Modifies emergency safety intervention in a children's therapeutic group home to allow emergency physical safety intervention (restraints) to comply with the Mental Health Code and associated administrative rules.
From the Senate Analysis of 12/26/2023: Many entities that might open or operate a psychiatric residential treatment facility (PRTF) assert current regulations on restraint and seclusion are based on a State policy submitted to Medicaid Services that make it impractical to operate such a facility, thus discouraging them from establishing PRTFs safely within local communities in Michigan. Children with behavioral management issues should have an option for care within their own communities, instead of needing to seek aid elsewhere. Accordingly, it has been suggested that these child caring institutions abide by standards already in place in the Mental Health Code and associated rules to better enable the success of Michigan's PRTFs.
