For many years Zion has helped to support the ministry of the Victor Valley Rescue Mission. We have collected food items and hygiene products that have been shared with those in need here in the High Desert.

After almost 30 years of serving here in the High Desert the Rescue Mission will be closing its doors. Zion wants to continue helping those in need. After some research we have found a local program that serves youth ages 12-24 called FAM Sport. This program is sponsored by the Family Assistance Program.

"The FAM Spot is open to youth ages 12-24, who are invited to hang out in a safe space with WI-FI and snacks. Tutoring and peer groups are available to give them the tools needed for success. Youth go on field trips, volunteer in the community, attend events, and carry out street outreach projects."

We will be collecting food and hygiene items for the FAM Spot. They are in need of canned or boxed food that is easy for the kids to prepare, such as: Spaghetti O's, Ravioli, Mac n' Cheese, Ramen etc. Please place your donations in one of the collection baskets in the narthex.

God is Greater than the Highs and Lows



Now faith is being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see. This is what the ancients were commended for. – Hebrews 11:1-2

The above passage is from the Epistle reading for the second Sunday in August. In this passage the writer addresses a question and concern that haunts every generation. Why don't things go the way they should? In theological textbooks it's called 'the question of evil' and Scripture is replete with various forms of this question. Isaiah echoes it saying: 'Oh, that you would rend the heavens and come down, that the mountains would tremble before you!' (Isaiah 64:1) Elijah challenges God saying: "I have been very zealous for [you] O LORD but your people have rejected your covenant ... [and] they have put your prophets to death. I am the only one left, and now they are trying to kill me too." (1 Kings 19:10) And, on the day of Jesus' Ascension, his disciples ask: "Lord, are you [finally] going to restore the kingdom to Israel?" (Acts 1:6)

Indeed, God's ways are not our ways, (Isaiah 55:8) but the promise of God is that HE IS WORKING ALL THINGS TOGETHER FOR OUR GOOD! (Romans 8:28) As Paul reminds us, 'we are 'more than conquers' and 'nothing will be able to separate us from the Love of God that is in Christ Jesus!' (Romans 8:36-39)

This place of tension is our life and this is our journey, and it is a journey that can only be transversed in faith. This is also the basic theme of the entire 'Letter to the Hebrews'. Throughout the Epistle we are invited and called to place our trust and faith in God and his promises. In chapter ten we read: 'Since we have confidence to enter the Most Holy Place by the blood of Jesus ... and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us draw near to God with a sincere heart and with the full assurance that faith brings ... and let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, <u>for he who promised is faithful</u>. And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds.' (Hebrews 10:19-24)

In chapter eleven we hear of the journey of the heroes of the faith, those who trusted God's promises even in difficult circumstances. (Hebrews 11:3-16) This is the context of the passage we started with: 'Now faith is being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see.' (Hebrews 11:1) These words are words of encouragement and invitations to trust God in all circumstances.

One last passage from Hebrews. 'Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. Who, for the joy set before him, endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.' (Hebrews 12:1-2; Cf. Romans 8:34)

# Pacific Southwest District Convention Report

The 47<sup>th</sup> Convention of the Pacific Southwest District of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod was held June 25-27 at the La Quinta Resort in La Quinta, California. *Redeemed to Tell* (based on Psalm 107:2) was the theme, reminding us that as a church, as a congregation, and as individual disciples, our purpose is to tell our stories: *Let the redeemed of the LORD tell their story—those he redeemed from the hand of the foe...* 

Recaps of each day's business, including the resolution results, can be found at <u>https://www.psd-lcms.org/psd-convention</u>. Rev. Dr. Mike Gibson was re-elected elected for a third term as District President.

Many of the discussions addressed the challenges and opportunities facing churches today: many of the challenges center around declining attendance. These challenges can provide opportunities for partnering, collaborating and working together to shine the light of God's love in the world around us.

President Gibson said that congregations worshipping 75-100 can generally afford to pay a pastor. As smaller congregations tend to pay their pastors the same with few to no raises, when they lose their pastors they are stunned that they cannot pay the salaries needed to replace them, because of inflation and the higher salaries required.


These attendance challenges are not merely about the survivability of declining churches. **This is ultimately about the reduced capacity for the saving of souls, and that is our purpose.** So the question becomes, what is our response? Doing nothing is <u>not</u> an option.

We heard many stories of churches within out district who have partnered, collaborated, merged, and found other ways to work together to overcome the challenges and thrive, many times because of individuals in congregations taking the initiative to make things happen (an example is a youth leader with a very small youth group reaching out to other area churches to partner for various youth activities, making a huge difference for their youth). Partner, collaborate, and work together were words that were repeated over and over during the three day convention.

Flat Jesus in La Quinta at PSD Convention








