in online to see how things are here at Gloria Dei. However, and I hope this is the case for you, that if you're well enough to be traveling, you're probably able to make it to a local church for Lord's Day worship.

When I'm "on the road" I will almost always try to make it to an ELCA church. I always give the preference for ones with weekly Communion and a good liturgical and musical reputation. Many times, I'll be in an area where I might know pastors serving. Absent that, any Lutheran congregation will do. And if I'm in the unusual situation where that is not available, my go to is Episcopalian. (In my experience, while the preaching can vary widely, they usually don't yuck up for liturgy too badly due to their adherence to the Book of Common Prayer).

Sometimes I'm able to stay and get a cup of coffee afterwards, but mostly I'm an in and out person. I tend to come early and rush out.

What do you notice when you visit other congregations? I guess the number one thing any of us would observe are practices we've never, ever seen before. While Ecclesiastes tells us there's nothing new under the sun, it still happens that we come upon something novel in our own experience. There're also times that we (I) see things that I think might be nice to see implemented here. I would be interested in having some conversations with you about what you see, observe and experience in your church travels.

For much of church history the vast majority of Christians didn't travel and consequently knew nothing but their local parish church. We're blessed nowadays with our getting around! In these journey's we're reminded of the breadth of the Body of Christ which we confess every Sunday.

The most important thing to remember is that we go to church to observe the Lord's Day, to be with God's people, and (hopefully) receive the Blessed Sacrament. The focus is first and foremost on the Lord. I hope and pray that you visit other churches while away.

And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, ²⁵ not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

more vulnerable to things that threaten their spiritual vitality. However, those who are intentionally reflective, prayerful, and attentively responsive are like cultivated vines... Our lives will produce an abundance of fruit for the glory of God." - from "Crafting a Rule of Life" by Stephen Macchia.

LIVE FOR THE LORD - Follow

Love one another - Set example – show others how to live

As a developing disciple of Jesus Christ and a member of the Gloria Dei Faith Community, we continually, actively, and intentionally live our lives for the Lord by loving one another and by setting the example for others in the world of how to live in that love through the following commitments.

PRAY

We pray intentionally, daily setting aside a time and space.

We pray continually, aware of our deep need for the promise of God's continuing presence with us. We offer prayers of:

ADORATION, CONFESSION, THANKSGIVING, SUPPLICATION

WORSHIP

We worship God regularly in love.

We worship God individually and communally, joyfully participating with others in singing, praying, touching, listening, sharing, and communing at the Lord's Table.

BUILD RELATIONSHIPS

We intentionally welcome others and continually build relationships by: spending time together, listening without judgment, understanding without agreement; and always forgiving one another.

STUDY

We intentionally and continually read Scripture for faithful understanding through sharing with others by thinking, discussing, believing, and applying Jesus' teachings to our daily lives.

CONTRIBUTE /SERVE

We serve our Lord continually, intentionally, regularly, actively – seeking the passion God instills in each of us towards the least by contributing our time (volunteering, helping, serving), our talents (gifts and skills), and our treasure (our financial possessions.)

Healthy responses to disagreements and conflicts

As disciples of Jesus, we embrace the following:

Five keys to healthy response to disagreements are: (based on Matthew 18:15-17)

- 1. We speak to each other, not about each other behind their backs.
- 2. If someone complains to you about another person, we ask them to speak to the person first and tell them it is so important that you will follow up in a week to see how the conversation went.
 - 3. We don't respond to anonymous comments or letters.
- 4. We don't carry other people's mail. Ask, "What would you like me to do with your comment? You can come to council/meeting yourself or I can bring your comment with your name attached."
- 5. We explain each other's actions in the best possible light. We check with the person quoted or referred to for accuracy before we repeat the comment. (Luther's explanation to 8^{th} Commandment)

Disagreements happen in any organization, including churches. Using healthy responses can stop the disagreement from spreading and engulfing the whole organization.

Thank you for practicing healthy responses and encouraging others to do the same.
