#### Pastor's Report Nate Watkins 2023

Since this is my first Pastor's Report, I'd like to include my story of how I got here so we can remember the circumstances in years to come!

My tenure as pastor of PebbleCreek Community Church began on July 1, 2023, but the story of how God guided us here began in December of 2022. As many of you know, I was pastoring a church in upstate New York. It was about the same size as PCCC and God had blessed my work there in numerous ways over the past four years; so much so, in fact, that in December of 2022 Rocio and I had decided to sell our home that was about six miles outside of town so we could buy a place in town where I thought we could be even more effective.

We had a buyer within a few weeks offering us full price, which surprised us because of how slow the market was, but we weren't complaining, assuming God was making a way for us to move into town sooner than expected. We agreed to a 90-day escrow, which was typical for New York. Then, the very next week, we received news from Rocio's brother, who lives in Anaheim, CA, that he had been diagnosed with stage 4 kidney cancer. That changed everything. Rocio could not bear the thought of living across the nation from her family while her brother underwent whatever treatments were available or lived out his last months/year. So, we prayed about it, and decided that since we were already in the process of selling our house, God was paving the way for us to move west.

I chose to look for a church in Arizona that would put us within driving distance of her family, but still be outside of California so we could afford to buy a house. That next week, the advertisement for PebbleCreek Community Church popped up on the website I was using to job search. At that point, I had never heard of a church in the middle of a 55+ community and mentioned it to Rocio, but we didn't really think too much about it. I mean, what kind of church is in the middle of a resort? Also, there were lots of other churches in Arizona looking for a pastor, so two weeks went by in my job search as I kept looking for the "right" position. But each night, I kept finding myself coming back to the PCCC advertisement and wondering about it. Finally, I decided to apply, figuring there was nothing lost if I never heard anything back.

Well, I heard back almost right away from the search committee on February 1, letting me know that they would be looking through all the initial resumes they had received and would let "selected candidates" formally apply on February 17<sup>th</sup>. I had no idea what it might take to become a "selected candidate," so I prayed that God would lead the way and I kept looking for other possibilities. On February 7<sup>th</sup>, 10 days earlier than expected, I heard back from the search committee saying I was a "selected candidate" and could now formally apply. I filled out the application, submitted it, and then received a call from Susan Preston outlining the candidate process. On February 20, I received word that the committee would like to interview me for the position on March 2<sup>nd</sup>, and I told Rocio that for whatever reason, I was beginning to feel like God wanted me take this opportunity seriously.

The interview on March 2<sup>nd</sup> went well and I was invited to have a 2<sup>nd</sup> interview on March 10<sup>th</sup>. At that point, I told our sons about the possibility, and my youngest asked, "Are you sure this isn't a scam?" I had to admit, I wasn't 100% sure it wasn't at that point, so I decided to take a quick trip to PebbleCreek over the March 19 weekend just to make sure it was all on the up-and-up. It was. None of you saw me, but I poked my head in on Sunday morning just to be sure a church service was going on. I also toured the community, and even played a round of golf. I went back home confident it wasn't a scam! I then interviewed with the Board of Elders and was invited to come for an eight day visit the first week of May. That led to us telling our church in New York that it looked like God was moving us on, and they would need to create their own search committee to look for a new pastor.

And you all know the rest of the story...our house in New York closed escrow the week before we visited PebbleCreek in May. We were with you two Sundays and I interviewed with every Board and Committee in the church during the week. We found a house to buy in PebbleCreek and by May 8<sup>th</sup>, I had signed a contract to be your new pastor. We said our tearful goodbyes to our church in June and then drove across the country, arriving on June 29<sup>th</sup>, the day before our house in PebbleCreek closed escrow. The timing was perfect in every possible way and we were so grateful. Then the real work began!

In the months of July and August, I listened carefully to God's Spirit as to what I should focus on, what I should preach on, who I needed to meet with, what changes I needed to make to prepare us for the Fall. Some PCCC attenders/members decided they would leave the church and find a pastor better suited for them, which was sad. However, that often happens when leadership changes, so it wasn't completely unexpected. Attendance hovered around 110 in those first few months. Meanwhile, the Elders supported me well, as did the production team on Sunday mornings. Rocio and I felt so loved by you all, especially those who went the extra mile in bringing us food (or desserts!) and gave us cards of encouragement. The choir started back up with Katie Croy as the new director, and I was able to begin producing more variety in the congregational worship with some of our musicians.

