Notes from Pastor Jim

"All that is in the world, the lust of the flesh and the lust of the eyes and the boastful pride of life, is not from the Father, but is from the world." (1 John 2:16)

The word lust tends to evoke a negative, almost repulsed, reaction from people. I think this is because we associate it in a sexual manner. We picture in our mind some sort of trench coat wearing pervert exposing himself to people. If this is the image lust generates for you, then John's admonition may loose some of its power.

Such deviance as mentioned above can well be an expression of lust. But, and this is important to recognize, lust can manifest itself in many different ways of which the perversion mentioned is only an extreme example. John's warning is not exclusively directed at the worst case scenarios. It is a call to not be driven by personal desires.

So, what precisely do the biblical authors have in mind when they write about lust? Lust is, simply put, the wants of your flesh. Maybe a word we are more familiar with is desire, it is what your humanity seeks. John is warning Jesus-followers to not pursue what their eyes see, where their fleshly desire wants to take them, or how pride may influence their attitudes and actions. What emanates from our humanity, John plainly says, "are not from the Father, but . . . from the world."

Those who seek to walk after Jesus need to discern between what they want and what it is God wants. We need to learn to distinguish between following the trends of this world, the habits we have learned, the items and actions society at large wants, and what is in accord with the desires and will of God. Where is this knowledge acquired, by prayer, reading of the Word, and wise, godly, counsel.

Once we distinguish between God's will and ours (lust), we find our lust resisting submission to the Father's will. Old desires, learned over years of living rise up. They want to continue to express themselves. However, Father has not left us alone in this endeavor. Jesus' disciples have been gifted the Holy Spirit. We are told, "walk by the Spirit, and you will not carry out the desire of the flesh" (Gal 5:16). If we will, empowered by the Spirit, seek God's desires, say "No!" to our fleshy wants and wishes, and reject looking upon and valuing the things the world does, we will overcome.

(Matthew 22:37-40) Of course, we know that biblical love is an action and not an emotion (For God so loved the world <u>that He gave</u> His only begotten son – John 3:16) so why not use some of this extra light to do something that shows the true light of God's love for others?

All of the events and activities at the church to reach our community are almost valueless in comparison to a single act of intentional kindness by a member of the family of God who recognizes that no matter how much ugliness a person as incorporated into their lives that they're still a person who has been made in the image of God. Remember that God "causes his sun to rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous" (Matt. 5:45). So, if that's what our Father is doing shouldn't we be doing the same? This is one of the greatest ways to witness about His love.

Enjoy these longer days and look for the opportunities that God brings before you to 'love your neighbor as yourself.'

Graduate Recognition Sunday. It's the day of the year when we recognize our students who are graduating from high school. Because of that, it's also the time of year that we think about endings and beginnings. Births, deaths, graduations, moving, marriage, starting new schools, new jobs, new relationships; life is full of them, isn't it?

Some are filled with joy, while others can bring more hurt than we'd ever imagined. The apostle Paul had his share of both joy and sorrow. In Romans, chapter 12, he talks about how as believers we are one body in Christ and members of one another. And how are we to treat each other as members of one another? In verse 10, he says, "Love one another deeply as brothers and sisters. Take the lead in honoring one another." (CSB) In other words, treat each other with family affection and respect. Then, in verse 15, he gets more specific and says, "Rejoice with those who rejoice; weep with those who weep." (CSB) This isn't a to-do list; it's an invitation to join in the experience of another person in the happy times as well as the sad. It's a chance to grow roots deeply into the heart and soul of a brother or sister – to be that "high five" or "shoulder to cry on", whichever is required.

Sometimes, it's harder to rejoice with others than it is to weep. Especially if they're celebrating something you've desired but haven't been able to achieve: marriage, a promotion, having a child, buying a home, etc. Paul also said that love – an action, not a feeling - does not envy (1 Cor. 13:4). That's when we need to choose to "love one another deeply…honoring one another" by following Christ's example: humbling ourselves and setting aside our own self-centeredness, trusting the Lord's schedule, and practicing the heart of love by sharing in the joy of someone else.

Living together as a family, brothers and sisters in Christ, is not always easy, but it is worth it. Support, encouragement, accountability, working together as partners wrapped up in the grace of God, becoming more and more like Jesus; these are some of the privileges we have as believers when we set our own desires aside and join together as a body to glorify God!
