

HELP US HELP THE CHURCH BUDGET — PURCHASING GIFT CARDS AND HOW IT WORKS!!!

For a few years now the Education Committee has been taking orders for gift cards once a month. We want to welcome all of you to the Great Lakes Scrip Program so that you will want to participate. It is time to put our members' shopping dollars to work for our church. You can raise money for Christ Church without any additional out of pocket costs!!!

The program revolves around gift cards! Education Committee buys the gift cards from an array of vendors through Great Lakes Scrip at a discounted rate. Then we sell them at full face value to you. The profits earned from the discounted purchases is used to help the education committee but also help us pay bills off of the billboard of bills. For example, Jewel sells gift cards to us at a 5% discount, so \$100 in Jewel cards cost us \$95. If you purchase \$100 of Jewel cards through this program, you give us a check for \$100, we give you the cards, and the difference of \$5 is what we earn that can be put toward education and church expenses. It's that easy - and you won't believe how quickly it adds up!

The order form can be found on the counter in the church office and due dates are always available in your bulletin. Please review the form for your own shopping needs and habits. We all buy gas and groceries. Do you eat out, stop for coffee, go to the movies, or shop? If we could get more families ordering we could raise many \$\$\$\$ for our church. The cards do not expire. Each retailer offers a different percentage. The difference is an instant rebate to our church.

With your help, when you order, we can pay bills from our Billboard of Bills and help with our church's budget. If you have questions, please see Donna Boyko, Eileen Podgor, or Barb Bay. Plans are in the making to set up a table in Wobbe Hall once a month for gift card purchases, taking orders, and gift card delivery. We hope you will be participating!!!


NEW BIBLE STUDY SESSION

We welcome the month of April in anticipation of Holy Week and Easter. Holy week begins with Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. People waved palm branches as Jesus passed them by humbly riding a donkey. Their shouts of Hosanna were their beliefs that Jesus was their earthy Messiah who would free them from their oppression. During the week in preparation of the Passover, Jews from all over came to Jerusalem for the celebration. It is believed that on that Monday, Jesus went and overturned the tables of the money changers at the temple which angered them and the religious leadership. Tuesday and Wednesday, he would have taught at the Temple. On Thursday, we remember that final Passover meal that he would have with his disciples. During their time together, he would wash their feet and give them a new mandate (commandment)

to love as he had loved them. The word Maundy comes from that mandate. After the meal, in the wee hours of Friday, he would journey to the garden with his disciples. He would pray an agonizing prayer to his father. Shortly after, a mob came to arrest him. He would be jailed, tried, beaten and crucified. As it was the Sabbath, he would hurriedly be buried in a new tomb. In the midst of their sorrow, the followers of Jesus would be in hiding as they were afraid that soon they might be caught and punished, too. Early on Sunday, the women came to the garden tomb only to discover that Jesus was not there. It would be Mary Magdalene, by the mention of her name, who would realize that it was Jesus raised from the dead.

In the light of the biblical accounts, we at Christ Church have our own traditions to bring these stories to life. On Palm Sunday, we will receive palms. Dorian and Murphy will be confirmed, and we will remember our own Confirmation, when we professed our own faith in the risen Christ. On Maundy Thursday, we will sit around the tables in Wobbe Hall sharing the story, breaking the matzo and drinking grape juice as we remember the Last Supper. On Good Friday, a life sized cross, made by Ken Tomsheck, will be in our sanctuary to remember the crucifixion. On Easter Sunday, a life size flowered cross will be on our altar to remember the resurrection to new life in Jesus Christ, our Messiah. We continue to thank Helen Harney and her family for making this Easter message come alive.

I invite you to journey with us through Holy Week so that in understanding the message, we too, can proclaim "Christ is risen—He is risen indeed".


