

"And the angel answered him [Zechariah], "I AM GABRIEL.

I stand in the presence of God, and I was sent to speak to you and to bring you this good news." (Luke 1:19, ESV)

Introduction: God's personal messengers: Angels, angels everywhere! We have seen angels throughout our study of the Revelation this past year.

The Revelation tells us there are myriads of angels around God's throne. They worship God day and night.

The Revelation also tells us there are angels of destruction who carry out God's judgements against God's enemies. And, there are angels who bring messages to the Apostle John throughout the book of the Revelation.

Now, this morning, we see angels throughout the narrative surrounding the birth of Jesus. There is literally a supernatural invasion of angels to announce Jesus' birth. Have you ever thought about that? Have you ever wondered why angelic visitations surround Jesus' birth? Here is how I understand it.

In the birth of Jesus Christ, our supernatural God invades our natural world. Jesus is Immanuel, God with us. Another way to say it is Jesus Christ is God in the flesh.

And as God in the flesh, Jesus intervenes in our personal histories. Jesus Christ enters the natural world and involves himself intimately with our lives. Jesus Christ, God in the flesh, comes to save us; Jesus comes to heal us; and Jesus comes to give us his eternal life. This is the miracle of Christmas.

And, so, it makes perfect sense that when our supernatural God invades our natural world, God brings his supernatural, heavenly host with him to bear witness to this creation changing event.

And understand, the angels aren't there to provide glitz and glamor to Jesus' birth. They are not part of a big Hollywood type production. The angels are there as God's personal messengers.

The angel Gabriel identifies himself, in Luke 1:19, as God's personal messenger. Luke 1:19 says, "And the angel answered him [Zechariah], "I am Gabriel. I stand in the presence of God, and I was sent to speak to you and to bring you this good news." (Luke 1:19, ESV)

The angel Gabriel, who stands in the presence of God, was sent to deliver a personal message to Zechariah. Think about that! God sends Zechariah a personal message. What does this tell you about our God?

Our God is personal. God knows us. God cares about us. God intervenes in our personal lives, sometimes, maybe even oftentimes, in supernatural ways.

And, so, this morning, I want to briefly look at three angelic visitations, from the gospel of Luke, that surround Jesus' birth.

The angel's message to Zechariah: In the first visitation, the angel Gabriel appears to the priest Zechariah. Zechariah had been chosen by lot to enter the temple to burn incense, something that happened maybe once in a priest's life. This timing is not a coincidence. It is God ordained. While burning the incense, an angel appears to Zechariah.


Luke 1:13-14 says, "But the angel said to him, "Do not be afraid, Zechariah, for your prayer has been heard, and your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you shall call his name John. And you will have joy and gladness, and many will rejoice at his birth." (Luke 1:13–14, ESV)

Through Gabriel, God promises Zechariah a son, even though his wife Elizabeth is barren and both Zechariah and Elizabeth are advanced in years.

Our supernatural God invades Zechariah and Elizabeth's natural world, and gives them the deepest desire of their hearts, a child. The child, of course, becomes John the Baptist, who is called to prepare the way for the arrival of the Messiah.

Through this supernatural act of grace, God reminds us that no matter how old we are, God can intervene in our lives to give us the deepest desires of our hearts, if we will continue to trust him and walk in faith. The angel reminds us that, with God, there is always hope. Amen!

So, let me ask. What are the deepest desires of your heart? Are you trusting God to fulfill these desires, no matter how old you are? No matter how long you have been waiting?





The eternal Christ left the glories of heaven and was born the baby Jesus. The arrival of Jesus always brings joy and gladness. The arrival of Jesus always brings hope.

The book of the Revelation tells us the Lord Jesus Christ is always coming. He is always arriving, even now. The Lord Jesus, through the Holy Spirit, loves to break into our lives to bring joy, peace and hope at unexpected moments, just as he did for Zechariah and Elizabeth.

So, I encourage us to always be vigilant, to pray, and watch for Jesus to come anew into our life and into the life of our families and friends. This is God's message to us through the story of Zechariah and Elizabeth.

The angel's message to Mary: Next, the angel Gabriel appears to Mary, a poor, teenage girl who is of the line of King David.

Luke 1:30-31 says, "And the angel [Gabriel] said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus." (Luke 1:30–31, ESV)

Again, God, through Gabriel, invades Mary's personal history. The angel startles Mary with the staggering announcement that God has chosen her to be the mother of the Savior of the world.

Think about that for a moment. The salvation of all humankind hangs on the response of this teenage girl, who is from a small, backwater village called Nazareth. The angel tells Mary the Holy Spirit will overshadow her and she will become pregnant.

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

Mary's response of faith continues to resound down through the centuries. Luke 1:38 tells us, "And Mary said, "Behold, I am the servant of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word." And the angel departed from her." (Luke 1:38, ESV)

Incredibly, Mary is willing to do as God asks, in spite of the scandal, the scorn, and the shame it will bring upon her and her betrothed husband, Joseph.

great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord." (Luke 2:10–11, ESV)

Then, a heavenly host, a myriad of angels, appears to these same shepherds. This heavenly host praises God, in Luke 2:14, saying, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased!"" (Luke 2:14, ESV)



And here, God reminds us that he can use, not just the oldest amongst us, as he used Zechariah and Elizabeth, God can use even the youngest of us, even the poorest of us, in a mighty way, **if** we will trust him and respond to God's word in faith.

