In the Unite;d States, the process of certifying votes after the polls close involves several steps at the local, state, and sometimes federal levels.

Here's an overview of the general process:

- 1. Closing the Polls and Initial Vote Counting
- 2. County-Level Canvassing
- 3. State-Level Certification
- 4. Certification of Electors (for Presidential Elections)
- **5. Congressional Certification (for Presidential Elections)**
- 6. Challenging the Results
- 7. Final Certification and Declaration of Results

Each of the seven steps to certify the election traditionally were normally considered routine. The 2020 presidential election raised issues and now these standard processes can present challenges. Especially step number 7 (see below the process for step number 7).

Certification of Presidential Election (for Presidential Elections)

- 1. Governor and state officials sign a Certificate of Ascertainment
- 2. Legal Challenges and Recounts
- 3. Legal Challenges and Recounts

I am requesting that we pay very close attention to what happens after November 5^{th,} after the polls are close. Peaceful but vigilant protests may be required.

Equity not Reparations (The final Analysis)

In the previous articles, I wrote about the how and why of the difference between reparations and equity being realized to our people and what this equity looks like. I know there is a growing consensus of brothers and sisters who desire some form of direct payment or cash disbursements to individual families. I don't believe that would benefit us as a collective due to the fact we as a people tend to not look at the big picture (i.e. the future).

Let's start with **Educational support**:

Free or subsidized higher education, vocational training, or enhanced K-12 programs in our communities. Education is how we compete and keep up with the world. There is a growing population in the country that is anti-intellectual, anti-science, the public school system in black and brown communities have been turned into gladiator schools by design, and only Intervention by some serious educators with a strong funding resource, in this case the United States Government. This is what I would deem an easy fix if all parties involved are focused on the big picture.

Housing assistance:

Grants or low-interest loans for home purchases, repairs, property tax relief. Home and land ownership is in my opinion the bridge to creating generational wealth.

Business Support:

Grants, or low-interest loans for home purchases, repairs, or property tax relief.

Community Investment:

Funding for infrastructure improvements, cultural centers, or public services in historically Black communities.

Healthcare initiatives:

Targeted programs to address health disparities and improve access to medical care.

Land Grants:

Allocation of public lands or support for land acquisition.

Tax Credits:

Specific tax benefits for eligible individuals or businesses.

Historical preservation:

Funding for museums, and education programs focused on our history.

Legal support:

Resources for addressing discriminatory practices or policies.

Estimating the cost of comprehensive reparations programs, including housing initiatives, is complex and would vary significantly depending on the scope, scale, and specific measures implemented. Without a concrete proposal or defined parameters, it's challenging to provide a precise figure. However, I can offer some perspective on the potential scale:

- 1. National estimates: Some economists and policy researchers have attempted to calculate the cost of national-level reparations. These estimates often range from hundreds of billions to several trillion dollars, depending on the approach.
- 2. Housing-specific costs: The housing component alone could be substantial. For context, consider that the racial wealth gap in the U.S. is significantly tied to homeownership disparities. A 2019 study by the Brookings Institution estimated the gap in housing wealth between Black and white families at about \$3.7 trillion.
- 3. State-level examples: California's Reparations Task Force, while not providing a total **figure**, **has discussed potential housing-related reparations that could amount to** hundreds of thousands of dollars per eligible individual for property seizures lone.
- 4. Program-specific costs: Individual programs within a larger reparation's framework could have widely varying costs:
 - A robust down payment assistance program could cost billions annually if implemented broadly.
 - Property tax relief programs could result in significant revenue reductions for local governments.
 - Large-scale public housing improvements or new construction could run into tens of billions of dollars.
- 5. Factors affecting cost:
 - The number of eligible recipients
 - The geographic scope (national vs. state vs. local)
 - The depth and breadth of programs offered
 - The timeframe for Implementation
 - Economic conditions and housing market dynamics

6. Potential offsets: Some argue that reparations programs could generate economic benefits that offset costs over time, such as increased economic activity, reduced reliance on social programs, and improved community health outcomes.

Given the lack of a specific, widely-agreed-upon plan, these figures are highly speculative. The actual cost would depend on political decisions, economic factors, and the specific design of any implemented programs.

For accurate, up-to-date cost estimates, it would be necessary to consult recent economic analyses or policy proposals from reputable sources. The costs and potential impacts of reparations programs remain a subject of ongoing research and debate among policymakers, economists, and scholars.

This is the blueprint. For it to work it will have to be through the legislative process. Getting control of one of the major political parties is ground zero. This will be a major task for our people, **VOTE**, **VOTE**, **and VOTE**! That's the game plan. We must do it in numbers and it must be strategic.

These numbers I share with you all are Al driven.

These articles were never based on what I thought was owed to us but simply put, it was a matter of us as a race who have a vested interest in her adopted homeland in which many of our descendants made the ultimate sacrifice, fought in the many wars waged by politicians who only saw us as cannon fodder. Check Your Voter Status

Verify Local Voting Rules & Locations

Double Check Your Voting Location and hours of operation

- Locate Your Early Voting Poll Location (if applicable)
- Verify Your ID Matches Your Voter Registration Info
- Print/Scan Your Precinct Card
- Print Your Sample Ballot
- Pack your Patience!!
- If your eligibility to vote is challenged by an Elector, request a Provisional Ballot
- Be sure to review your printed ballot before you submit it
- Verify your ballot status online to confirm it was accepted

Did You Know?

- You can be purged/removed from the voter roll if you have not voted, updated your voter registration or renewed your license/state id for three years.
- If you were previously convicted of a felony, you may be eligible to vote?
- That you cannot be arrested for outstanding warrants on your way to/from the polls?
- My Voter Page has been updated with a Ballot Tracking Notifications? Sign up today!
- That seniors or physically impaired voters have additional rights?
 If you are unable to stand in line, you can:
 - Request to be moved to the front of the line if you are voting between 9:30am-4:30pm (polls are open from 7am -7pm)
 - · Request that a chair be provided or refuse to accept a chair
 - Request to have your place in line held and notified when it is your turn

Did You Know (cont'd)?

- You may be eligible to vote via a provisional ballot if you are a registered voter and:
 - You arrive at a polling place, absentee polling place or a registration office in your county of residence and your name is not listed on the registered electors list.
 - You arrive at a polling place in your county of residence but not your assigned precinct and it is after 5:00 p.m. but before the regularly scheduled closing time you may be allowed to cast a provisional ballot. You will likely be required to execute a sworn statement that indicates that you are unable to get to your correct location prior to poll closing.
 - If your polling location should encounter any conditions/issues (i.e., late opening, voter machine outages/down time, water leaks, etc.) that prevent access for the same amount of time as every other polling location in the state, they are required to allow you equal access to voting.

- The Board of Commissioners in Cobb County, are equipping their election workers with so-called panic buttons that would allow them to quickly contact authorities in emergencies.
- The 2020 election was determined by an average of only 80 votes in counties like yours? That's it. Your vote and your county are that powerful!
