

Final Exhortations, Rev. 22:6-21, originally given on 040322 at CPC

Introduction: Warren Wiersbe, in his commentary on the Revelation said this. "Heaven is more than a destination, it is a motivation." I like that. In other words, knowing heaven is our destination motivates us in this life. We want to do whatever it takes to get us there. Amen!

The book of Hebrews tells us the desire for heaven motivated the Old Testament patriarchs. It motivated

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

Abraham to leave his home and go the Promised Land as God had directed him.

Heb. 11:8, and 10 says, "By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to a place that he was to receive as an inheritance. And he went out, not knowing where he was going . . . For he [Abraham] was looking forward to the city that has foundations, whose designer and builder is God." (Hebrews 11:10, ESV)

By faith, Abraham obeyed, because Abraham was looking forward to being in the Holy City as described in Revelation, chapters 21 and 22.

Also, Heb. 11:16 says, "But as it is, they [those listed in Hebrews chapter 11, the chapter of faith] desire a better country, that is, a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God, for he has prepared for them a city." (Hebrews 11:16, ESV)

The Old Testament patriarchs longed for heaven. Their desire was for heaven. And that desire encouraged their faith.

Our desire for heaven also encourages our faith, doesn't it? So, this morning, we will look at the final exhortations in these last verses of the Revelation. Through these exhortations, the Holy Spirit is encouraging faith. The Holy Spirit is stirring up our hope for heaven.


The words of the prophecy motivate us. First, let's look at verses 10-11. They read, "And he [the angel] said to me, do not seal up the words of the prophecy of this book, for the time is near. Let the evildoer still do evil, and the filthy still be filthy, and the righteous still do right, and the holy still be holy."" (Revelation 22:10–11, ESV)

The angel tells John in verse 10, "do not seal up the words of the prophecy of this book, for the time is near." God did not intend the prophecies in the book of the Revelation to be kept secret. Christianity is not a secret society. Instead, we are told to read the words of the Revelation aloud, not only to ourselves, but to others. We are exhorted to spread these words of God because Jesus can return at any time.

This links to what the angel says in the next verse. The angel continues in verse 11, "Let the evildoer still do evil, and the filthy still be filthy, and the righteous still do right, and the holy still be holy." Here is what I believe the angel is saying. Because Jesus can return at any time, the prophecies contained in the Revelation are intended to lead people to repentance.

The verses about the Great White Throne judgement, in chapter 20, should lead people to repentance. How can you read about this judgement and not ponder your eternal destiny?

If it doesn't affect you, you have become hard hearted.

This is what verse 11 is talking about. If you hear these prophecies and continue on the same path, then, the evildoer will still do evil, and the filthy will still be filthy. In other words, if someone hears these words and doesn't repent, their hearts will harden further. It will be harder for the Holy Spirit to reach them.

On the other hand, for those in Christ, these words encourage the righteous to continue doing the right thing. The words encourage the righteous, who are in Christ, to continue living a holy life. These words help them overcome present circumstances. These words encourage them to remain faithful until death so they receive the blessings of heaven.

So, the first exhortation, in these last verses, is to hear; to read aloud the words of the Revelation. First, that people might hear, and repent, and come to faith in Jesus as Lord and Savior. And second, that those who are in Jesus Christ might continue to live righteous and holy lives, and be counted as one of the overcomers who inherit the crown of life in heaven.

Are you inside or outside? Next, let's look at verses 14-15. They read, "Blessed are those who wash their robes, so that they may have the right to the tree of life and that they may enter the city by the gates. Outside are the dogs and sorcerers and the sexually immoral and murderers and idolaters, and everyone who loves and practices falsehood." (Revelation 22:14–15, ESV)

These verses are both a confirmation and an exhortation. These verses confirm that some will be inside the gates of the holy city, and some will be outside the gates of the holy city.

Who is inside the city gates? Those who have washed their robes. Verse 14 says, "Blessed are those who wash their robes, so that they may have the right to the tree of life and that they may enter the city by the gates."

What does it mean to "wash" your robes? Revelation, chapter 7, helps us understand this.


