And I say to this man, ‘Go,’ and he goes, and to another, ‘Come,’ and he comes, and to my servant, ‘Do this,’ and he does it.” ¹⁰When Jesus heard it, He was amazed and said to those who followed, “Truly I say to you, I have not found such great faith, no, not in Israel. ¹¹And I say to you that many will come from the east and west and will dine with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob in the kingdom of heaven. ¹²But the sons of the kingdom will be thrown out into outer darkness. There will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.” ¹³Then Jesus said to the centurion, “Go your way. And as you have believed, so let it be done for you.” And his servant was healed that very moment.

Healing is as Easy as Salvation

² They brought to Him a man sick with paralysis, lying on a bed. And Jesus, seeing their faith, said to the paralytic, “Son, be of good cheer. Your sins are forgiven you.” ³ Then certain scribes said within themselves, “This Man blasphemeth.” ⁴ Jesus, knowing their thoughts, said, “Why do you think evil in your hearts? ⁵ For which is easier, to say, ‘Your sins are forgiven you’ or to say, ‘Arise and walk’? ⁶ But that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins” – then He said to the paralytic, “Arise, pick up your bed, and go into your house.” ⁷ And he rose and departed to his house. ⁸ But when the crowds saw it, they were amazed and glorified God who had given such authority to men.

The Healing of Two Blind Men

²⁷ As Jesus departed from there, two blind men followed Him, crying out and saying, "Son of David, have mercy on us!" ²⁸ When He entered the house, the blind men came to Him. And Jesus said to them, "Do you believe that I am able to do this?" They said to Him, "Yes, Lord." ²⁹ Then He touched their eyes, saying, "According to your faith, let it be done for you." ³⁰ And their eyes were opened, and Jesus strictly commanded them, saying, "See that no one knows of it." ³¹ But when they had departed, they spread His fame in all that region.

The Healing of a Mute Man

³² As they went out, they brought to Him a mute man possessed with a demon. ³³ And when the demon was cast out, the mute man spoke, and the

crowds were amazed, saying, “This has never been seen in Israel.” ³⁴ But the Pharisees said, “He casts out demons through the ruler of the demons.”

Jesus Defeats Satan By Healing a Blind Mute

²² Then one possessed with a demon was brought to Him, blind and mute, and He healed him, so that the blind and mute man both spoke and saw. ²³ All the people were amazed and said, “Is He not the Son of David?” ²⁴ But when the Pharisees heard it, they said, “This Man does not cast out demons, except by Beelzebub the ruler of the demons.” ²⁵ Jesus knew their thoughts and said to them, “Every kingdom divided against itself is brought to desolation. And every city or house divided against itself will not stand. ²⁶ If Satan casts out Satan, he is divided against himself. Then how will his kingdom stand? ²⁷ And if I cast out demons by Beelzebub, by whom do your sons cast them

out? Therefore, they shall be your judges. ²⁸ But if I cast out demons by the Spirit of God, then the kingdom of God has come upon you.

Receive the word but Have Root

Jesus Healed Them ALL

³⁴ When they had crossed over, they came to the land of Gennesaret. ³⁵ And when the men of that place recognized Him, they sent word to all the surrounding country and brought to Him all who were sick, ³⁶ and begged Him that they might only touch the hem of His garment. And as many as touched it were made perfectly well.

²⁹ Jesus departed from there, and passed by the Sea of Galilee, and went up on a mountain and sat down there. ³⁰ Great crowds came to Him, having with them those who were lame, blind, mute, maimed, and many others, and placed them down at Jesus' feet, and He healed them, ³¹ so that the crowds wondered when they saw the mute speak, the maimed made whole, the lame walk, and the blind see. And they glorified the God of Israel.

¹ Now when Jesus finished these sayings, He departed from Galilee and came into the region of Judea beyond the Jordan. ² Large crowds followed Him, and He healed them there.

Matthew 20:29-34

The Healing of Two Blind Men

²⁹ As they departed from Jericho, a large crowd followed Him. ³⁰ There, two blind men sitting by the road, when they heard that Jesus was passing by, cried out, "Have mercy on us, O Lord, Son of David!" ³¹ The crowd rebuked them, that they should be silent. But they cried out even more, "Have mercy on us, O Lord, Son of David!" ³² Jesus stood still and called them, saying, "What do you want Me to do for you?" ³³ They said to Him, "Lord, let our eyes be opened." ³⁴ So Jesus had compassion on them and touched their eyes. Immediately their eyes received sight, and they followed Him.

Jesus Healed ALL That Came to Him

¹⁴ The blind and the lame came to Him in the temple, and He healed them.

Matthew 24:35

Jesus' Words Will NEVER Pass Away

³⁵ Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will never pass away.

Mark 1:23-28

Jesus (and Believers) Have Authority

²³ In their synagogue there was a man with an unclean spirit. ²⁴ And he cried out, "Leave us alone! What do You have to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have You come to destroy us? I know who You are, the Holy One of God." ²⁵ Jesus rebuked him, saying, "Be silent and come out of him!" ²⁶ When the unclean spirit had convulsed him and cried out with a loud voice, it came out of him. ²⁷ They were all amazed, so that they questioned among themselves, "What is this? What new teaching is this? With authority He commands even the unclean spirits, and they obey Him." ²⁸ Immediately His fame spread everywhere throughout the region surrounding Galilee.