Word got out in the community that new things were happening at the church, and by mid-October, we were beginning to see a steady inflow of guests on Sunday morning. The installation service on October 29<sup>th</sup> was when I really felt the Spirit of God bind us together. That was followed by the service on November 5<sup>th</sup> when we celebrated our nation's veterans, and 33 of them came! The next week, November 12<sup>th</sup>, was the first Sunday where we broke the 180barrier in attendance. I thought that was pretty great, but then came the Christmas Cantata on December 10<sup>th</sup> when over 260 people came!

Now, just to be clear...our attendance numbers are not what we are focused on as a church...but attendance does indicate good things are happening:

- We are regularly inviting our friends and neighbors, talking to them about the church during the week.
- When they come to visit on Sunday, they are feeling welcomed and want to come back.
- There is a sense of holy anticipation in the room on Sunday mornings as people arrive and are ready to worship when we begin (have you noticed?)
- There is an increase in participation in the worship singing, in the congregational response, in the willingness to serve, in the congregational giving.

All of those indicate God is moving among us in a new way. An answered prayer for many of you, and for Rocio and I as well. I anticipate 2024 is going to be even better as God works among us. Thank you for calling me to be your pastor!

## **O**bjectives:

The Board of Deacons elected and confirmed by the church membership is to nurture members and regular attendees of PebbleCreek Community Church. They greet visitors, send cards for several occasions, assist at times of bereavement, and provide meals to those members in need due to surgery or illness.

- The Deacons made numerous visits in homes and convalescent facilities. The Deacon Outreach Ministry made 459 visits, 755 calls, and sent 323 e-mails and texts and 489 cards (these cards are in addition to those sent by the Card Ministry Distributor). This ministry continues to provide visits, encouragement, and prayer for the ill.
- The Deacons (through our Outreach Ministry and Monthly Deacon Coordinators) have prepared 28 meals.
- A team of 27 Deacon Helpers graciously agreed to provide meals as needed. Our list of Deacon Helpers was updated for 2023.
- The Card Ministry sent birthday, anniversary, get well, and thinking of you cards to regular attendees and members. Sympathy cards were also sent to members and the PebbleCreek community at large as a part of our outreach to non-members.
- The Mats for Homeless Ministry has made and delivered 111 mats to Andre House in Phoenix.
- Every effort is made to greet members and visitors and reach out to serve the congregation of PebbleCreek Community Church.

- 1. Provide for the physical set-up, tear-down, and storage of equipment for each service and event, including the sound system, projectors, and camera for the 9:00 a.m. service.
- 2. Maintain an inventory (count, condition, and value) of the physical assets.
- 3. Purchase supplies for the fellowship time after services, as needed.
- 4. Prepare coffee, hot water, and ice water for the fellowship time, as needed.

# Review of the past year: (January 1, 2023 ~ December 31, 2023)

The choir at PebbleCreek Community Church has been a special blessing. The past year was a time of transition, and the choir was dedicated and faithful throughout that time. The church was fortunate to have Shirley Nebergall as the interim Music Director during the months of January-July with Bev Griggs serving as the interim Choir Director from Jan-May. Starting in September, Katie Croy was selected by the board to become the permanent Choir Director and continues in her role to date.

I would like the congregation to note that membership in the choir does not require auditions and it is open to new members any time during the year. In the fall of 2023, the choir started with approximately 14 dedicated members and now we have more than doubled that number with close to 30 choir members singing praise to the Lord. The choir schedule includes Sunday anthems from September through May with practice sessions each Tuesday from 4:00pm-5:30pm in the Robson theater. The choir is on hiatus in the summer and during Christmas break.

One of the highlights of the choir ministry for 2023 was the "An Old-Fashioned Christmas" cantata which was presented during the first part of December. There were 264 attendees from

the PebbleCreek Community and the church who enjoyed the presentation (and the cookies provided by the fellowship committee)! A special guest violinist added to the melodious sounds of the choir and the beauty of the cantata. We welcome all those who are interested in joining the choir to attend a rehearsal to become familiar with this important ministry or you are welcome to call me for additional information.