Rev. 7:9 says, "After this I [John] looked, and behold, a great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed in white robes, with palm branches in their hands," (Revelation 7:9, ESV)

And then Rev. 7:13-14 says, ""Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, "Who are these, clothed in white robes, and from where have they come?" I said to him, "Sir, you know." And he said to me, "These are the ones coming out of the great tribulation. They have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb." (Revelation 7:13–14, ESV)

How do we wash our robes so that they are white, white being a symbol of righteousness? We wash them in the blood of the Lamb. Which means we repent and receive Jesus' sacrifice on our behalf.

Jesus' shed blood blots out the crimson stains of our sin, and makes our robes white. White robes symbolize we are now righteous before God. And when we do that, when we

wash our robes in the blood of the Lamb, we have the right to enter the city (heaven) by the gates and eat of the tree of life. We are allowed inside and remain inside for all eternity.

Yet, some are barred from entering the city. They are the evildoers described as "dogs and sorcerers and the sexually immoral and murderers and idolaters, and everyone who loves and practices falsehood." These are strong descriptions of evildoers, aren't they?

These evildoers are banned from the holy city (from heaven) not only to punish their evil but also to protect the city from them. All evil is excluded from the city. Evil is excluded from God's final kingdom. These evildoers remain outside the city for eternity.

So, again, here is an exhortation for people to wash their robes in the blood of the Lamb before it is too late. Have you washed your robes? Will you be inside or outside of the city?

The Night is defeated: And finally, let's look at verse 16. It reads, "I, Jesus, have sent my angel to testify to you about these things for the churches. I am the root and the descendant of David, the bright morning star."" (Revelation 22:16, ESV)

Again, here we have both confirmation and exhortation. Our Lord Jesus says, "I am the root and the descendant of David, the bright morning star."" These are the last titles Jesus gives himself in the Revelation.

First, Jesus says, "I am the root and the descendant

of [King] David." Here Jesus claims he is both divine and human. Jesus Christ is the "root" of David. In other words, Jesus Christ is David's creator. Jesus Christ brought David into existence. This speaks of Jesus Christ's divinity. At the same time, Jesus is a descendant of David. Jesus was born a Jew from the lineage of David. This speaks of Jesus' humanity.

This reminds us of Isa. 9:6 which says, "For to us a child is born [speaking of Jesus' humanity], to us a son is given [speaking of Jesus' divinity]; and the government shall be upon his shoulder, and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." (Isaiah 9:6, ESV)

Again, that Jesus Christ is "the root and the descendant of David" confirms that Jesus is the promised Messiah and his words are true.

The exhortation in this verse is the last part. Jesus says he is the "bright morning star." Why the bright morning star?

The morning star appears when the night has reached its greatest degree of darkness. Even though it is still dark, and even though dawn is still three or four hours away, the morning star signals that night is almost over. When we see the morning star, we know the night is defeated, it is only a matter of time.

Jesus tells us he is the bright morning star. Jesus encourages us that although things still seem dark, his return is right around the corner. Jesus exhorts us to keep our eyes on the heavens, to keep our eyes on him, because he has defeated the night, and the light of his deliverance shines even now.

The gospel of John, chapter one, verse 5, puts it this way. "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." (John 1:5, ESV) Jesus is the bright morning star. His light shines in the darkness. The darkness cannot overcome his light. This is our hope.

Heaven is more than a destination. It is a motivation. So, we proclaim the words of the Revelation; we wash our robes in the blood the Lamb; and we keep our eyes on the bright morning star. Jesus Christ has defeated the night. The daylight of his kingdom is right around the corner. Amen!

He also teaches a Sunday School class. He plays Christian music in villages and passes out bibles. Noah wants to go to a Minnesota university and study Computer Science. He is interested in Japanese Language.

Pastor Viktor leads their church as minister. He is a lawyer and involved in religious freedom cases. He is so happy for some victories in the European Court where they won a case for religious freedoms with a vote of 7-0. Viktor travels and works with other churches on religious freedoms. Teresa is the loyal supporter but does so much more. She also teaches and leads the women in worship and bible studies.

When some Ukrainian refugees were looking for help Viktor and Teresa offered to give aid to them with personal items, food, but mostly support and encouragement. Teresa thanked our church for financial gifts that went toward their Ukraine project. She said the Ukrainians were very thankful for the help they got. I just want to say it was the love of Jesus Christ through our church that helped them in their time of need.