Again, are you seeking God through his word? Are you trusting God and his promises? Do you believe that God can use you in a mighty way, no matter your current circumstances? Are you willing to say "yes" when God calls you? This is God's message to us through the story of Mary.

The angel's message to the shepherds: And, finally, after Jesus is born, angels appear to shepherds keeping watch over their flock by night. First, the angel of the Lord appears to these shepherds in Luke 2:10-11.

These verses read, "And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of

We remember shepherds were a despised class in the culture of that time. Isn't it amazing that God announces the birth of the Savior first to the lowest and most despised class in society?

In these angelic pronouncements, God gives hope to all humanity. God gives hope to the rich, to the poor, to the powerful, to the homeless, and to everyone in between. Through the heavenly host, God proclaims Jesus Christ is the Savior of the world. And that through faith in Jesus, all have access to great joy and peace!

This doesn't mean we will never encounter hardships, or trials, or suffering or pain. This is our lot in this sin stained world. Yet, eternal God came in the flesh so we wouldn't walk through spiritual darkness alone.

When we repent of our sins, and place our trust in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior, we are indwelt by the Holy Spirit. And through the Holy Spirit, we can have joy and peace in the midst of these hardships. This is



God's message to us through the shepherds.

Fear Not: And, now, let me ask this question. What if we had an angelic appearance this morning? If we had an angelic visitation, what would the angel say to us?

One thing we can be certain the angel would say is "Fear not!" Have you noticed every time an angel appears, the first thing they say is "fear not!"

Now, one reason they say 'fear not' is because it is startling to us when something or someone from the spiritual realm manifests in the material world. Right? We are told in the bible there is a spiritual realm. Yet, when we actually see it manifest in the natural world, it shakes us up.

There's another reason an angel says "fear not." The angel says "fear not" because God doesn't want us to live in fear. God's plan for us is to live a life free from fear. Freedom from fear. Wouldn't that be awesome?

We hear this message from God himself in Isa. 41:10. The context of Isaiah, chapter 41, is the restoration of God's kingdom and God's people. God's people need restoration because they had been sent into exile in Babylon because of their repeated sins against God.

God's people are in captivity. They now live in fear; fear of their captors; fear of the unknown; fear they would never get to go home. So, in Isaiah, chapter 41, God gives a word of encouragement to his afflicted, captive people.

Through Isaiah, God says, "fear not, for I am with

you; be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand." (Isaiah 41:10, ESV)

God says "fear not" because he is with us. God says he will strengthen us; he will help us, and he will uphold us with his righteous right hand.

"Fear not, for I am with you." Do you feel the power behind these words? God says he, himself, will be with us, to take us through all the problems and struggles of life.

And, later in Isaiah, chapter 41, the Lord says he, himself, will stoop to deliver his own people. That promise is fulfilled near term when Cyrus releases the captive Israelites so they can return to Jerusalem and rebuild the temple. And it is fulfilled far term in the birth of Jesus Christ. Jesus is God who stoops to be with us.


Through Jesus Christ, God is with us in our pain and in our afflictions. We often want God to take away the pain and the suffering. And sometimes God does.

Yet, God's promise is that, through Jesus, he will always be with us in our pain and in our afflictions. Therefore, we can live our lives free from fear! We are not alone.

Living a life free from fear. Living a life filled with great joy and peace. Living life knowing God is with us, every second, of every day, for all eternity. All of these promises contained in the birth of the baby Jesus. Yet, God's promises are only fully realized when they are received through faith. Amen!

What a privilege and delight it is to report GOD's graciousness to us. In this report/story we can actually see GOD's breaking into our day-to-day life. The result a deeper sense of fellowship with Him.

In October, a location manager from "This is Us", (an ABC TV family series) contacted Pastor Steve to ask if CPC would consider renting the sanctuary to Disney Production in order to film a memorial service scene in a "This is Us" episode.

1st evidence of GOD: Pastor Steve took the call. He usually rejects such calls out of hand. But this time he took the call, listened and considered and prayed about this request. With Session's partnership in prayer and following approval, "This is Us" was green lighted for October 18-20; one day to set up, one day to film, and one day to tear down and return the campus to its original state.

2nd evidence of GOD: The original agreement was that CPC would receive a payment for \$4K. When the Project manager arrived, he said, "I think we can do better than that." The final payment was \$12K for CPC and \$30 and hour for a site representative. "Perhaps Pastor, you would like your wife, Simone, to be the site manager." Simone was delighted to be paid for what she would have done anyway as our church hostess. Clearly God had impacted this man's heart to not lowball but bless the church financially.

3rd evidence of GOD: There were over a hundred people on campus and walking through the Fellowship Hall. On the bulletin board in the Fellowship Hall there are art pieces representing Jesus' birth, ministry, crucifixion, resurrection, ascension and the gift of Jesus' Holy Spirit (GOD with us). From time to time someone would stop and just ponder the bulletin board. Sometimes groups would gather at the bulletin board to talk about the paintings displayed and the story they told. The paintings communicate the gospel. There were wonderful dialogues going on about the Good News of Jesus Christ.

4th evidence of GOD: The CPC community was encouraged to receive affirmation that we are "a hidden jewel"; that our gift of hospitality was received; and that there is a palpable presence of the Holy Spirit in this place.
