# Notes from Harry Sexton, Assoc. Pastor

Merry Christmas Laveen Baptist Church! Like many of you I can hardly wrap my mind around that fact that it's already December and the Christmas season is upon us. 2025 has been an interesting year to say the least but God's goodness has shown through it all. His gifts to us as a congregation have been amazing but of course those gifts all began when He began the creation and set His plan into motion.

When we think about Christmas, we often think about gifts. As a church, we've already put together and shipped out around 100 Christmas shoeboxes filled with items that are going all over the world with the message of Jesus. We also have our annual Angel tree up to help children right here in the Laveen area. A lot of people find the idea of gift giving at Christmas from the scripture in Matthew 2:10-11 which talks about the Magi (wise men) giving gifts to Jesus at His home: "When they saw the star, they were overjoyed. On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold and of incense and of myrrh."

The Bible of course tells the wonderful story about the gift God gave us—Jesus Christ—and we can use it as an opportunity to present the gospel and to show love. The giving and receiving of gifts can be part of fulfilling what Paul says about giving in 2 Corinthians 8:7–8, "Just as you excel in everything—in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in complete earnestness and in your love for us—see that you also excel in this grace of giving. I am not commanding you, but I want to test the sincerity of your love by comparing it with the earnestness of others." Paul encouraged the churches to give financial gifts to the believers in need in Jerusalem and stressed that their gifts were to be voluntary and motivated by earnest love. We can apply this same lesson to our own lives by giving to others, not just at Christmas, but all year round!

Can gift giving wrongly become the focus of Christmas instead of thanking the Lord for the gift of His Son (John 3:16)? Of course it can. Does gift giving have to take away from the true meaning of Christmas? No, it doesn't. If we stop to focus on the wonderful gift of salvation that the Lord has given us (Isaiah 9:6), then giving to others becomes a natural expression of that gratitude. The key is our focus. Is your focus on the gift or is it on the ultimate gift-giver, our gracious Heavenly Father? "Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights..." (James 1:17).

This church and all of you are an unbelievable gift that God has given to me, and I thank Him for all of you and the opportunity that I have to serve each of you. Thank you for being God's gift in this way.




