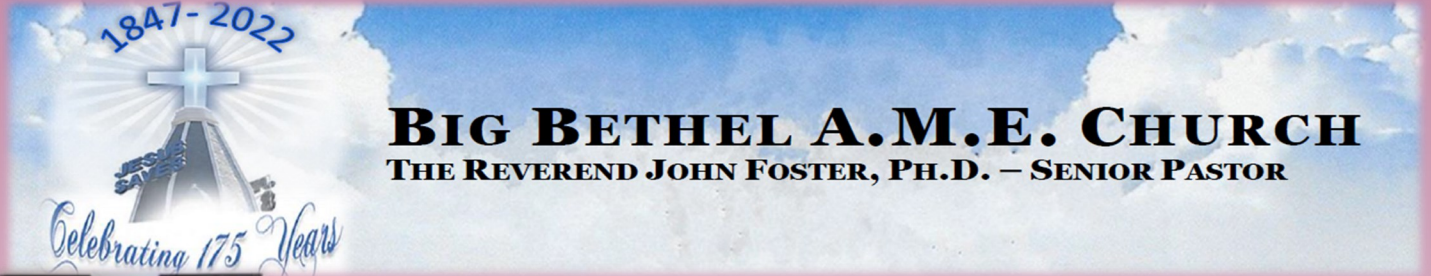

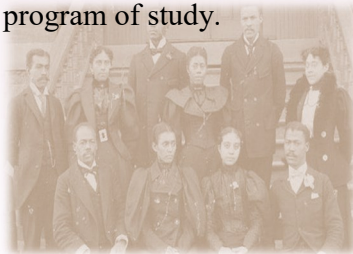
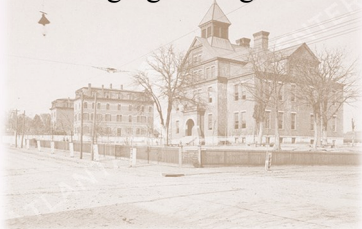
*Pride of earth, Gav'st to me another birth, Haven for all hungry souls, Feeding them shall be Thy goal,

The circumstances that evoked the founding of Morris Brown are traditionally linked to a visit by a group of Clark College trustees to Big Bethel Church to interest the African Methodist Episcopal Church (AME Church) supporters in furnishing a room in their institution. In response to the proposition, layman Steward Wiley said, "If we can furnish a room at Clark College, why can't we build a school of our own?" These words ignited a flame in the mind of Reverend Wesley John Gaines who went on to become the founder of Morris Brown College.

On January 5, 1881, during the North Georgia Annual Conference at Big Bethel, Rev. Gaines introduced a resolution calling for the establishment in Atlanta of an institution for the moral, spiritual, and intellectual growth of Negro boys and girls. The steps between the resolution and the opening were few and simple: the Georgia Conference was persuaded to join the endeavor. An assembly of trustees from both conferences convened at Big Bethel and selected the Boulevard site as the school's home. In May of 1885, the State of Georgia granted a charter to Morris Brown College of the AME Church.

On October 15, 1885, just 20 years after Abraham Lincoln signed the Emancipation Proclamation, 107 students and nine teachers walked into a crude wooden structure at the corner of Boulevard and Houston Streets in Atlanta, Georgia, marking the opening of the first educational institution in Georgia under sole African-American patronage. That institution was Morris Brown College, named to honor the memory of the second consecrated Bishop of the AME Church. In this conception, Morris Brown College was established on Christian beliefs and chartered as a private, coeducational, liberal arts college engaged in teaching, research, and public service in the arts, humanities, social and natural sciences and professional programs. The mission of Morris Brown College is to provide educational opportunities in a positive and nurturing environment that will enable its students to become fully functional persons in our global society.

Morris Brown College, in its commitment to academic excellence, provides experiences that foster and enhance intellectual, personal, and interpersonal development for students who have demonstrated the potential to compete in a challenging undergraduate liberal arts program of study.

