ILLINOIS CONFERENCE OF THE UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST

Last month, I shared with you some information about the Chicago Metropolitan Association of the UCC which our church is in a covenantal relationship with and meets twice a year in spring and fall. The CMA is a part of the Illinois Conference with 68,972 members and 241 churches and is the third largest conference in the UCC. The meeting is held once a year in June. The Mission Statement is "The Illinois Conference is a United Church of Christ covenant community promoting congregational health and vitality and pursuing God's peace and justice." The Illinois Conference core Process is consistent with this mission and its functions are: 1.) Facilitating communication, participation, reconciliation, justice and action; 2.) Bridging local churches and pastors to concerns and relationships beyond the local church; 3.) Training/equipping/supporting leaders and congregations; 4.) Identifying and empowering Conference ministries for mission and outreach; 5.) Developing and nurturing new churches and churches in transition, and 6.) Linking local churches and members to the national and global ministries of the UCC.

This year, our Illinois Conference meeting was held at Elmhurst College on June 6th through June 7th. First thing to do was register at the dorm for overnight accommodations and then out to lunch. Back at the chapel, a welcome was given by the President of the Illinois Conference, Rev. Chuck Maney. This was followed by worship, a presentation of our Sustainability team and then the First Business meeting. The Sustainability Team has been working on what folks in the Illinois Conference are saying about the future of the Illinois Conference and our understanding of what a covenantal relationship is between churches and the Illinois Conference. In the evening, we attended a banquet at the Diplomat West Banquets in Elmhurst. It was a time to get to know our new interim Conference Minister, the Rev. Justo Gonzales II and also to acknowledge the ministry of the Rev. David Russell, who will be retiring at the end of June. After the banquet it was off to the dorms for some shut eye.

During breaks on Friday and Saturday, there was a chance to meet up with friends and colleagues and then go to a room dedicated to picking up new resources which includes new books.

On Saturday, we checked out of the dorm and then went to breakfast in the cafeteria. After our meal, it was back to the Chapel for a Communion Service. Following worship, the Rev. Justo Gonzales II was our Keynote Speaker and he even had us dancing in the aisles. This was followed by going to an energizer (meeting) of our choice. After our energizer, if was back to Business session 2 with closing Benediction and Prayer.

I look forward to going to our Illinois Conference meetings each year. My next stop is General Synod in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. I have wanted to go to General Synod for 30 years. Now is my chance! I will tell you all about it next time.
