

### **Strengthening our Ministry Through Teams**

What a blessing to add three new churches to the TVSBA at the annual meeting! New Life Baptist Church, with Mike Ellis as its pastor and now meeting at the old FSBC Ontario church property; Nueva Esperanza, meeting at Crosspoint Church in Caldwell, with Ishmael Trinidad as the pastor; and Riverside, Emmett, with Pastor Hugh Orr, were all admitted to the TVSBA by unanimous acclamation. Welcome, new churches!

> YOU ARE NEEDED ON A TEAM!

As our association has been discussing our need of a more focused outreach into the Treasure Valley, we realize the job is huge. The work is huge, but our God is capable of handling huge jobs. The Treasure Valley is growing at an amazing rate. Two examples are: Meridian is ranked at the THIRD fastest growing city in the entire U.S.! Nampa is ranked at TENTH, rounding out the top ten cities. To have two of our local cities in the top ten throughout the entire nation is just a snapshot of the need for the Gospel in our valley.

As our association has evaluated its need for a stronger Gospel witness, we know that more of an active team approach to ministry is essential.

Currently, our CPET team (Church Planting and Evangelism Training) and our Church Health team both have active heads, but lack the team support needed for more effectiveness in their minis-

The CPET team is led by Clint Henry and Dan Ozuna. They work with new mission works. Especially since the Treasure Valley is growing at such a high rate, there is more and more need for additional help on this team.

Our camp ministry is named Momentum Camps, with both a kids' age group (3rd-6th grade) and a youth age group (7th-12th grades). Rocky Mason (Momentum Kids) and Todd Liston (Momentum) are the heads of those ministries. Both camp ministries are thankful for the faithful work and support from individuals, but with even stronger team support, those ministries would continue to grow. Those with a special affinity for our children or youth would love the ministry opportunities that working on a camp planning team would afford them. Both camps are blessed with able leadership, so that helps the ministry be stronger.

The Church Health team is led by Van Kierstead and Michele Ring. Their team is in charge of men's and women's retreats and events, the youth's Rally in the Valley event, as well as the pastors and wives, staff and spouses' appreciation Christmas dinner. They want to see the Church Health team expand its role in a

### **Holidays and Impactful Ministry**

The biggest and quickest return on outreach ministry is the local neighborhood school. Here are a few ministry ideas which are proven to glorify God and identity His local church as caring and serving (meeting needs).

- 1. Work with the office (principal and secretary) for a day to provide a faculty and staff lunch. In these COVID19 days, pizza, Chick-Fil-A, Taco Bell tacos, etc. are easy ways to have the food professionally prepared and handled. Ask the office staff for their ideas, preferences, and input. Some communities may allow hamburgers, spaghetti, or a baked potato bar prepared by the church, especially if the church has someone licensed in food prep.
- 2. Christmas goodies the last days before Christmas break...the last week if possible.
- 3. Coffee gift cards (remember to include custodial, nurses, etc. so all are included).
- 4. Classroom necessities are real winners: tissues, hand sanitizer, writing and copy paper, etc.
- 5. Brainstorming with your leaders is always worthwhile.
- 6. Ask the school for one or more needy families to adopt for Christmas.
- 7. But how can we pay for these if finances are tight? Decide as a church family what to do, knowing where God guides He provides and where God leads He feeds. Make a funding outreach request to the TVSBA Church Planting-Evangelism Team. Go to <a href="www.uisbc.org/resources...click">www.uisbc.org/resources...click</a> on Convention Documents...and download a funding request form. We can do more together than we can alone.

(continued from page 1) significant way, adding areas such as encouragement and training in ministries like children and youth. They'd also like to enhance our pastoral encouragement ministry.

The Church Health team has shown its ability to work across churches, in that the women's retreat has been run by a team for several years, now. In any given year, ten to fifteen women from across the association plan the spring event, and over thirty usually have some essential job to do. This is a model of what we can do with effective teams.

The TVSBA Church Leadership team, while currently inactive due to a lack of a team leader, could play an essential role in our growth as an association. Our pastors could greatly benefit from training and help. Many of our pastors are

bi-vocational, and need access to information and ministry help that fits their busy lifestyles. Through an active Church Leadership team, we could provide that extra help needed.

How could you help? Well, first of all, we need to build teams that focus on our areas of passion. If you have a passion for a particular area or a God-given talent, and are willing to do the work to help others in that area, you could be an essential member of one of our teams.

Each of our team leaders is preparing to enlist more workers. Our team leaders can tell you more, and lead you through the process. We want to have a few meetings a year, so that we are truly working groups.

Although we don't know the official 2020 census numbers yet, we do know that our valley is growing

at a tremendous rate. We need to form our teams for ministry to an ever-growing population.

Our valley is growing in the double digits, but overall, our churches are not. As we look at the future of our valley, we want to be more effective. Under the Lord's guidance, we could greatly enhance our TVSBA ministry.

# APPENDIX to the Email Edition of *The Focus*

Church Health Proposal at the TVSBA Annual Meeting October 3, 2020

We, as an A-Team, are proposing that we enlarge and strengthen our teams, making them fully functional to better strengthen our association as a whole. The Church Health Team will be an important part of this process, since our focus is on the churches' individual health, thus strengthening our association.

Therefore, I am proposing:

A Church Health Team led by one or two leaders, who may or may not also fill the role of one of the members.

Members who specialize in the various aspects of church health. The team will work together, with each member specializing in his/her area of focus.

Suggested members of the Church Health Team are:

Team leaders, plus:

- 1—Pastoral Encourager and Liaison—preferably a pastor would be in this position (with help!)
- 2—Women's Ministry Liaison—women's retreats, events, and training
- 3—Men's Ministry Liaison—men's retreats, events, and training
- 4—Children's Ministry/Sunday School Liaison—children's and youth worker training events

I would like for our Church Health Team to provide training. We can do this in individual areas, perhaps. For example, Calvary Baptist has been sponsoring a great children's ministry training for the last couple of years. We could do this type of thing for our other areas, such as women's or men's ministry, as well. My vision is to go back to a gigantic training weekend, like the UISBC used to sponsor for us, at which we offer a variety of training opportunities.

I am also very interested in providing other training. For example, our association could sponsor a Walk Thru the Bible seminar for our entire area. Once again, we have resources as an association to do what any one church within our association would find hard to do. I am very interested in exploring our options. The cost for a Walk Thru the Bible Seminar, for example, would be \$1200 plus the speaker's lodging, food, and travel expenses. This is just an idea; other options are available.

By strengthening our Church Health Team, as well as our other teams, we will be better equipped to handle our association as it is. Stronger teams will help make a stronger association. Even if we get a DOM, there is nothing wrong with stronger teams; they will only benefit us!

Our teams are currently enlisting more help! I have been tasked with finding members for the Church Health Team, so I am asking you to please pray about how you might be able to help!
