Notes from Pastor Jim

Ephesians 3:14-19

"For this reason I bow my knees before the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth derives its name, that He would grant you, according to the riches of His glory, to be strengthened with power through His Spirit in the inner man, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith; and that you, being rooted and grounded in love, may be able to comprehend with all the saints what is the breadth and length and height and depth, and to know the love of Christ which surpasses knowledge, that you may be filled up to all the fullness of God."

Paul and the believers in Ephesus shared a close relationship. The Ephesian Jesus-followers and Paul knew one another very well. Paul had been the one God used to bring the Good News of Jesus to their community. Paul had spent considerable time with them. The Ephesians had actively supported Paul in his travels and work. This letter exudes this connection and compassion they shared for one another..

The Ephesians had heard of the hardships Paul faced. They were concerned for him. In order to encourage them, he wrote to remind them of all they had gained in Jesus. He wanted them to know that whatever the circumstances he or they faced, they were worth it considering what is gained in Jesus. This brings me to the passage above.

Because of all the spiritual blessings received from Jesus (1:3), Paul prays on behalf of the Ephesians. He asks God that in His strength He would strengthen them in order that they would know Jesus, be "rooted and grounded" in Hlm, to comprehend the vast blessings to be found in Hlm, and that all this would result in them being filled up, becoming rich examples of God.

I don't know how long ago this passage touched my heart. But, for the people God has placed me among, this statement resonates. My desire for you, as well as for the others I encounter, is that you would know and enjoy Jesus. That's it. It is that simple. Other matters of church life all take a second place to the desire to be used by Father to help you "be filled up to all the fullness of God."

Lita and I will shortly be leaving. We do so glad to see God working in your midst. But sorrowful because we will miss the relationship we have made. Thank you for welcoming us. We appreciate the prayers and love you have shown us. Much like with Paul, though not physically present, the care for you will not diminish.

Notes from the Associate Pastor Harry

November is here and the long haul of a Phoenix summer is finally over for a few months. That alone is something that you should be thankful for. The Bible is filled with directives to give God thanks (See Psalm 106:1; 107:1; 118:1; 1 Chron. 16:34; 1 Thess. 5:18 to name a few). A lot of the verses then list reasons why we should thank Him, such as "His love endures forever" (Psalm 136:3), "He is good" (Psalm 118:29), and "His mercy is everlasting" (Psalm 100:5). Thanksgiving and praise always go together. We cannot correctly praise and worship God without also being thankful.

Feeling and expressing appreciation is good for us. Like any wise father, God wants us to learn to be thankful for <u>all</u> the gifts He has given us (James 1:17). It is in our best interest to be reminded that everything we have is a gift from Him because, without gratitude, we tend to become arrogant and self-centered. We start to believe that we have obtained everything on our own. Thankfulness keeps our hearts in a right relationship to the Giver of all good gifts.

Giving thanks also reminds us of how much we do have. We are all prone to greediness to one degree or another. We tend to focus on what we <u>don't</u> have. But by giving thanks continually we are reminded of how much we <u>do</u> have. When we focus on our blessings rather than our wants, we're happier people. When we start thanking God for the things we usually take for granted, our perspective changes. We realize that we could not even exist without the merciful blessings of God.

1 Thess. 5:18 says, "In everything give thanks; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." So, we're to be thankful not only in pleasant situations but in the circumstances that we don't like. When we actively decide to thank God regardless of what comes into our lives, we keep bitterness at bay because we can't be both thankful and bitter at the same time. It's not that we're grateful for tragedy, but we can be thankful for who God is even in the midst of tragedy. He sustains us and gives us strength to endure (see James 1:12; 2 Cor. 12:9). We thank Him for His promise that "all things will work together for the good, to those who love God and are called according to His purpose" (Rom. 8:28).

We can have thankful hearts toward God even when we don't *feel* thankful for the circumstances we're in. We can grieve and still be thankful. We can hurt and still be thankful. We can be angry at sin and still be thankful toward God. That is what the Bible calls a "sacrifice of praise" (Heb. 13:15). Giving thanks to God keeps our hearts in a right relationship with Him and saves us from a host of harmful emotions and attitudes that will rob us of the peace God wants us to experience.

Notes from the Youth Team

This school year on Wednesday nights in Youth we're using the same Adventure Club curriculum as the children - slightly revised for older students. The curriculum is designed to teach foundational truths about God and His Word. Each week an additional basic truth is added to the ones already learned along with a supporting Bible verse to be memorized.

This week, the truth we'll be covering is "God is The Creator". This is always one of my favorite things to teach, partly because the story of Creation reveals so many characteristics or attributes of God. He is self-sufficient, self-existent, eternal, omniscient, omnipotent, etc.

One of His attributes that I focus on during the Creation story is that He is an orderly God. Everything He does is with function, purpose, and intent. During the Creation week, He displays His orderliness by first forming and preparing the universe and then filling it. I use the following graphic to show how Days 1-3 each correlate to the next 3 days:

On Day 1, God created light and separated it from the darkness. Then, on Day 4, He filled it with the sun, moon, and stars. On Day 2, God separated the waters making the sky and seas. Then, on Day 5, He filled the sky and seas with living creatures that flew and swam. On Day 3, God gathered the waters together into one place and let the dry land appear. Then, on Day 6, He filled the dry land with living creatures including His most unique creation, mankind. Each of the things He created reflects His character and reminds us of His goodness. How can we do anything but worship and praise such an amazing Creator God?



Ephesians 4:29-32 says "Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those who hear. And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day of redemption. Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice. Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you.". I know it's been a lot of change, and, for us at Laveen Baptist Church, it has been quite a ride, but God has never left us. He is with us now, and we have seen His mighty hand move throughout. We will have a new president, new elected officials, a new lead pastor, youth pastor, elders and so on, but God's faithfulness and His Word never changes, and that's why it's vital we depend on God.

Brothers, I encourage you to reflect on what comes out of your mouth just as I have to analyze what comes out of mine. Let it be words that build up and not words that destroy. I also encourage you to not lose your focus of why God chose us, and that is to share the good news of salvation. I appreciate and love every one of you, and my prayers to you and your family.