Mark 1:29-31

Jesus Healed Peter's Mother-in-law

²⁹ When He came out of the synagogue with James and John, they went directly to the house of Simon and Andrew. ³⁰ The mother of Simon's wife lay sick with a fever, and immediately they told Him of her. ³¹ So He came and took her by the hand and lifted her up, and immediately the fever left her. And she served them.

Mark 1:32-34

Jesus Healed Them ALL

³² In the evening, when the sun had set, they brought to Him all who were sick and those who were possessed with demons. ³³ The whole city was gathered at the door, ³⁴ and He healed many who were sick with various diseases and cast out many demons. And He did not let the demons speak, because they knew Him.

Mark 1:40-42

The Cleansing of a Leper

⁴⁰ A leper came to Him, pleading with Him and kneeling before Him, saying, "If You are willing, You can make me clean." ⁴¹ Then Jesus, moved with compassion, extended His hand and touched him, and said to him, "I will. Be clean." ⁴² As soon as He had spoken, the leprosy immediately departed from him, and he was cleansed.

Mark 2:1-12

The Healing of a Paralytic

Again, He entered Capernaum after some days. And it was reported that He was in the house. ² Immediately many were gathered together, so that there was no room to receive them, not even at the door. And He preached the word to them. ³ They came to Him bringing one sick with

paralysis, who was carried by four men. ⁴When they could not come near Him due to the crowding, they uncovered the roof where He was. When they had broken it open, they let down the bed on which the paralytic lay. ⁵When Jesus saw their faith, He said to the paralytic, "Son, your sins are forgiven you." ⁶But some of the scribes were sitting there, reasoning in their hearts, ⁷"Why does this Man speak such blasphemies? Who can forgive sins but God alone?" ⁸Immediately, when Jesus perceived in His spirit that they so reasoned within themselves, He said to them, "Why do you contemplate these things in your hearts? ⁹Which is easier to say to the paralytic: 'Your sins are forgiven you,' or to say, 'Rise, take up your bed and walk'? ¹⁰But that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins," He said to the paralytic, ¹¹"I say to you, rise, and take up your bed, and go your way to your house." ¹²Immediately he rose, picked up the bed, and went out in front of them all, so that they were all amazed and glorified God, saying, "We never saw anything like this!"

Mark 3:1-5

The Man With a Withered Hand

Again, He entered the synagogue, and there was a man who had a withered hand. ²They watched Him to see whether He would heal him on the Sabbath, so that they might accuse Him. ³He said to the man who had the withered hand, "Stand up." ⁴Then He

said to them, “Is it lawful to do good or to do evil on the Sabbath, to save life or to kill?” But they kept silent. ⁵ When He had looked around at them with anger, being grieved for the hardness of their hearts, He said to the man, “Stretch your hand forward.” He stretched it out, and his hand was restored as whole as the other.

Mark 3:7-12

The Crowd at the Seaside

⁷ Jesus withdrew with His disciples to the sea. And a great crowd followed Him from Galilee and Judea ⁸ and Jerusalem, and Idumea, and from beyond the Jordan. And those from Tyre and Sidon, a great crowd, when they heard what great things He did, came to Him. ⁹ He told the disciples to have a small boat ready for Him because of the crowd, lest they should crush Him. ¹⁰ For He had healed many, so that all who had diseases pressed on Him to touch Him. ¹¹ When unclean spirits saw Him, they fell down before Him, crying out, “You are the Son of God.” ¹² But He sternly ordered them not to make Him known.

Mark 5:1- 43

The Healing of the Gadarene Demonic

They went to the other side of the sea to the region of the Gadarenes. ² When He had come out of the boat, immediately a man with an unclean spirit

came out of the tombs and met Him. ³ He lived among the tombs. And no one could constrain him, not even with chains, ⁴ because he had often been bound with shackles and chains. But he had pulled the chains apart and broken the shackles to pieces. And no one could subdue him. ⁵ Always, night and day, he was in the mountains and in the tombs, crying out and cutting himself with stones. ⁶ But when he saw Jesus afar off, he ran up and kneeled before Him, ⁷ and cried out with a loud voice, "What have You to do with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I adjure You by God, do not torment me." ⁸ For Jesus said to him, "Come out of the man, you unclean spirit!" ⁹ Then He asked him, "What is your name?"