Reverend Alonzo B. Taylor,

Reverend Alonzo B. Taylor is the son of the late John Taylor and Sheila Taylor of Edison, Georgia. He began studying the piano at the age of eight under the guidance of Mrs. O. P. Prather in Cuthbert, Georgia. At age 16, Reverend Taylor served as the lead musician for Bethel AME in Ft. Gaines, Georgia. After finishing high school, Randolph-Clay High School in Cuthbert, Georgia, Reverend Taylor ventured to Morris Brown College in Atlanta, Georgia, where he joined the Morris Brown Concert Choir and became the student Director under Dr. Sharon J. Willis in 1999. As a student, he also studied voice under Dr. Oliver N. Greene and Alteouise DeVaughn. He received a Bachelor of Science Degree in Music Education with a concentration in vocal performance in 2002. After completing college, he accepted a position in the Atlanta Public Schools System as an elementary music teacher. This year marks his 21st year as a teacher of elementary music.

While attending Morris Brown College, he joined the Americolor Opera Alliance and his opera credits include: The Opera Singer, The Herndons, Laroche, Three Kings and a Prince, King Solomon, and Pink Lady. He made his solo debut in 2005 with his role of Gus in the Great Divide. In addition to singing with Americolor, Reverend Taylor has performed with TTB, an ensemble consisting of himself, Kevin Tucker, and Jonathan Blanchard. Reverend Taylor has served numerous churches around the Metro Atlanta Area including: All Good Road United Methodist Church, Peace Lutheran Church and Riverdale First United Methodist Church. His longest tenures were served as Minister of Music of St. Mark Lutheran Church and the Director of the Cathedral Choir at Central United Methodist Church. He currently serves as the Director of the Team Lutheran Singers and the Morris Brown College Alumni Choir. In addition to his degree in Music Education, Reverend Taylor possesses a Masters of Teaching from Grand Canyon University. He also obtained a Masters of Biblical Counseling as well as a Masters of Divinity from Luther Rice Seminary. He is currently a doctoral candidate at Liberty University. Reverend Taylor is a 15-year veteran of the United States Army Forces and was commissioned as a chaplain candidate in 2009. He is married to his wife of 18 years, Zipporah, where their union created three sons: Micah, John and Timothy.

Legacy Dedication to the Women of Usherette Board Number 2

The Usherette Board Number 2 began with a vision that called a group of women to serve unselfishly for the Big Bethel African Methodist Episcopal Church and the community it empowers. The late Mrs. Viola Miller, a dedicated member, fulfilled this vision in 1931 by establishing the Junior Usherette Board during the pastorate of the Reverend B.G. Dawson. The mission of this Board was to serve with a pure heart and welcome each member and visitor in love and with a renewed spirit.

The Board was later renamed *Usherette Board Number 2* due to its growing membership and responsibilities. One of the most critical responsibilities placed on the newly established Board was to serve on Holy Communion Sunday. As is the custom of the AME Church to dress the sanctuary in white on Holy Communion Sunday, so is the uniform of the Board today, which consists of a white skirt suite accented with a corsage and a single strand of pearl jewelry.

Presenting the Annual Palm Sunday Concert was also included as a responsibility of *Usherette Board Number 2*. To date, for more than 90 years, the concert has served as a way to share in the joy and celebratory spirit that was demonstrated when Jesus entered Jerusalem. It also serves as a primary contributor to the cultural component of Big Bethel AME Church as it highlights outstanding musical artists, choirs, and groups in the City of Atlanta.

Today, *Usherette Board Number 2* is pleased to present the ***Morris Brown College Alumni Choir*** for an encore presentation where we acknowledge our theme, *Walking in Humility*. The Annual Palm Sunday Concert further serves as a milestone where the members reflect on the legacy of the Board. In this, *Usherette Board Number 2* commemorates this section of its **2024 Annual Palm Sunday Concert** journal to the legacy of the sisters who laid the foundation as well as those members who continue to work within the legacy.

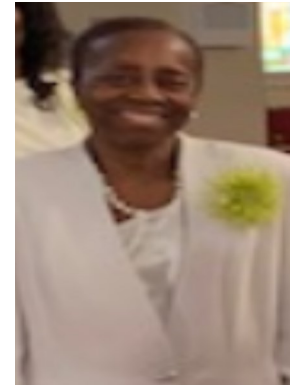