### Finance Committee Report 2023

## **O**bjectives:

- 1. To create the annual church budget based on estimated tithes and offerings, expenses requested by committees, and other expenses; to request special offerings for Christian purposes; to inform the Elder Board of the church financial position throughout the year; and to inform the congregation of the Elder Board's decisions in such matters.
- 2. To oversee and manage the church's general fund account, the church's reserve fund accounts, and restricted special funds for the furtherance of the purposes of the church.
- 3. To oversee the church accounts monthly and to conduct an annual review of church financial records.

- [The 2022 budget was balanced for the seventh consecutive year, but following the departure of the pastor in summer, 2022, contributions declined substantially and the church deficit for the year 2022 was \$43,906.] Proposed a 2023 budget reflecting a lower level of contributions and expenses, with anticipated contributions of \$270,000 and expenses of \$292,296, for a proposed deficit of \$22,296. The budget was approved by the congregation at the annual meeting in February, 2023.
- Reviewed each month's financial results and provided monthly financial reports to the Elder Board. For the year, tithes and offerings were \$281,354.50, higher than projected, and the general fund received a transfer back from the allocation to missions, due to the lower offerings in 2022, of \$10,565.00. Expenses were \$263,727, lower than budgeted primarily due to the vacancy in the position of pastor for much of the year. This resulted in a surplus of \$17,627, not including interest income. The church's aggregate bank accounts increased from \$343,050 on January 1 to \$363,414 on December 31, 2023.
- Conducted the annual Finance Committee review of the church's 2022 financial statements and found no exceptions
- Managed the investments of the reserve funds. While interest rates have risen during the year, the funds are primarily designed for safety through placement of bank FDIC-insured deposits.
- Prepared a budget for coming year 2024 with anticipated tithes and offerings of \$300,000, and anticipated expenses of \$299,200, which projects a budget surplus of

\$800. Please see the 2023 financial reports and the 2024 proposed budget, attached separately.

## W hat we will do in 2024 and beyond

- Continue to work to achieve a balanced budget.
- Examine each item in the church budget for furtherance of the Kingdom of God.
- Continue to improve the efficiency of the church's financial systems and provide meaningful reporting to the Elder Board.
- Continue to oversee the church's investments and expenses to ensure that we are being good stewards of God's resources.

Thank you for your loving outpouring of tithes and offerings for the work of our Lord Jesus Christ.

- 1. Focus our giving toward meeting spiritual needs, as well as meeting humanitarian endeavors.
- 2. Support mission outreaches that are effective in presenting the claims of the gospel and winning people to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ and His Grace.
- 3. Support missions reaching out to people in keeping with our Lord's teaching to feed the hungry, and provide clothing, shelter, and medical care to those who are hurting in this world.
- 4. Support missions which are viewed as meeting established criteria. These missions will represent local, state, national, worldwide Christian ministries, and their missionaries in accordance with the church goals, This includes individual(s) working with these ministries that are required to obtain their own financial support.
- 5. Support American Indian missions and their ministries.

- The Committee has been working diligently to make the best use of the funds dedicated to missions and to provide as many "hands on" service opportunities for our congregation while adhering to the changes resulting from the virus shutdown. We met monthly using ZOOM technology and continued to review our missions to ensure they meet the criteria set up for our mission endeavors.
- We supported nine (9) missions at \$ 200.00 per month. These local, national and international missions are Agua Fria Food & Clothing Bank, Alaskan Christian College, Eve-A-Douglas Caribbean Deaf Ministry, Intervarsity Christian Fellowship, JESUS Film Project, JOY Brazil, Phoenix Rescue Mission/Changing Life Center, Samaritan's Purse (SP), and World Gospel Missions Southwest Indian Ministries. The remaining budgeted funds were used to assist other missions brought to our attention by God and reviewed worthy of our help in spreading the Gospel Message throughout the world.
- Added new Monthly Mission to support Zach Hsu as he attends Phoenix Seminary while working at, Arizona State University (ASU) doing Christian Challenge Student

work. This replaced InterVarsity Christian Fellowship when Katie Rawson Retired at the end or 2023. She was one of our first missionaries and our Church supported her for over 20 years.