He answered, "My name is Legion. For we are many." ¹⁰ And he begged Him repeatedly not to send them away out of the country. ¹¹ Now there was a great herd of swine feeding near the mountains. ¹² All the demons pleaded with Him, asking, "Send us to the swine, so that we may enter them." ¹³ At once, Jesus gave them leave. Then the unclean spirits came out and entered the swine. And the herd, numbering about two thousand, ran wildly down a steep hill into the sea and were drowned in the sea. ¹⁴ Those who fed the swine fled and reported it in the city and in the country. And people went out to see what it was that had happened. ¹⁵ They came to Jesus and saw him who had been possessed with the legion of demons

sitting and clothed and in his right mind. And they were afraid. ¹⁶ Those who saw it told them how it befell him who had been possessed with the demons and also concerning the swine. ¹⁷ Then they began to plead with Him to depart out of their region. ¹⁸ When He entered the boat, he who had been possessed with the demons prayed Him that he might be with Him. ¹⁹ Jesus did not let him, but said to him, "Go home to your friends and tell them what great things the Lord has done for you and how He has had compassion on you." ²⁰ So he departed and began to proclaim in the Decapolis^[a] what great things Jesus had done for him. And everyone was amazed.

Jairus' Daughter and the Woman Who Touched Jesus' Garment

²¹ When Jesus had crossed again by boat to the other side, many people gathered to Him. And He was beside the sea. ²² One of the rulers of the synagogue, named Jairus, saw Jesus and came and fell at His feet ²³ and earnestly asked Him, "My little daughter is lying at the point of death. I ask You, come and lay Your hands on her, so that she may be healed. And she will live." ²⁴ So Jesus went with him. And many people followed Him and pressed in on Him. ²⁵ And a certain woman had a hemorrhage for twelve years, ²⁶ and had suffered much under many physicians. She had spent all that she had, and was not better but rather grew worse. ²⁷ When she had

heard of Jesus, she came in the crowd behind Him and touched His garment. ²⁸ For she said, "If I may touch His garments, I shall be healed." ²⁹ And immediately her hemorrhage dried up, and she felt in her body that she was healed of the affliction. ³⁰ At once, Jesus knew within Himself that power had gone out of Him. He turned around in the crowd and said, "Who touched My garments?" ³¹ His disciples said to Him, "You see the crowd pressing against You, and You say, 'Who touched Me?' " ³² And He looked around to see her who had done it. ³³ But the woman, fearing and trembling, knowing what had happened to her, came and fell down before Him and told Him the entire truth. ³⁴ He said to her, "Daughter, your faith has made you well. Go in peace and be healed of your affliction." ³⁵ While He was still speaking, some came from the house of the synagogue ruler and said, "Your daughter is dead. Why trouble the Teacher any further?" ³⁶ As soon as Jesus heard the word that was spoken, He said to the ruler of the synagogue, "Do not be afraid, only believe." ³⁷ He let no one follow Him, except Peter, and James, and John the brother of James. ³⁸ He came to the house of the ruler of the synagogue, and saw the tumult, and those who wept and wailed loudly. ³⁹ When He came in, He said to them, "Why make this uproar and weep? The girl is not dead but sleeping." ⁴⁰ They laughed at Him in ridicule. But when He had put them all out, He took the father and the mother of the girl and those who were with

Him and entered where the girl was lying. ⁴¹ He took the girl by the hand and said to her, “Talitha cumi,” which means, “Little girl, I say to you, arise.” ⁴² Immediately the girl arose and walked, for she was twelve years of age. And they were greatly astonished. ⁴³ He strictly ordered them to let no one know of it and directed them to give her something to eat.

Mark 6:5,6

Jesus Healed Even in the Midst of Unbelief

⁵ He could not do any miracles there, except that He laid His hands on a few sick people and healed them. ⁶ And He was amazed because of their unbelief.

Mark 6:7-13

Jesus Gave Power to His Disciples

⁷ He called to Him the twelve, and began to send them out two by two, and gave them authority over unclean spirits. ⁸ He commanded them to take nothing for their journey except a staff: no bag, no bread, and no money in their purse, ⁹ but to wear sandals, and not put on two tunics. ¹⁰ He said to them, “Wherever you enter a house, remain there until you depart from that place. ¹¹ And whoever will not receive you or hear you, when you depart from there, shake the dust off your feet as a testimony against them. Truly I say to you, it will be

more tolerable for Sodom and Gomorrah on the Day of Judgment than for that city.”¹² So they went out and preached that men should repent.¹³ And they cast out many demons and anointed with oil many who were sick and healed them.

Mark 6:53-56

The Healing of the Sick in Gennesaret

⁵³ When they had crossed over, they came to the land of Gennesaret and anchored on the shore. ⁵⁴ When they had come out of the boat, immediately the people recognized Him, ⁵⁵ and ran throughout the surrounding region, and began to carry the sick on beds to wherever they heard He was. ⁵⁶ And wherever He entered, into villages, cities, or the country, they laid the sick in the marketplaces and pleaded with Him that they might touch even the fringe of His garment. And as many as touched Him were healed.

Mark 7:25-37

Healing and Deliverance are the Children's Bread

²⁵ For a certain woman, whose young daughter had an unclean spirit, heard of Him, and came and fell at His feet. ²⁶ The woman was a Greek, a Syrophenician by race. And she begged Him to cast the demon out of her daughter. ²⁷ Jesus said to her, “Let the children first be filled. For it is not fitting to take the children's bread and throw it to

the dogs.”²⁸ She answered, “Yes, Lord. Yet the dogs under the table eat the children’s crumbs.”²⁹ Then He said to her, “For this answer, go your way. The demon has gone out of your daughter.”³⁰ When she had come to her house, she found the demon had gone out, and her daughter lying on the bed.

