A Seed is Planted...

On November 6, 1951, a group of 22 Lutherans held a meeting at the Leesburg Recreation Center with the Reverend A. M. Himes, D.D., of Fruitland Park, FL and the Reverend Martin L. Swanson of Zion Lutheran Church in Groveland, FL to discuss the viability of a Lutheran church in Leesburg.

Services began on Sunday, November 25, 1951 at the Woman's Club of Leesburg. On April 27, 1952 the congregation began to worship in the upstairs auditorium of the Lassiter-Ware Insurance Building in downtown Leesburg. Sunday School classes began as well.

Gloria Dei Lutheran Church continued to grow under the guidance of Duane Carlson, an intern from the Augustana Theological Seminary in Rock Island, IL. It was officially organized on October 26, 1952, as a mission of the former Augustana Evangelical Lutheran Church with 48 adults and 15 child members. The charter membership roll was closed on January 1, 1953 with 50 charter members.

COUNCIL CORNER-by Dick Healy, Congregational Council President

Good Morning.

This is the LAST temple talk of 2019!

Generally, when I think about Gloria Dei, I believe that this is a wonderful Church. Overall, this is a wonderful Congregation, a wonderful community. I think to myself, "Don't mess it up!" I ask you to think the same thoughts. I ask you to support your Pastor and your Church Council and Church staff. Avoid gossip, avoid negative thoughts and actions. Avoid any destructive approaches and keep building a community that welcomes everyone and lifts those in need as well as the comfortable. Go to the Pastor and Council to get the straight story and to learn accurate information. Congregational unity and peace are vital elements of your community. In part, they are what holds us together in faith and mission. We don't seek to mirror the divisions in our society nor to bring strife and disunion into our body of faith.

We are experiencing another period of disruption as we go through the procedure of calling another Pastor. Very fortunately this time, we have the high competence, focus and love of Pastor Jim and Patti to guide us through this difficult procedure. We have a more united community and the energy of many congregants. We have devoted and centered Council members. We have loyal and effective staff. We have the guidance of faith.

Where are we in the process of discovering God's will for us? The Bishop's Office and Synod organization's method is hardly simple, and it is long. It seeks to discover the "best candidate" to call. That "best candidate" may be found mostly or only in part. Council will meet in January under Pastor Jim's guidance to complete the few remaining items to do in the Synod's checklist and in reflection, to seek counsel from God. Following that and subject to the approval of the Office of the Bishop, we will be ready to form the Call Committee.

However, before the Call Committee is constituted, the Council and the Congregation will have meetings to discuss the ways we can discern God's will for us. You will have the opportunity to articulate your feelings and thoughts about how Gloria Dei should express itself in the form of its Pastor and how we should organize and fund that office, with a full or perhaps two part-time pastors. Maybe, maybe by the second or third month of 2020 we can begin to establish a vision for the Call Committee and make the Committee a reality. The vision and instructions would come from the Congregation, Pastor Jim and Church Council.

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Lay leadership is changing. There is a newly-elected President, Bill Birdsall and a newly-elected Vice President, Arlene Kelly, Together with the existing members of the Executive Committee, Treasurer Linda Hide, and Secretary Diane Wasser, I believe that they represent a necessary renewal of our mission and of our existence. There are five new Council members- half of the Council- and they will inject renewed and perhaps refocused energy on behalf of our faith community. A primary mission that Gloria Dei supports, Joining Hands in Food Ministry, receives a new Church Council liaison, Diane Wasser. She has the knowledge and experience including as a member of Joining Hands, to effectively respond to the needs and challenges of Gloria Dei in its support of that mission. Additionally, Diane will become the liaison between the Council and our loyal and effective staff members who serve the Congregation so well.
