Notes from Pastor Jim

"When they had gone a long time without food, then Paul stood up in their midst and said, 'Men, you ought to have followed my advice and not to have set sail from Crete and incurred this damage and loss. Yet now I urge you to keep up your courage, for there will be no loss of life among you, but only of the ship. For this very night an angel of the God to whom I belong and whom I serve stood before me, saying, 'Do not be afraid, Paul; you must stand before Caesar; and behold, God has granted you all those who are sailing with you.' Therefore, keep up your courage, men, for I believe God that it will turn out exactly as I have been told." - Ac 27:21-25. (emphasis added)

In the midst of a storm that had seasoned sailors concerned for their lives, Paul offers them assurance for their safety. Please don't take this to mean Paul wasn't emotionally affected by their situation. Instead, His concern was abated because of a promise of protection from God. There would be loss.

The ship and cargo were to flounder. But, as for the people on board, they would be delivered. Father had a purpose for Paul. It was to "stand before Caesar" and proclaim to an earthly king a message from the King of Kings.

The words brought by this heavenly messenger carried so much weight they moved Paul more the rocking and rolling, the rising and falling of the ship carried about on the waves. They spoke louder than the whipping and howling wind. They offered a counter to fear, courage, Paul trusted these words and he offered them as testimony of the greatness of his God. Paul's security was summed up in one statement he made, "the God to whom I belong" had spoken.

So, what does it mean that a person belongs to God? Paul expressed it to Titus this way, "Our great God and Savior, Christ Jesus, who gave Himself for us to redeem us from every lawless deed, and to purify for Himself a people for His own possession" (Titus 2:13-14). To belong to God means we are His possession. He holds title to those who, by faith, have entered into relationship with Jesus. As such God is responsible for our care and wellbeing. As the prime example of a good steward, God will not waste or neglect what is His. Father, as a responsible parent, securely holds His own.

As with Paul, this offers great security. Though His saints may be carried about in a chaotic world, they have not be lost from the hand of God. Neither have they been misplaced.