The Deaf and Mute Man Healed

³¹ Again, departing from the region of Tyre and Sidon, He came to the Sea of Galilee, through the region of the Decapolis.³² They brought to Him one who was deaf and had difficulty speaking. And they pleaded with Him to put His hand on him.

³³ He took him aside from the crowd, and put His fingers into his ears, and spat and touched his tongue.³⁴ Looking up to heaven, He sighed, and said to him, “Ephphatha,” that is, “Be opened.”³⁵ Immediately his ears were opened, and the impediment of his tongue was loosened, and he spoke correctly.³⁶ He ordered them to tell no one. But the more He ordered them, the more they greatly proclaimed it.³⁷ They were astonished beyond measure, saying, “He has done all things well. He makes both the deaf to hear and the mute to speak.”

Mark 8:22-25

The Healing of a Blind Man at Bethsaida

²² He came to Bethsaida. And they brought a blind man to Him and entreated Him to touch him. ²³ He took the blind man by the hand and led him out of the town. When He had spit on his eyes and put His hands on him, He asked him, “Do you see anything?” ²⁴ He looked up and said, “I see men as trees, walking.” ²⁵ Then again, He put His hands on his eyes and made him look up. And he was restored and saw everyone clearly.

Mark 9:17-29

Jesus Heals Even with Unbelief Present

¹⁷ One in the crowd answered, “Teacher, I brought You my son, who has a mute spirit. ¹⁸ Wherever it takes hold on him, it dashes him to the ground. And he foams at the mouth and gnashes with his teeth and becomes rigid. And I told Your disciples so that they would cast it out, but they could not.” ¹⁹ He answered, “O faithless generation, how long shall I be with you? How long shall I bear with you? Bring him to Me.” ²⁰ So they brought the boy to Him. When he saw Him, immediately the spirit dashed him, and he fell on the ground and wallowed, foaming at the mouth. ²¹ He asked his father, “How long has it been since it came to him?” He said, “From childhood. ²² Often it has thrown him into the fire and into the water to kill him. But if You can

do anything, have compassion on us and help us.”²³ Jesus said, “If you can believe, all things are possible to him who believes.”²⁴ Immediately the father of the child cried out with tears, “Lord, I believe. Help my unbelief!”²⁵ When Jesus saw that the people came running together, He rebuked the foul spirit, saying to it, “You mute and deaf spirit, I command you, come out of him, and enter him no more.”²⁶ The spirit cried out and convulsed him greatly. But it came out of him, and he was as dead, so that many said, “He is dead.”²⁷ But Jesus took him by the hand and lifted him up, and he arose.²⁸ When He had entered the house, His disciples asked Him privately, “Why could we not cast it out?”²⁹ He said to them, “This kind cannot come out except by prayer and fasting.”

The Healing of Blind Bartimaeus

⁴⁶ Then they came to Jericho. And as He went out of Jericho with His disciples and a great number of people, blind Bartimaeus, the son of Timaeus, sat along the way begging.⁴⁷ When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to cry out, “Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!”⁴⁸ Many ordered him to keep silent. But he cried out even more, “Son of David, have mercy on me!”⁴⁹ Jesus stood still and commanded him to be called. So they called the blind man, saying, “Be of good comfort. Rise, He is calling you.”⁵⁰ Throwing aside his garment, he rose

and came to Jesus. ⁵¹ Jesus answered him, “What do you want Me to do for you?” The blind man said to Him, “Rabbi, that I might receive my sight.” ⁵² Jesus said to him, “Go your way. Your faith has made you well.” Immediately he received his sight and followed Jesus on the way.

Speak to Your Mountain of Sickness

²² Jesus answered them, “Have faith in God. ²³ For truly I say to you, whoever says to this mountain, ‘Be removed and be thrown into the sea,’ and does not doubt in his heart, but believes that what he says will come to pass, he will have whatever he says. ²⁴ Therefore I say to you, whatever things you ask when you pray, believe that you will receive them, and you will have them. ²⁵ And when you stand praying, forgive if you have anything against anyone, so that your Father who is in heaven may also forgive you your sins. ²⁶ But if you do not forgive, neither will your Father who is in heaven forgive your sins.”

God!” ³⁵ Jesus rebuked him, saying, “Be silent, and

The Healing of Many People

³⁸ He went out of the synagogue and entered Simon's house. Now Simon's mother-in-law was taken ill with a high fever, and they asked Him about her. ³⁹ So He stood over her and rebuked the fever, and it left her. And immediately she rose and served them. ⁴⁰ Now when the sun was setting, all those who had anyone sick with various diseases brought them to Him. And He laid His hands on every one of them and healed them. ⁴¹ And demons came out of many, crying out, "You are the Christ, the Son of God!" But He rebuked them and did not permit them to speak, because they knew that He was the Christ.