• Added a new Occasional Mission of Arizona Christian University (ACU) campus located in Peoria, AZ. A student Scholarship Fund for \$ 5,000.00 was started. We reached out to the congregation for additional support to attain the \$ 5,000.00.

#### • Specific projects included:

- 1. Samaritan's Purse Operation Christmas Child (OCC) Shoe Box Ministry led by Edna DeFord and Inge Chapman that filled a total of 588 Shoe Boxes in 2023. Shoe boxes were provided to our church family during October and November. An On-Line Shoe Box Page was generated for our church by SP/OCC which allowed individuals to fill a total of 200 shoe boxes online from the comfort of their homes or providing funds to have the OCC Committee fill online for them. Individuals also funded 248 "Adopt A Box" by paying the \$10.00 transportation fee. By using "Follow your Box" labels, we know these boxes were sent to the Philippines, Ecuador, and various Hard to Reach Areas. A Special Shoe Box Prayer Dedication was held during the November 19, 2023, worship service. We thank God that shoe boxes from PebbleCreek Community Church blessed children in several countries and in areas we will never know about as it is too dangerous to reveal their locations.
- 2. Donations from the congregation were made to Samaritan's Purse for Disaster relief deployments for the Maui Fire and to Samaritan's Purse World Medical Mission trips made by Dr. Allan Sawyer to Papua, New Guinea, and Africa.
- **3.** Agua Fria Food Bank Thanksgiving and Christmas Food Distribution Program was supported by financial assistance and collection of plastic bags and empty prescription bottles.
- 4. The Missions Committee supplied slide shows on several Sundays, and additional presentations to keep the church updated on the exciting event of churches being built by our congregation's funds.

#### Other Major Mission activities in 2023 include:

- Mission updates were included in the PebbleCreek Community Church Prayer Chain information and on the church website.
- Monthly Special Mission Prayer Time in Worship Service for two of our Missions.
- **Provided funding to Agua Fria School Uniform Program** where over 400 young people received two new school uniforms.
- JESUS Film Project received funds to purchase wireless electronic equipment so teams could show the JESUS film DVD, in areas without electricity, to people who had never seen a movie before. Helped fund the translation of a new language for the JESUS Film.
- **Special Designated Funds went to Brother Jacob in India** for use in his ministries including the purchase of school supplies, food for 6,500 children, and

to purchase bunk beds for children's dormitories to comply with COVID inspections. During COVID, the government also assigned him to help feed additional people. Funds for equipment for new hospital building.


- For **St. Bonaventure Indian Mission** we also sent funds to purchase blankets for the elderly and for the water truck which is the only source of water to many families on the reservation,
- **Pastor Daniel in Uganda** received funds to supply food and school fees for the 30 orphans they became responsible for after COVID.
- Alaska Christian College received special designated student scholarship funding and one Arizona student was given scholarship money. This is an annual commitment, and anyone interested in adding to these scholarships is encouraged to contact a Missions Committee member for information.
- **Pastor Elijah Kenya**: Pastor Elijah received funds to support orphans that the government determined belonged to the church because their parents died and there were no other relatives. Funds for food and school fees were supplied.
- Katie Rawson InterVarsity Christian Fellowship was given support to publish a new booklet on working with students from different cultures. A Retirement gift was given to Katie for her great service to the International Students.
- **Phoenix Rescue Mission** received funds to assist in the renovation of the older building and for special programs to help the homeless by distributing water, sandwiches, and God's message of love.
- Our church was blessed with many speakers from our supported Missions in 2023. Dr. Allan Sawyer from Samaritan's Purse World Medical Missions; Phoenix Rescue Mission; Eve-A-Douglas, Jamaica; Leanne Leonard, Agua Fria Food & Clothing Bank; LeRoy & Sandy Anderson, World Gospel Missions, Southwest Ministries; Bishop Jacob Rise & Shine India Video and many updates.
- **Pebble Creek Community Church members and guests** are to be congratulated for their strong mission support in our community, nation, and around the world. We are following the commands of our Lord to "Go into all the world and preach the gospel" and to share the Love of Christ with our PebbleCreek neighbors.
- Over \$22,000 was donated by people in the congregation to the various missions we support. The largest gifts designated by members in 2023 were distributed to the following charities:
