It's November and a recognized time to remember to be thankful, which is a good thing. Of course, as believers, this should be a characteristic that we display all the time. If you want to really change your attitude, grab a pen and paper and start listing everything that you're thankful for. You'll want to keep the list where you can access it easily as you'll find that you'll add to it throughout the day.

All too often, and this is very natural, we tend to focus on all of the negative things in our lives. Those things tend to be noisy, and troublesome, and demand our attention so we must intentionally choose to refocus ourselves on the myriad things that we have to be thankful for.

This is a part of what it means in Romans 12:2 to renew our minds. The concept of renewal is central to Christian doctrine, reflecting the idea of being made new in Christ. This renewal is not a one-time event but a continuous process, which speaks of being transformed by the renewing of the mind. The Greek word for "renewed" suggests a complete renovation, indicating a profound change in one's nature and character. This renewal is a work of the Holy Spirit, as seen in Titus 3:5, where the washing of regeneration and renewal by the Holy Spirit is mentioned.

This month, beyond the big day, make a real effort to focus your mind and heart on being thankful. Since you can only think of one thing at a time, how much more effective is it to being conformed to the image of Christ to be consistently thankful to the Father from whom all good things come?

Notes from the Youth Team

If you read this section of the newsletter regularly, you'll see a verse at the end of each article. It comes from Psalm 37; one of my favorites. I call it the "Fret Not" Psalm because that's how it begins in the ESV. "Fret not yourself because of evildoers, be not envious of wrongdoers! For they will soon fade like the grass and wither like the green herb." Here, fret means, "Don't lose your temper, don't get agitated" because evil seems to be all around us. It won't last forever.

It goes on to tell us how to act when we feel surrounded by evil: v. 3, "Trust in the Lord and do what is good"; v. 4, "Take delight in the Lord"; v. 5, "Commit your way to the Lord; trust in Him"; v. 7, "Be silent before the Lord and wait expectantly for Him"; v. 8, "Refrain from anger and give up your rage!" (CSB). The rest of the Psalm continues describing the actions of the wicked and how God will deal with them, as well as how the righteous who remain faithful to Him will be blessed.

The culture we live in today seems bent on glorifying evil as something to be desired; it seems you can't turn on the television, scroll through social media, walk through a shopping mall without being reminded that this is a fallen world. We can, at times, feel overwhelmed and fearful about what is going on around us. But this Psalm reminds us Who is actually in charge and teaches us how to trust in the Lord in a world gone bad.

All through God's Word there are examples of godly men and women who lived surrounded by evil. This Psalm was written by David toward the end of his life and reign (v. 25). He had lived through fighting wild animals and a giant; hunted by Saul, who wanted to end his life; many battles with the Philistines; an attempt by his son, Absalom, to take over the kingdom; and other factions in the kingdom causing unrest throughout his reign. This Psalm is his explanation of God's plans for the ungodly, and his instruction for the righteous on how to live. In short: "Do Good; Trust God; Don't Worry" (Halley's Bible Handbook; Psalms 36, 37).

No matter where God has placed you, remember this; "A person's steps are established by the Lord, and He takes pleasure in his way. Though he falls, he will <u>not</u> be overwhelmed, because the Lord supports him with His hand." (v. 23-24, CSB). He will take care of the wicked in His own time. In the meantime, if you're feeling agitated, fearful, or surrounded; I recommend that you read Psalm 37 – more than once. (I like the Christian Standard Bible version.)

"Commit your way to the Lord; trust in Him, and He will act." Psalm 37:5