The Healing of a Paralytic

¹⁷ On a certain day, as He was teaching, Pharisees and teachers of the law were sitting nearby, who had come from every town of Galilee and Judea and from Jerusalem. And the power of the Lord was present to heal the sick. ¹⁸ Now some men brought in a bed a man who was paralyzed. They searched for ways to bring him in and lay him before Him. ¹⁹ When they could not find a way to bring him in, because of the crowd, they went up on the roof and let him down through the tiles with his bed into their midst before Jesus.

²¹ The scribes and the Pharisees began to question, "Who is He who speaks blasphemies? Who can forgive sins but God alone?" ²² When Jesus perceived their thoughts, He answered them, "Why question in your hearts? ²³ Which is easier, to say, 'Your sins are forgiven you,' or to say, 'Rise up and

walk'? ²⁴ But that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins," He said to the paralyzed man, "I say to you, rise, take up your bed, and go to your house." ²⁵ Immediately he rose before them, and took up that on which he lay, and departed to his own house, glorifying God. ²⁶ They were all amazed, and they glorified God and were filled with fear, saying, "We have seen wonderful things today."

The Man with a Withered Hand

⁶ On another Sabbath, when He entered the synagogue and taught, there was a man whose right hand had withered. ⁷ The scribes and the Pharisees watched Him to see whether He would heal on the Sabbath, so that they might find an accusation against Him. ⁸ But He knew their thoughts, and He said to the man who had the withered hand, "Rise and stand in front." The Healing of a Centurion’s Servant

When He had completed all His words in the hearing of the people, He entered Capernaum. ² Now a centurion’s^[a] servant, who was dear to him, was sick and ready to die. ³ When he heard of Jesus, he sent the elders of the Jews to Him, asking Him to come and heal his servant. ⁴ When

they came to Jesus, they asked Him earnestly, saying, “You should do this for him for he is worthy, ⁵ for he loves our nation, and he has built us a synagogue.” ⁶ So Jesus went with them. When He was not far from the house, the centurion sent friends to Him, saying, “Lord, do not trouble Yourself, for I am not worthy to have You come under my roof. ⁷ Likewise, I did not think myself worthy to come to You. But say the word, and my servant will be healed. ⁸ For I myself am a man placed under authority, having soldiers under me. I say to one, ‘Go,’ and he goes, and to another, ‘Come,’ and he comes, and to my servant, ‘Do this,’ and he does it.” ⁹ When Jesus heard these words, He marveled at him, and turned and said to the people who followed Him, “I tell you, I have not found such great faith even in Israel.” ¹⁰ Then those who were sent, returning to the house, found the servant well who had been sick.

Luke 7:11-19

The Raising of the Widow’s Son

¹¹ The following day He went into a city called Nain, and many of His disciples and a large crowd went with Him. ¹² When He came near the gate of the city, a man who had died was being carried out, the only son of his mother, and she was a widow. And a large crowd from the city was with her. ¹³ When the Lord saw her, He had compassion on her and said to her, “Do not weep.” ¹⁴ Then He came and

touched the coffin, and those who carried it stood still. He said, "Young man, I say to you, arise." ¹⁵ He who was dead sat up and began to speak. And He gave him to his mother. ¹⁶ Fear came on everyone. And they glorified God, saying, "A great prophet has risen up among us!" and "God has visited His people!" ¹⁷ This rumor of Him went throughout all Judea and the surrounding region. ¹⁸ The disciples of John told him of all these things. ¹⁹ John, calling for two of his disciples, sent them to Jesus, saying, "Are You the One who is coming, or shall we look for another?"

Jesus Gives His Authority to His Disciples

¹ Then He called His twelve disciples together and gave them power and authority over all demons and to cure diseases. ² And He sent them to preach the kingdom of God and to heal the sick. ⁶ So they departed and went through the towns, preaching the gospel and healing everywhere. ¹¹ But when the crowds knew it, they followed Him. And He welcomed them and spoke to them about the kingdom of God, and healed those who had need of healing. ⁵⁶ For the Son of Man did not come to destroy men's lives but to save them." And they went to another village. After this the Lord appointed seventy others, and sent them two by two ahead of Him into every city and place where

He Himself was about to come. ⁸“When you enter a city and they receive you, eat what is set before you. ⁹Heal the sick who are there and say to them, ‘The kingdom of God has come near to you.’ ¹⁹Look, I give you authority to trample on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy. And nothing shall by any means hurt you.

Jesus Freed a Woman as Soon as He Saw Her

¹¹ And there was a woman who had a spirit of infirmity for eighteen years and was bent over and could not straighten herself up. ¹²When Jesus saw her, He called her and said to her, “Woman, you are loosed from your infirmity.” ¹³Then He laid His hands on her, and immediately she was made straight and glorified God. ¹⁶Then should not this woman, being a daughter of Abraham, whom Satan has bound these eighteen years, be loosed from this bondage on the Sabbath?”

