# **FIVE-YEAR-OLD KINDERGARTEN (K5)**

### **Bible**

**Building on the Rock** (Summit Ministries) lays the groundwork of worldview education for the youngest students, helping young ones understand relationships with the Creator, each other, ourselves, and creation.

- Hymns/choruses.
- Memory verses.
- Bible doctrine focused on Genesis, creation, life of Christ, and Salvation.

# Language Arts: Phonics, Reading, Poetry, Spelling and Writing

Letters and Sounds K5 (Abeka) as they learn and review vowel and consonant sounds, blends, one-and two-vowel words, words with special sounds, and sentence comprehension.

The Basic Phonics Readers (Abeka) are twelve small readers that are an excellent introduction to reading. Students will gain a firm foundation in reading and develop a love for books that will last a lifetime.

Writing with Phonics K5 (Abeka) teaches students to write the letters as they learn what sound the letters say. Students will write letters, blends, words, and even sentences.

My Favorite Kindergarten Poems (Abeka) introduces young children to the wonderful world of poetry with familiar, enjoyable poems that evoke laughter, paint a picture with words, and touch children's sensitive hearts.

- Mastery of name, sound, and picture of blends, words, long and short vowels and consonants.
- Sounding of blends and one- and two-vowel words
- Follow and apply phonics concepts to reading and spelling of dictated words, including words with two different ending consonants.
- Read and decode by applying phonics sounds, special sounds, and sight words.

- Master reading of sentences and stories with one- and two-vowel words.
- Continue to build oral skills accuracy, correct enunciation, expression, comprehension; striving for smoothness, fluency, appropriate volume, alertness to punctuation.
- Know to capitalize the beginning of a sentence and place a period and other punctuation at the end of a sentence.
- Ordering words correctly in a sentence.
- Memorization and recitation of 13 lyrical poems.
- Gain vocabulary enrichment such as understanding and producing rhyming words and opposite words.
- Formation of letters and sentences using good writing posture, proper pencil hold and correct letter placement,
- Writing his or her first name.

### **Mathematics**

**Numbers Skills K5** (Abeka) is a colorful workbook that reinforces number concepts and formation through 100, addition and subtraction combinations, number sequences, number words, telling time, and working with money.

*Math K5* (BJU Press) will help your kindergarten student develop an understanding of numbers and how they are used to represent addition, subtraction, measurement, and more.

- Number recognition, counting and writing 1-100.
- Numbers largest and smallest 1-100.
- Number concepts 1-100.
- Counting and writing numbers to 100 by tens, fives, and twos.
- Recognize left and right.
- Recognize and spell first to tenth ordinal position.
- Addition and subtraction facts 1-10.
- Add money: pennies; dimes and pennies; nickels and pennies.
- Fractions: whole, half, quarter, third.



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- Measurement and capacity: time, calendar, months, weeks, days, measuring by the inch.
- Continued development of geometric concepts using patterning and sequencing using colors, shapes, and numbers.

# Science

God's World K5 (Abeka) is a simple, exciting introduction to God's plan for the universe.

- Parts of the body and our five senses: eyes, nose, tongue, ears, and skin.
- Kinds of weather: sunny, cloudy, windy, hot, cold, rainy.
- Seasons: fall, winter, spring and summer.
- Seeds and plants.
- Animals: spiders, zoo animals, bird, reptiles and amphibians, farm animals, insects, born alive and born from eggs, animal habitats.
- The seashore.

# **Social Studies**

**Social Studies K5** (Abeka) introduces kindergartners to community helpers, beginnings of American history, interesting features of countries around the world, and simple geography.

- Community helpers such as firefighter, police officer, doctor, nurse, dentist, postal employee, pastor.
- Historical figures such as Christopher Columbus, the Pilgrims, George Washington, Abraham Lincoln, George Washington Carver, Pocahontas.
- Landmarks and symbols: Statue of Liberty, U.S. flag, Washington, D.C., currency ("In God We Trust"), Liberty Bell, Mt. Rushmore, bald eagle.
- Globe studies: directions (north, south, east, west), the equator, the Fifty United States, neighboring countries, 7 continents, 4 oceans.

- Study of native American culture, Alaska, Hawaii, and American territories.
- World studies the landscape, location, famous landmarks, historical people, and culture of 12 different countries (Italy, Peru, Kenya, China, Canada, The Bahamas, Mexico, England, The Netherlands, Israel, Japan, Australia).

# Social and Personal Skills

- Develop good character traits including: kindness, courtesy, gentleness, obedience, truthfulness, attentiveness, respect, good manners, helpfulness, cheerfulness, orderliness, diligence, dependability, thoughtfulness, self-control, unselfishness, and generosity
- Visual perception skills development through working with mazes, sorting items, identifying missing items, cresting pictographs, recognizing similarities and differences
- Motor skills development through coloring, cutting, buttoning and unbuttoning, and working with learning manipulatives and simple science tools.
- Listening skills development; identifying sounds, imitating sequences of rhythms (snapping, clapping, stomping), and learning to follow step-by-step oral instructions.
