One thing for sure, we must stay in the ship, so we can get shelter from the storms. If we jump overboard, we will get swallowed up by the waters. Jesus is our cover from the storms of life.

We are all going through our own storms plus the world is going through this COVID pandemic. This COVID storm will pass too, but while we are waiting for this storm to pass, let us take refuge in Jesus. Every day we need to rebuke our storms and let peace be still. I want to join with the songwriter that wrote:

'Til the storm passes over, 'til the thunder sounds no more; 'Til the clouds roll forever from the sky. Hold me fast, let me stand in the hollow of Thy hand. Keep me safe 'til the storm passes by..

In each life, some storms must blow. The intensity of each storm depends on the severity of each situation. Some of the storms the believers find themselves in are financial storms, spiritual storms, sickness storms, COVID-19 storm, marital problem storms, unforgiving storms, job problem storms, friendship storms, poor sibling relationship storms, education storms, etc. In Acts 27, Paul found himself in a real storm on the sea storm called Euroclydon. It was a tempestuous strong and a reckless ship destroying storm.

But like Paul, all of us who have Jesus on the inside have the assurance that HE is the storm calmer. And even now, we can say the storm is passing over. Paul's storm lasted many days and he admonished the passengers and crew that except they abide in the ship, they will not be saved. I will say to my friends, abide in Jesus and HIS church, because whatever your storm is, it will pass over. Yes, it will pass over. Some storms last longer than others in each believer's life. So, do not fear, but maintain your faith in God during your storm. It comes not to stay, but it come to pass. Each storm in your life has a beginning and also a tail ending. Like with the Hebrew Boys, God is always in the storm with you 'til it passes over.

COVID-19 Health Information

A year after this COVID 19 virus showed up, we are still battling the effects of its devastation. 500,000 people in The United States have succumbed to this virus and millions more are living with the after effects of the virus. We have rolled out vaccines and thousands have taken 1 to 2 doses but we are still not able to grasp a handle on controlling this demon. With plan to reopen school, there is no COVID-19 vaccine yet for children under age 16. Several companies have begun enrolling children as young as 6 months old in COVID-19 vaccine clinical trials. Stay educated in prayer, so that you can make an informed decision that will affect your life.

***There are some common questions that are being answered by the CDC (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention).

Many people want to know if they get vaccinated, can they still get the Virus?

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), a person who is vaccinated against COVID-19 can still be infected with or "carry" the virus that causes COVID-19 while not feeling sick or having symptoms. Experts call this "asymptomatic infection."

Can you receive the COVID-19 vaccine if you are currently infected?

Vaccination of persons with known current SARS-CoV-2 infection should be deferred until the person has recovered from the acute illness (if the person had symptoms) and criteria have been met for them to discontinue isolation.

Can you test positive for Covid after getting the vaccine?

Getting the vaccine will not make you test positive for COVID-19 on a rapid test or a PCR test.