And he was a Samaritan. ¹⁷ Jesus said, "Were not the ten cleansed? The Healing of a Blind Beggar Near Jericho

³⁵ As He was drawing near Jericho, a certain blind man sat along the way begging. ³⁶ Hearing a crowd passing by, he asked what it meant. ³⁷ They told him that Jesus of Nazareth was passing by. ³⁸ He cried out, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" ³⁹ Those who went in front rebuked him, so that he would keep quiet. But he cried out much more, "Son of David, have mercy on me!" ⁴⁰ Jesus stood and commanded him to be brought to Him. When

he came near, He asked him, ⁴¹“What do you want Me to do for you?” He said, “Lord, grant that I may receive my sight.” ⁴²Jesus said to him, “Receive your sight. Your faith has saved you.” ⁴³Immediately he received his sight and followed Him, glorifying God. When all the people saw it, they gave praise to God.

Jesus Heals From a Distance

⁴⁵Then, when He came to Galilee, the Galileans welcomed Him, having seen all the things He did at Jerusalem at the feast. For they had also gone to the feast. ⁴⁶So Jesus came again to Cana of Galilee where He had made the water wine. And there was a certain nobleman whose son was sick in Capernaum. ⁴⁷When he heard that Jesus had come out of Judea into Galilee, he went to Him, pleading that He would come down and heal his son, for he was at the point of death. ⁴⁸Then Jesus said to him, “Unless you see signs and wonders, you will

not believe.”⁴⁹ The nobleman said to Him, “Sir, come down before my child dies.”⁵⁰ Jesus said to him, “Go your way. Your son lives.” And the man believed the word that Jesus spoke to him, and he went his way.⁵¹ While he was going down, his servants met him and told him, “Your son lives!”⁵² When he inquired of them the hour when he began to heal, they answered, “Yesterday at the seventh hour the fever left him.”⁵³ Then the father knew that it was at the same hour in which Jesus said to him, “Your son lives.” So, he and his whole household believed.

John 5:1-14

The Healing at the Pool

After this there was a feast of the Jews, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem.² Now in Jerusalem by the Sheep Gate there is a pool, which in Hebrew is called Bethesda, having five porches.³ In these lay a great crowd of invalids, blind, lame, and paralyzed, waiting for the moving of the water.⁴ For an angel went down at a certain time into the pool and stirred up the water. After the stirring of the water, whoever stepped in first was healed of whatever disease he had.⁵ A certain man was there who had an illness for thirty-eight years.⁶ When Jesus saw him lying there and knew that he had been in that condition now a long time, He said to him, “Do you want to be healed?”⁷ The sick man answered Him, “Sir, I have no one to put me into the pool when the

water is stirred. But while I am coming, another steps down before me.”⁸ Jesus said to him, “Rise, take up your bed and walk.”⁹ Immediately the man was healed, took up his bed, and walked. That day was the Sabbath.¹⁰ The Jews therefore said to him who was cured, “It is the Sabbath day. It is not lawful for you to carry your bed.”¹¹ He answered them, “He who healed me said to me, ‘Take up your bed and walk.’”¹² So they asked him, “Who is the Man who said to you, ‘Take up your bed and walk’?”¹³ Now the man who was healed did not know who it was, for Jesus had withdrawn, as there was a crowd in that place.¹⁴ Afterward Jesus found him in the temple, and said to him, “See, you have become whole. Sin no more lest something worse happens to you.”

John 8:31,32 **The Truth Sets Free**

³¹ Then Jesus said to those Jews who believed Him, “If you remain in My word, then you are truly My disciples. ³² You shall know the truth, and the truth shall set you free.”

John 9:1-7 **Jesus Healed a Blind Man**

As Jesus passed by, He saw a man blind from birth. ² His disciples asked Him, “Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born

blind?" ³ Jesus answered, "Neither this man nor his parents sinned. But it happened so that the works of God might be displayed in him. ⁴ I must do the works of Him who sent Me while it is day. Night is coming when no one can work. ⁵ While I am in the world, I am the light of the world." ⁶ When He had said this, He spat on the ground and made clay with the saliva. He anointed the eyes of the blind man with the clay, ⁷ and said to him, "Go, wash in the pool of Siloam" (which means "Sent"). So, he went away and washed, and returned seeing.

Jesus Raises Lazarus

Now a man was sick, Lazarus from Bethany, the village of Mary and her sister Martha. ² This was Mary who anointed the Lord with ointment and wiped His feet with her hair, whose brother Lazarus was sick. ³ So the sisters sent word to Him, saying, "Lord, he whom You love is sick." ⁴ When Jesus heard this, He said, "This sickness is not unto death, but for the glory of God, that the Son of God may be glorified by it." ⁵ Now Jesus loved Martha,

