

I've always loved Christmas. When I was young it meant grandparents, some gifts, a traditional Christmas dinner, and maybe even some snow. It was the school Christmas program, a couple of weeks off, and time to read whatever book or books I received that year.

It's still my favorite season: the songs, the decorations, the lights, the Christmas movies on my "must watch" list. Even though it's become very commercialized, it still seems to bring a general feeling of goodwill to the world.

Of course, as believers, we understand where that goodwill originates. We know that the true celebration of Christmas centers on a baby born in less than ideal circumstances: born to a young woman pregnant before her wedding, far from home and the women who would normally help her deliver, giving birth in a shelter meant to house animals, and laying her newborn in a feeding trough for a bed.

But circumstances do not determine outcomes – God does. Did Mary know God's plan? Some of it, from Old Testament prophecies, the angel Gabriel's visit, the shepherds, and the wise men. It says that she treasured these things and thought about them over and over. But no one fully knows the mind of God. Still, she entrusted herself completely to His care.

Thirty-three years later, circumstances seemed even more impossible. Jesus was dead. Buried in a tomb. His followers were in hiding. And yet, God wasn't done. Christ rose from the dead, and Mary's son became her Savior, paying the penalty and taking the punishment for her sin – and ours.

And that's why we celebrate the birth of a baby in Bethlehem two thousand years ago. Because we can now live in hope with no fear of sin or death. So, no matter what the circumstances, entrust yourself to God's care and enjoy this Christmas season with all its festivities, music, and lights. Remember that without Christmas, there is no Easter.
