FIRST READING: JEREMIAH 17:5-10

These verses compose a poem that is part of a larger collection of wisdom sayings that contrast two ways of life. Life with God brings blessing; the power and vitality of God is active in our life. Life without God brings a curse, the power of death.

GOSPEL: LUKE 6:17-26

After choosing his twelve apostles, Jesus teaches a crowd of followers about the nature and demands of discipleship. He begins his great sermon with surprising statements about who is truly blessed in the eyes of God.

The holy gospel according to Luke. Glory to you, O Lord.

The gospel concludes: The gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**

DISTRIBUTION OF COMMUNION

The Body is available as bread or gluten-free Host.

The Blood is available as wine (large chalices) or non.alcoholic juice (small chalice). Worshipers may receive Communion
via "intinction," dipping the Host into the Chalice, or by common
cup, on the PULPIT side of the Altar. If you're on the Pulpit side,
you may also feel free to intinct. The other chalice is for intinction
ONLY.

When giving the bread and cup, the communion ministers say: The body of Christ, given for you.

The blood of Christ, shed for you.

The appropriate response is:

Amen.

During the distribution, please pray silently or join in singing.