and her sister, and Lazarus. ⁶ So when He heard that he was sick, He remained where He was two more days. ⁷ Then after this He said to the disciples, "Let us go into Judea again." ⁸ His disciples said to Him, "Rabbi, the Jews were just trying to stone You. Are You going there again?" ⁹ Jesus answered, "Are there not twelve hours in the day? If anyone walks during the day, he does not stumble, because he sees the light of this world. ¹⁰ But if anyone walks during the night, he stumbles, because the light is not in him." ¹¹ After He said this, He said to them, "Our friend Lazarus has fallen asleep. But I am going that I may awaken him from sleep." ¹² Then His disciples said, "Lord, if he is sleeping, he will be well." ¹³ Jesus had spoken of his death. But they thought that He was speaking of getting rest through sleep. ¹⁴ So then Jesus plainly told them, "Lazarus is dead. ¹⁵ And I am glad for your sakes that I was not there, so that you may believe. Nevertheless, let us go to him." ¹⁶ Then Thomas, who is called Didymus, said to his fellow disciples, "Let us go also, that we may die with Him." ¹⁷ When Jesus arrived, He found that he had been in the tomb four days already. ¹⁸ Now Bethany was near Jerusalem, less than two miles away.^[a] ¹⁹ Many of the Jews had come to Martha and Mary, to comfort them concerning their brother. ²⁰ When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went and met Him, but Mary remained in the house. ²¹ Martha said to Jesus, "Lord, if You had been here, my brother would not have died. ²² But even now I

know that whatever You may ask of God, God will give You.”²³ Jesus said to her, “Your brother will rise again.”²⁴ Martha said to Him, “I know that he will rise again in the resurrection on the last day.”²⁵ Jesus said to her, “I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, yet shall he live.²⁶ And whoever lives and believes in Me shall never die. Do you believe this?”²⁷ She said to Him, “Yes, Lord, I believe that You are the Christ, the Son of God, who is to come into the world.”²⁸ When she had said this, she went her way and secretly called her sister Mary, saying, “The Teacher has come and is calling for you.”²⁹ When she heard this, she rose quickly and went to Him.³⁰ Now Jesus had not yet entered the village but was in the place where Martha met Him.³¹ When the Jews who were with Mary in the house, comforting her, saw that she quickly rose up and went out, they followed her, saying, “She is going to the tomb to weep there.”³² When Mary came to where Jesus was, and saw Him, she fell down at His feet, saying to Him, “Lord, if You had been here, my brother would not have died.”³³ When Jesus saw her weeping, and the Jews who came with her weeping, He groaned in the spirit and was troubled.³⁴ He said, “Where have you laid him?” They said to Him, “Lord, come and see.”³⁵ Jesus wept.³⁶ Then the Jews said, “See how He loved him.”³⁷ But some of them said, “Could not this Man, who opened the eyes of the blind man, have also kept this man from dying?”³⁸ Then Jesus, again groaning within Himself, came to the

tomb. It was a cave, and a stone was lying against it. ³⁹ Jesus said, "Take away the stone." Martha, the sister of him who was dead, said to Him, "Lord, by this time there is a stench, for he has been dead four days." ⁴⁰ Jesus said to her, "Did I not tell you that if you believed, you would see the glory of God?" ⁴¹ So they took away the stone from the place where the dead man was lying. Jesus lifted up His eyes and said, "Father, I thank You that You have heard Me. ⁴² I know that You always hear Me. But because of the people standing around, I said this, that they may believe that You sent Me." ⁴³ When He had said this, He cried out with a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" ⁴⁴ He who was dead came out, his hands and feet wrapped with grave clothes, and his face wrapped with a cloth. Jesus said to them, "Unbind him, and let him go." ⁴⁵ Therefore many of the Jews who came to Mary, and saw what Jesus had done, believed in Him.

Jesus Shows Us What the Father Is Like

⁹ Jesus said to him, "Have I been with you such a long time, and yet you have not known Me, Philip? He who has seen Me has seen the Father. So how can you say, 'Show us the Father'? ¹² Truly, truly I say to you, he who believes in Me will do the works that I do also. And he will do greater works than these because I am going to My Father. ¹³ I will do whatever you ask in My name, that the Father may

be glorified in the Son. ¹⁴ If you ask anything in My name, I will do it. ²⁷ Peace I leave with you. My peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.

The Lame Man Healed at the Temple Gate

Now Peter and John went up together to the temple at the ninth hour, the hour of prayer. ² A man lame from birth was being carried, whom people placed daily at the gate of the temple called Beautiful to ask alms from those who entered the temple. ³ Seeing Peter and John about to go into the temple, he asked for alms. ⁴ Peter, gazing at him with John, said, "Look at us." ⁵ So he paid attention to them, expecting to receive something from them. ⁶ Then Peter said, "I have no silver and gold, but I give you what I have. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, rise up and walk." ⁷ He took him by the right hand and raised him up. Immediately his feet and ankles were strengthened. ⁸ Jumping up, he stood and walked and entered the temple with them, walking and jumping and praising God. ⁹ All the people saw him walking and praising God. ¹⁰ They knew that it was he who sat for alms at the Beautiful Gate of the temple. And they were

filled with wonder and amazement at what happened to him.

Peter's Speech at Solomon's Porch

¹¹ As the lame man who was healed held on to Peter and John, all the people ran together to them in the entrance that is called Solomon's Porch, greatly amazed. ¹² When Peter saw it, he answered the people: "Men of Israel, why do you marvel at this man? Or why do you stare at us, as if by our own power or piety we had made him walk? ¹³ The God of Abraham and Isaac and Jacob, the God of our fathers, has glorified His Son Jesus, whom you handed over and denied in the presence of Pilate, when he had decided to release Him. ¹⁴ You denied the Holy and Righteous One and asked for a murderer to be granted to you, ¹⁵ and you killed the Creator of Life, whom God has raised from the dead, of which we are witnesses. ¹⁶ And His name, by faith in His name, has made this man strong, whom you see and know. And faith which comes through Him has given him perfect health in your presence.

Acts 4:1-18,23,24,29,30

Peter and John Before the Sanhedrin

As they spoke to the people, the priests, the captain of the temple, and the Sadducees came upon them, ² being greatly troubled because they taught

the people and preached through Jesus the resurrection from the dead. ³ And they seized them and put them in custody until the next day, for it was already evening. ⁴ But many of those who heard the word believed, and the number of the men grew to about five thousand.⁵ On the next day their rulers and elders and scribes ⁶ were assembled at Jerusalem with Annas the high priest, and Caiaphas, and John and Alexander, and all who were of the family of the high priest. ⁷ When they had stood them in the midst, they asked, "By what power or by what name have you done this?" ⁸ Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, "Rulers of the people and elders of Israel: ⁹ If we today are being examined concerning a good deed done to a crippled man, how this man has been healed, ¹⁰ be it known to you all, and to all the people of Israel, that by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead, by Him this man stands before you whole. ¹¹ He is 'the stone you builders rejected, which has become the cornerstone.'¹² There is no salvation in any other, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved." ¹³ When they saw the boldness of Peter and John and perceived that they were illiterate and uneducated men, they marveled. And they recognized that they had been with Jesus. ¹⁴ But seeing the man who was healed standing with them, they had nothing to say against it. ¹⁵ So when they had commanded them to go outside of the

Sanhedrin, they conferred among themselves, ¹⁶ saying, “What shall we do to these men? For, indeed, that an acknowledged miracle has been done through them is revealed to all who dwell in Jerusalem, and we cannot deny it. ¹⁷ But lest it spread further among the people, let us threaten them that they no longer speak to anyone in this name.” ¹⁸ Then they called them and commanded them not to speak or teach at all in the name of Jesus. ²³ On being released, they went to their own people and reported what the chief priests and elders had said to them. ²⁴ When they heard this, they lifted their voices in unity to God and prayed, “Lord, You are God, who has made the heaven and the earth and the sea and everything in them, ²⁹ Now, Lord, look on their threats and grant that Your servants may speak Your word with great boldness, ³⁰ by stretching out Your hand to heal and that signs and wonders may be performed in the name of Your holy Son Jesus.”

Jesus' Followers Did Many Signs and Wonders

¹² Many signs and wonders were performed among the people by the hands of the apostles. And they were all together in Solomon's Porch. ¹⁶ Crowds also came out of the cities surrounding Jerusalem, bringing the sick and those who were afflicted by evil spirits, and they were all healed.

Stephen Did Great Wonders and Miracles

⁸ Now Stephen, full of faith and power, did great wonders and miracles among the people.

Philip Healed Many

⁵ Philip went down to the city of Samaria and preached Christ to them. ⁶ When the crowds heard Philip and saw the miracles which he did, they listened in unity to what he said. ⁷ For unclean spirits, crying with a loud voice, came out of many who were possessed. And many who were paralyzed, or lame were healed. ⁸ So there was much joy in that city.

Peter Heals Aeneas in Jesus' Name

³² As Peter passed through every region, he came down also to the saints who lived in Lydda. ³³ There he found a man named Aeneas, who had been bedridden for eight years and was paralyzed. ³⁴ Peter said to him, "Aeneas, Jesus the Christ heals you. Rise up and make your bed." And immediately he rose up. ³⁵ All those who lived in Lydda and Sharon saw him and turned to the Lord.

Went About Doing Good and Healing ALL

³⁸ how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power, who went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with Him.

Lame Man Healed

⁷ And there they preached the gospel.

⁸ In Lystra there sat a man, crippled in his feet, who had never walked and was lame from birth. ⁹ He heard Paul speaking, who looked intently at him and perceived that he had faith to be healed ¹⁰ and said with a loud voice, "Stand upright on your feet." And he jumped up and walked.

¹¹ God worked powerful miracles by the hands of Paul. ¹² So handkerchiefs or aprons he had touched were brought to the sick, and the diseases left them, and the evil spirits went out of them.

¹⁷ (as it is written, "I have made you a father of

many nations”) before God whom he believed, and who raises the dead, and calls those things that do not exist as though they did.¹⁹ And not being weak in faith, he did not consider his own body to be dead (when he was about a hundred years old), nor yet the deadness of Sarah’s womb. ²⁰ He did not waver at the promise of God through unbelief, but was strong in faith, giving glory to God, ²¹ and being fully persuaded that what God had promised, He was able to perform.
